Operational Aspects

CEO appointment

Councillors have interviewed 5 applicants from a field of 23 applications for the CEO position and a recommendation is expected to be made to Council for this month's meeting. The successful applicant is expected to commence employment with the Shire by late August, 2013.

Budget 2013/14

The budget is part of the integrated planning and reporting framework so I understand preparation of the budget is well advanced.

Integrated planning and reporting framework

As the framework commences on 1st July and needs to be adopted by Council prior to that date, I am anticipating a preliminary advanced draft to be available to Council early next month.

WA vs. Victoria State AFL game

By the date of our ordinary May meeting this event will have been held so I hope the day will have gone well for the Shire and all involved.

STRATEGIC ASPECTS

Avon Sub Group of the Wheatbelt North Regional Road Group

Our sub group met last month in Goomalling to ensure planned works for 2012/13 are well advanced and will be complete by 30th June. We also had a review of the 2013/14 projects to ensure the priorities as determined by the MCA scoring system and costings are current.

Avon Midlands Zone of WALGA

The latest meeting of the Zone was held in Northam recently and I thank Cr. Kathy Saunders and acting CEO Allan Middleton for making themselves available to represent the Shire.

Constitutional Recognition of Local Government

The sector has been looking for the opportunity to seek the inclusion of Local Government in the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution for some years now. It had been suggested that a Referendum on inclusion be called to coincide with the Federal election on 14th September and it has now been verified by the Prime Minister that she will allow a Referendum on that date. There have been 2 recent High Court cases which have cast significant doubt on the legality of payments made direct to Local Government by the Federal Government including Roads to Recovery funds and other Federal Assistance Grants (FAGS) etc. so this change is increasingly necessary. The recommended new wording is in Chapter IV Finance and Trade to clause 96 as bolded below and would read: "..the Parliament may grant financial assistance to any State or to any local government body formed by State or Territory legislation on such terms and conditions as the Parliament sees fit." The Australian Local Government Association (ALGA) has worked with the State associations and Councils over the years

to come up with wording that is least obtrusive yet effective in cementing the Local Government sector in the Commonwealth act. The relatively simple change to this one clause should help ensure that the public can be comfortable in voting Yes for this change.

Regional Centres Development Plan (Supertowns)

Feed back is being sought by the team at the super town office as we have a number of projects that need to be undertaken over the coming year or two and the respective priority of those projects needs to be clear to all if the growth plan is to continue to be relevant.

The super town signage has been erected at the Mitchell Avenue entrance off the Gt. Eastern Highway by pass.

The Avon River town pool is causing some dilemmas for the team as we need a clear resolution to the ongoing health of the pool before commitment of funds to the likes of more floating islands, aerators, dredging, sluice gates and the like is made.

The result of the State Governments review of office accommodation within the Northam town site should be available soon and this will help inform the decision about what sort of central accommodation is needed into the future.

Royalties for Regions Fund

Following the recent State Government elections the future priorities for this fund are undergoing a review at State level. The Premier has indicated that the priorities will be much more regionally focussed and state significant. Merely badging a local project as regional is unlikely to pass the criteria for support.

Wheatbelt Development Commission

The Commission is undertaking the preparation of "Investment Blueprints" which are intended to become the basis for prioritising State Government investment across the Wheatbelt region. We are part of the Avon sub region so our priorities need to align with the Commissions if we are to be successful in obtaining any support funding for capital investments. The Department of Regional Development and Lands. under Minister Grylls, oversees this process.

13. REPORTS OF OFFICERS

13.1. ADMINISTRATION

13.1.1 NOTES OF INTEREST

Missing Painting

Council at the April meeting requested staff to make enquiries as to the whereabouts of the painting titled "Don Juan's Garden" by Norman Lindsay.

