Long-term Outcome: To reduce the normalisation of alcohol and other drug use in Northam

Final Northam Shire Alcohol and Other Drug Management Plan – Endorsed 19 February, 2016 by the NSAODMP Group

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PURPOSE

The Northam Shire Alcohol and Other Drug Management Plan seeks to reduce the level of harmful alcohol and other drug use within the community by:

- Actively supporting partnerships between community and service providers to identify and address local issues.
- Provide a means to coordinate, implement and evaluate an evidence-based, whole of community approach in a timely and appropriate manner.

BACKGROUND

The AODMP was developed using best practice principles (see appendix 1).

The analysis of several consultation documents and reports dating from 2011-2017 and two regional AOD planning workshops involving the Mental Health Commission and key Northam Shire AOD stakeholders (July and August 2015) have provided the context for the AODMP. These documents reflect the collective knowledge and experience of the Northam Shire AOD planning workshops and should be consulted if further development of the AODMP is required. 

PRIORITY 1 Lack of awareness of alcohol use as a whole of community problem

The normalised culture of alcohol consumption in Northam Shire is impacting the general health and wellbeing of the community. This is a whole of community issue and the lack of acceptance and acknowledgment of this continues to contribute to alcohol related harms in the area.

In particular, alcohol consumption is generally accepted and often expected at most occasions and events in the Northam community – sporting clubs, celebrations, parties, camping, summer, Public holidays etc.

Other contributing factors include:

- Boredom and lack of employment opportunities
- Young people's perceptions of drinking 'rite of passage', alleviate boredom, a 'right to drink' and pressure on parents to agree with these perceptions.
- Availability of alcohol the number of liquor outlets in the area and incentives from establishments promoting alcohol consumption.
- The drinking culture of sporting clubs and role modelling through sports.

PRIORITY 2 LACK OF AWARENESS OF OTHER DRUG USE AS A WHOLE OF COMMUNITY PROBLEM

Current perceptions in the Northam Shire indicate an increase in the use of illicit drugs which is resulting in increased drug related harms to the community this includes crime, aggression (towards careers), suicide and self-harm and predatory behaviour of users (in higher age groups).

*Due to the lack of local data it is difficult to determine the actual extent of illicit drug use in Northam. In line with best practice principles to help inform the implementation of broad-based prevention strategies in the community further research needs to be conducted at the local level to determine current illicit drug use in the community.

Priority Area 2.1 Incorrect Disposal of Needles and Syringes

The inappropriate disposal of needles has been a developing problem within the Shire of Northam throughout the duration of the NSAODMP 2015-2017, therefore was officially made a part of the AODMP in May 2017. Key contributing factors leading to the incorrect disposal of needles and syringes were identified as lack of community education re: BBV and disposal unit locations, and the stigma associated with accessing NSP distribution sites within community.

- Lack of good practices, protocol and communication processes between agencies
- Protocols of visiting regional towns/communities and the lack of promotion of visits
- Limitations to service for remote areas housing issues, cost, distance


APPENDIX 1

PLANNING FOR AN EFFECTIVE PLAN

Creating a sustainable reduction in alcohol and other drug related harm is a complex and long-term process. Issues can be overwhelming and seen as too difficult to address at a local level. However, with some effective planning, it's at the local level where partnerships between communities and services can have the greatest impact.

Prior to establishing and implementing an alcohol and other drug management plan (AODMP), a number of steps need to happen to ensure the resulting plan has been developed in partnership to reflect the communities needs and has the best chance at creating sustainable change.

It is important that the community have a strong understanding of the issues and have ownership of the strategies developed to address them. To ensure this, processes should be put in place that allow community input into all stages of the development and implementation of the AODMP, including progress made against addressing the issues.



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
