

## The Avon River Festival

The Shire of Northam is hosting the annual Avon River Festival from 4pm on Friday, August 5, 2016. The Festival launches the start of the Avon Descent, the biggest event on the regional calendar attracting more than 800 competitors with families and support crews.

Aimed at families, the Avon River Festival has attractions and activities for all age groups. There will be live performances from Perth band Murphy's Lore, a street parade plus roving performances, a fire show, BMX displays and a demonstration from the Department of Fire and Emergency Services. Side show alley will entertain the young at heart with a host of games and rides. There will be market stalls and food vendors offering local produce, arts and crafts.

The popular firework finale on the River closes the Festival and sets the scene for the start of the Avon Descent the following day.

The Avonlink train is running three extra services from Midland to Northam via Toodyay return to support the Festival, offering people the opportunity to leave the car at home. ## President's Message

The Shire of Northam has met recently to discuss the 2016/17 Annual Budget.

The budget process has been ongoing for many months with the recent meeting a culmination of many hours of work by Elected Members and Staff.

A draft budget will now be advertised for public comment, along with our proposed rate changes. At the conclusion of the advertising period, Council will assess submissions and make a final determination on the budget, in early August.

There are a range of highlights in the budget including:

- \$470,000 on rural drainage
- Additional staff to focus on rural verges
- \$235,000 grant funded CCTV expansion
- \$4.3m to construct the Aboriginal & Environmental Interpretive Centre
- \$127,000 for maintenance to the Northam Town Hall heritage building
- \$100,000 to improve our parks and playgrounds
- \$1,500,000 to commence work on the new 50m Heated outdoor swimming pool at the Northam Recreation Centre
- \$880,000 to commence work on a youth space (including consultation with the community)
- \$305,000 on local footpaths
- \$3.7m road program
- \$201,000 to improve recycled water system
- 2.86% increase in general rates

There has been discussion over the past six years in relation to changing a significant number of properties across the Shire from unimproved valuations to gross rental valuations to ensure our rating system is equitable. This is being implemented this year which will result in some ratepayers in the rural areas having a more substantial increase in their rates.

In order to minimise this impact Council has chosen to phase the increases in over three years. The additional revenue generated this year will be utilised to create a new rural verges team which will commence in October/November 2016.

I would also like to thank the Wundowie Community for their enthusiastic participation in the Shire's launch for the commencement of the Wundowie Community Plan 2016-2026. Local businesses, community groups and individuals got involved to make the launch itself a success.

Attendance from local residents was very positive with more than 300 BBQ breakfast sandwiches served and 250 leaves placed on the wishing tree over the two hour period. The event generated a strong sense of community and it was great to see a number of new residents from Mauravillo Estate come down and get involved.

## Delilah Brough - Library Experience

Northam Library take pleasure in welcoming Delilah Brough from Swan Christian College as the latest work experience candidate via the Worklink (Authority Developed Endorsed Program).

Delilah is scheduled to undertake 55 hours of monitored and assessed work experience throughout the next couple of months.

Delilah will assist with a number of library related tasks including shelf checking, stock allocation, memberships, loan and returns, plus a variety of other procedures and programs.

## SilverSport

SilverSport supports eligible seniors to participate in sport and active recreation based on the highly successful KidSport program.

SilverSport can cover costs associated with sport club memberships or physical activity program fees of up to \$200 per person until 30 June 2017, subject to available funding.

Applicants can receive SilverSport for a range of activities delivered by clubs, groups, businesses and recreation centre's including; rehabilitation fitness, bowls, group fitness classes, walking groups, gym memberships, yoga or Pilates.

To be eligible, applicants must be 60 years or over and have a valid health care card or pensioner concession card. A Seniors Card is not suitable.

Administered by the Department of Sport and Recreation, the program started on the 1st of July 2016 and runs to 30 June 2017.