Discussion with Mr. Burnett, previous Town of Northam Chief Executive Officer, suggested the painting has been missing in excess of 20 years, perhaps longer. I understand he made enquiries as to its presence during his tenure to no avail. Discussions with representatives of the Avon Valley Arts Society has not thrown any light onto the subject.

In one last ditch an advertisement will be placed in the local newspaper seeking public support to locate the painting.

Football Pavilion

Council is aware that Cr Hughes has requested an agenda item be submitted to reexamine the decision to demolish the ageing football pavilion adjacent to Jubilee Oval.

The Executive Staff Management Team has discussed the proposal and believes, before any recommendation is submitted to Council, further investigation is warranted.

Further information is being sought on maintenance and running costs, likely use and what contributions supporting groups are prepared to pay towards the upkeep and operations of the building.

Staff will be undertaking an inspection of the building on Thursday, 9 May at 3.30pm. Councillors are invited to attend if they so wish.

It may be necessary for staff to discuss the ongoing use of the building with users to determine what financial and in-kind contribution they would make if the building was retained in the current configuration.

Works Programme

Please note the programme of works for the coming two months will be:

King Creek Drainage

Installation of 4 side entry pits on Duke street and laying of approximately 90 metres of 375mm piping to the main drainage system. The pick up of storm water from residences adjacent to the creek system and piping that water into the entry pits.

2. Fernie Road

Widening formation to approximately 12 metres. Form pavement to 8 metres and resheet. The amount of gravel will depend on money available.

3. General Maintenance

There will be a concentrated effort to reduce the large number of complaints and works requests that have accumulated over the past 12 months.

An emphasis will be placed on winter grading in an effort to bring roads up to an acceptable standard. This will take considerable time.

Integrated Planning

We are currently working on Asset Management through the Asset Management Module in Synergy, Staff have completed the following tasks associated with this process;

- 1) Identify properties and buildings that the Shire is responsible for.
- 2) Complete an inspection of the buildings to assess the size, components and condition.
- 3) Convert the assessments into data for the Asset Management Module.
- 4) Staff have setup the replacement values on components and the applicable maintenance schedules.

The staff are currently completing data verification on the Asset Management system. This information will then be given to Mr. Ron Back for integration into the Long-Term Financial Plan, Corporate Business Plan and the Asset Management Plan. These plans are required to be completed by the end of May 2013 so that they can be adopted by council before the 30th of June 2013. We are working closely with Ron Back get the reports completed effectively & efficiently.

PURPOSE

A component of the Avon Health Precinct development as funded under the SuperTowns program is the construction of a new road linking Fernie Road through to Mitchell Avenue. A portion of this road is to be constructed through land currently utilised as a vacant Railway Laydown Maintenance Area (utilised infrequently) and vacant freehold land owned by Main Roads WA. This report proposes that Council take the necessary action to have this portion of the road dedicated formally.

BACKGROUND

The construction of the new road through these crown and freehold landholdings has been approved by the Main Roads WA and the Public Transport Authority. The Department of Regional Development and Lands have recognised this, however have advised that to formalise this, a formal dedication under Section 56 of the Land Administration Act is required.

STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS

The provisions of the Land Administration Act are applicable to the required action; and specifically section 56 which states as follows

56. Dedication of roads

- (1) If in the district of a local government
 - (a) land is reserved or acquired for use by the public, or is used by the public, as a road under the care, control and management of the local government;
 - (b) in the case of land comprising a private road constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the local government —
 - (i) the holder of the freehold in that land applies to the local government, requesting it to do so; or

