Town Hall Works Update

The scaffold has come down from the Gordon Street side of the Town Hall. The Hall recently underwent works by a specialist heritage contractor.

The crumbling cement mouldings have been secured back to the building; all cracks have been filled and the missing render and final skim coat has been replaced; clear water proofing membrane has been applied to the newly repaired areas to protect for the many years to come; and the degraded mortar in between brickwork has been re-pointed.

The same works are to be done to the Lesser Hall side of the building.

Harvest / Vehicle Movement / Hot Works Ban

Please be advised that the Shire of Northam has imposed a Harvest, Vehicle Movement and Hot Works Bans for Australia Day, Friday 26th of January 2018.

Harvest, Vehicle Movement and Hot Works Bans means;

- The use of vehicles in paddocks is not permitted unless using a diesel vehicle for the purpose of watering and tending of livestock
- The use or operation of any engine, vehicle, plant, equipment or machinery is not permitted in the area likely to cause a bush fire or contribute to the spread of a bush fire.
- Any "hot works" (e.g. welding, grinding, cutting, heating etc.) in the "open air" is not permitted.

The above bans are imposed in an attempt to mitigate the risk of fire during these public holiday periods.

Home Burglary Awareness

Are you aware one of Australia's most common crimes in home burglary? Thieves target items like televisions and stereos, as well as credit cards, cash, outdoor furniture, tools and computer equipments because they can easily be resold or traded.

Neighbourhood Watch is simply neighbours getting to know neighbours, looking out for each other and reporting suspicious activity to Police. Drop 5 to Save Lives

Around 40 per cent of Western Australians admit to speeding; many drivers believe that driving 5 to 10 km/h over the posted speed limit is acceptable, but there is clear evidence that lower speeds would mean fewer crashes, fewer deaths and fewer serious injuries on Western Australian roads.

If WA drivers reduced their average speed by 5-10 km/h, many lives could be saved and serious injuries prevented. Around 60 people die each year on our roads due to speed-related crashes, a further 375 people suffer life changing injuries.

Keep Watch

The Royal Life Saving Society Australia's Keep Watch program aims to reduce the incidence of toddler drowning in the community.

To prevent toddler drowning, the Royal Life Saving Society of WA encourages parents and caregivers to:

Always keep watch of your child in and around water.
Supervise children within arm's reach.
Prevent your child's access to water at all times.

Teach your child to be water confident.
Learn CPR and call 000 in an emergency.
