IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR CAT OWNERS

1 Definition of a PENSIONER for concessional licensing is as follows:

A person issued with a Pensioner Concession Card.

- i.e: (1) Aged Pension
 - (2) Disabled Pension
 - (3) Commonwealth Health Care Card
 - (4) Supporting Parents Pension
 - (5) Carer's Pension
- 2 Maximum number of CATS to be kept on any premises is two (2) over the age of six (6) months (dispensation may be given to keep more than two (2) Cats pursuant to Local Law 2008 Part 3 section 3.2.
- 3 To register a cat you must have a veterinarian's certificate showing that the cat has been sterilised and micro chipped or be prepared to sign a statutory declaration to the effect.
- 4 Refunds for Pensioners Where a person has paid a three year registration licence and subsequently becomes a pensioner, the person may claim a 50% refund for each whole year of the unexpired period of the licence.
- 5 Cat owners are also reminded that cats six months and over must be registered at all times. Council also requires that cat owners inform Council immediately of any change in ownership, the death of a cat, or change in address.
- 6 It is important to note that there will be NO REFUNDS for the cancellation of a cat registration (deceased cat) as per the Cat Act 2011.
- 7 Failure to register a cat will result in a penalty under the Cat Act 2011.