(ii) those holders of the freehold in rateable land abutting the private road, the aggregate of the rateable value of whose land is greater than one half of the rateable value of all the rateable land abutting the private road, apply to the local government, requesting it to do so;

or

- (c) land comprises a private road of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than 10 years.
 - and that land is described in a plan of survey, sketch plan or document, the local government may request the Minister to dedicate that land as a road.
- (2) If a local government resolves to make a request under subsection (1), it must
 - (a) in accordance with the regulations prepare and deliver the request to the Minister; and
 - (b) provide the Minister with sufficient information in a plan of survey, sketch plan or document to describe the dimensions of the proposed road.
- (3) On receiving a request delivered to him or her under subsection (2), the Minister must consider the request and may then
 - (a) subject to subsection (5), by order grant the request;
 - (b) direct the relevant local government to reconsider the request, having regard to such matters as he or she thinks fit to mention in that direction; or
 - (c) refuse the request.
- (4) On the Minister granting a request under subsection (3), the relevant local government is liable to indemnify the Minister against any claim for compensation (not being a claim for compensation in respect of land referred to in subsection (6)) in an amount equal to the amount of all costs and expenses reasonably incurred by the Minister in considering and granting the request.
- (5) To be dedicated under subsection (3)(a), land must immediately before the time of dedication be
 - (a) unallocated Crown land or, in the case of a private road, alienated land; and
 - (b) designated in the relevant plan of survey, sketch plan or document as having the purpose of a road.
- (6) If land referred to in subsection (1)(b) or (c) is dedicated under subsection (3)(a), a person with an interest in that land (including a person who has the benefit of an easement created under section 167A of the TLA) is not entitled to compensation because of that dedication.

CONFORMITY WITH THE PLAN FOR THE FUTURE

KEY RESULT AREA: Providing Physical Infrastructure & Caring for Natural

Environment

GOAL: To anticipate the land use needs within the Shire and implement planning decisions that ensures availability of appropriately zoned land that compliments orderly and environmentally sustainable growth and development.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

The existing land referred to in the resolution is currently not under the care and control of the Shire of Northam, and subsequently there will be additional cost implications for Council in the future for maintenance of the asset.

The cost of constructing the road and associated infrastructure is funded through the SuperTowns project.

OFFICER'S COMMENT

The dedication of these portions of the railway land and Main Roads WA freehold land is supported and is to assist in formalising arrangements previously agreed to by all parties.

13.2.1 PROPOSED TRACTOR SHELTER AT RAILWAY CARRIAGE RESERVE CORNER OF KIMBERLEY ROAD AND LOCKYER AVENUE, CLACKLINE

PURPOSE

For Council to consider the placement of a tractor and construction of its shelter at Railway Carriage Reserve on the corner of Kimberley Road and Lockyer Avenue, Clackline.

BACKGROUND

The Clackline Progress Association is planning to place a "Little Grey Fergie" tractor outside the Railway Carriage at Clackline. This will be the first of the agricultural implements planned to be placed around the old railway carriage to establish and develop an "agricultural and railway history precinct" opposite the local store, as previously arranged with the former Shire of Northam.

As the land surrounds on which the carriage stands, is a Shire reserve, the Association seeks formal permission to place the tractor and erect over it a simple sloping roof on four corner posts.

The tractor will stand on a concrete slab, and will be secured to the slab. The wheel nuts will be welded to prevent the tractor from being moved. All other dangerous moving parts will also be welded to ensure the safety of those interested in looking at the tractor.

A professional sign will be securely mounted close by giving the details of the Little Tractor, and also signage outlining the history of Clackline as a railway junction. These signs will match the other signs located on the Walk Trails.

STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS

The Reserve 19542 is approximately 20.7 hectares and zoned as Parks and Recreation under the provisions of Town Planning Scheme No. 3 (TPS 3).

This application requires Council's determination due to the land being vested with the Shire of Northam. It is considered the proposed use fits into the ultimate purpose of the reserve- parks and recreation.

"community purpose" means the use of premises designed or adapted primarily for the provision of educational, social or recreational facilities or services by organisations involved in activities for community benefit;

CONFORMITY WITH THE PLAN FOR THE FUTURE

GOAL: To maintain a balance between maintenance of our lifestyle and sense of community with population growth and accompanying development.

OUTCOME: Foster community pride and a sense of place

STRATEGIES: Encourage a collaborative approach with residents and special interest groups to identify projects, challenges and solutions.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

The applicant has paid \$139.00 being the planning application fee. However, the Progress Association requests that this fee be donated back to it for use on the Railway Carriage site.

OFFICER'S COMMENT

The Ferguson Model TE20 was an agricultural tractor designed by Harry Ferguson and was by far his most successful design, commonly known as the *Little Grey Fergie*. It was manufactured from 1946 to 1956. It was a light weight but effective design and is a popular collector's item for enthusiasts today.

The display of this magnificent agricultural machine will enrich the knowledge and appreciation of local agricultural history.

This tractor will be the first of many agricultural implements the Progress Association plans to place around the carriage in order to establish and develop an "agriculture and railway history precinct". The establishment of the precinct will also provide a "theme" for the park reserve which in the long run will promote a sense of identity for the community. This is in line with the goal of the plan for the future.

There is a stop sign for traffic along Lockyer Road at the junction of Lockyer and Kimberley Road. In approaching this junction the traffic from Kimberley Road slows down, due to its close proximity to the Great Eastern Highway. This will provide drivers with the opportunity to observe the situation at the intersection. The proposed location of the shelter within the site will not interfere with the line of sight of drivers coming from Kimberley Road therefore the proposed location is considered to be acceptable.

The community involvement in the development of the Shire is very important as it encourages a sense of belonging, therefore community participation in the development of the park should be supported.

PURPOSE

For Council to consider the acquisition and sale of land for the purpose of the realignment of Haddrill Road.

BACKGROUND

Background of Key Dates and Determinations

Part of the existing Haddrill Road, Irishown has been constructed outside of the Road Reserve, toward the junction of Haddrill Road and Irishtown Road as shown on the attached map. The original Road Reserve was gently zigzagging to the left and right, but the constructed road is quite straight. Consequently there are areas of the Road Reserve that are unused and areas where the constructed road passes through private property.

Council has received a request from the owner of Lot 21 Haddrill Road, which directly adjoins the Road Reserve near the junction of Haddrill Road and Irishtown Road, to consider the proposed sale of a portion of the Haddrill Road Reserve that is not being used by the constructed Road.

The applicant has an intention to amalgamate the portion of the Road Reserve into his current property so he can conform to the 25m setback required for Agriculture Regional Zone.

Prior to dedicating the new portions of land for road reserve, the Shire will need to acquire the portions of land from the adjoining private land holdings, either by negotiated purchase or compulsory acquisition (resumption).

The process for undertaking road realignment is generally as follows:

- 1. Advertise the intent in a local paper 35 days prior to a Council resolution.
- 2. Notify service authorities to ensure no services are impacted.
- 3. Consider any objections from adjoining owners or requirements from Service Authorities.
- 4. Pass Council resolution then advise the Department of Regional Development and Lands, indemnifying the State against any costs or compensation arising from the proposal.
- 5. Nominate a Surveyor to undertake survey of the road realignment or authorised RDL to nominate a surveyor.
- 6. Department of Regional Development and Lands will arrange survey and preparation of documentation to:
 - a. excise and dedicate new road alignments
 - b. close and amalgamate old road alignments.

At Council's meeting on 19 December 2012, Council discussed the issue and decided to defer the matter until staff had consulted with the owner of lot 20 Haddrill Road, Irishtown.

STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS

The Land Administration Act 1997, section 56 describes the process for **Dedication of roads**:

- (1) If in the district of a local government
 - (a) land is reserved or acquired for use by the public, or is used by the public, as a road under the care, control and management of the local government;

- (b) in the case of land comprising a private road constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the local government
 - (i) the holder of the freehold in that land applies to the local government, requesting it to do so; or
 - (ii) those holders of the freehold in rateable land abutting the private road, the aggregate of the rateable value of whose land is greater than one half of the rateable value of all the rateable land abutting the private road, apply to the local government, requesting it to do so;

or

(c) land comprises a private road of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than 10 years,

and that land is described in a plan of survey, sketch plan or document, the local government may request the Minister to dedicate that land as a road.

- (2) If a local government resolves to make a request under subsection (1), it must
 - (a) in accordance with the regulations prepare and deliver the request to the Minister; and
 - (b) provide the Minister with sufficient information in a plan of survey, sketch plan or document to describe the dimensions of the proposed road.

The Land Administration Act 1997, section 58 describes the process for **Closure of roads**:

- (1) When a local government wishes a road in its district to be closed permanently, the local government may, subject to subsection (3), request the Minister to close the road.
- (2) When a local government resolves to make a request under subsection (1), the local government must in accordance with the regulations prepare and deliver the request to the Minister.
- (3) A local government must not resolve to make a request under subsection (1) until a period of 35 days has elapsed from the publication in a newspaper circulating in its district of notice of motion for that resolution, and the local government has considered any objections made to it within that period concerning the proposals set out in that notice.

The Land Administration Act 1997, section 87 states that the Minister may convey in fee simple or lease Crown land for subsequent amalgamation with adjoining land

(1) In this section —

the adjoining land means the land referred to in subsection (2)(b) or (3)(b), as the case requires.

- (2) Whenever the Minister considers that a parcel of Crown land is
 - (a) unsuitable for retention as a separate location or lot, or for subdivision and retention as separate locations or lots, because of its geographical

location, potential use, size, shape or any other reason based on good land use planning principles; but

- (b) suitable for
 - (i) conveyance in fee simple to the holder of the fee simple; or
 - (ii) disposal by way of lease to the holder of a lease granted by the Minister under this Act.

of land adjoining that parcel,

the Minister may, with the consent of that holder and on payment to the Minister of the price, or of the initial instalment of rent, as the case requires, agreed with that holder, by order convey that parcel in fee simple or lease that parcel to that holder and amalgamate that parcel with the adjoining land.

The Land Administration Regulations 1998, Section 8 and 9 govern the requirements to dedicate and close roads permanently.

CONFORMITY WITH THE PLAN FOR THE FUTURE

GOAL: To anticipate the land use needs within the Shire and implement planning decisions that ensures availability of appropriately zoned land that complements orderly and environmentally sustainable growth and development.

OUTCOME: Maintain and improve Shire infrastructure and other assets.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

There will be costs, estimated at \$5000-\$10,000, for the following:

- Advertising in local newspaper(s).
- Cost for surveying the Haddrill Road Reserve and lot boundaries estimated about 330 metres long.
- Officers time to organise the submission for road alignment to the Minister of Regional Development and Lands.
- Transfer of Land and Settlement.

OFFICER'S COMMENT

To realign this part of Haddrill Road, a portion of land from the northern side of the road (Lot 20) needs to be acquired. The owners of the land have been approached and they have no objection to the Shire acquiring the land provided that the Shire will cover the cost to undertake the land acquisition.

In relation to the specific request from the landowner interested in purchasing a portion of Haddrill Road, the existing landholding is of a configuration and location which suggests that the only viable option is for the land to be amalgamated into the adjoining property.

It is considered that the 2300m² of unused road reserve requested for sale to the adjoining landowner would not be of significant benefit to anyone other than the owner of Lot 21.

It is recommended that Council support the proposal provided that the owners of Lot 21 Irishtown Road agree to meet all costs associated with the translation from road reserve to freehold land that will eventually be owned by the owner of Lot 21.

PURPOSE

The Shire has received a Planning Application from the Riding for the Disabled Bakers Hill Carriage Driving Centre Inc (RDBHCDC) for a Carriage Driving Facility on a portion of land that is zoned as Parks and Recreation in Shingle Hill Road, Bakers Hill.

BACKGROUND

The Council had approved in principle for the Disabled Bakers Hill Carriage Driving Centre Inc (RDBHCDC) to use a portion of the land for its purposes on 15 August 2012.

The application provides further detail of the facility and the land area required.

The Bakers Hill Carriage Driving Centre was established in 2006, and has been operating from a private property. It would like to move to the area where the Bakers Hill Equestrian Centre is located as it has a similar existing land use.

Riding for the Disabled Bakers Hill Carriage Driving Centre Inc (RDBHCDC) has advised that a move to the Equestrian Centre would facilitate the organisation to gain more exposure and provide more opportunities for the estimated 2,000 people with disabilities believed to be in the Shire of Northam.

Riding for the Disabled Bakers Hill Carriage Driving Centre Inc (RDBHCDC) has advised it is a voluntary, non-profit organisation which is dedicated to providing therapeutic and recreational benefits through equestrian activities to people with disabilities.

Riding for the Disabled Bakers Hill Carriage Driving Centre Inc (RDBHCDC) has indicated that carriage driving gives those who are unable to mount a horse the opportunity to experience the fun and enjoyment of equestrian activities. This

opportunity will give participants a feeling of independence which can increase their levels of self-esteem and confidence.

The land area required for the proposed activity is approximately 11,782 m². Which is larger then previously proposed area of 6,521 m². The equipment and facilities needed for this facility are as follows:

Sea container 12m x 3m Transportable building with toilets 12m x 3m

Paved Patio Area 17m x 9m with sea container and transportable

being used in an L shape.

Sand Arena 100m x 40m
Games Arena 50m x 30m
Parking Area for 15 cars 37.5m x 12m
Holding Yards (12 horses) 12 x 4m x 4m

The proposed transportable building is a second hand unit which currently located at 478 Decastilla Road, Bakers Hill.

The site of the Bakers Hill Equestrian Centre was previously used as a rubbish tip, therefore, some of the areas are not suitable for the proposed activity. The chosen location is the most suitable area for this purpose, and is shown on the attached map.

STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS

The Reserve 25785 is approximately 22.6 hectares and zoned as Parks and Recreation under the provisions of Town Planning Scheme No. 3 (TPS 3). The land is crown land vested in the Shire of Northam for the purpose of 'recreation' and has the power to lease.

This application requires Council's determination due to the land being vested with the Shire of Northam and Carriage Driving or Horse Riding for disabled is not a listed use in the Town Planning Scheme No 3.

'Sporting and Recreational' facilities is classified within the definition of "Community Infrastructure" in the Town Planning Scheme No. 3 which means the structures and facilities provided should help communities and neighbourhoods to function effectively. The provision for facilities for disabled is conforming to the objective of the zone.

In regards to the second hand transportable building, The policy 1.9 Relocated Dwellings (Second Hand Dwellings) is not applicable for this application as the building will not be used as a dwelling.

CONFORMITY WITH THE PLAN FOR THE FUTURE

GOAL: To maintain a balance between maintenance of our lifestyle and sense of community with population growth and accompanying development.

STRATEGY: Encourage a collaborative approach with residents and special interest groups to identify projects, challenges and solutions.

STRATEGY: Encourage the community involvement through volunteering.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

The applicant has paid \$140.00 for Planning Application fee.

OFFICER'S COMMENT

At present there is an Equestrian Centre operating from the site, with the facility used by two horse riding clubs, the Horse & Pony Club and the Adult Riding Club. An additional horse riding facility for disabled will complement the existing facility.

The existing arena set aside for the Bakers Hill Equestrian Centre is not suitable for sharing with the RDBHCDC as the ground is too soft to be used for the carriage driving activities, therefore they need their own facility.

As this land use had been advertised with no objections received, and previously approved in principle by the Council, the application does not need to be advertised again. However at Council's April 2013 Forum Meeting, the Avon & Hills Carriage Driving Club had advised that it wished to be considered for sharing of the same area. Staff met with both RDBHCDC and AHCDC on 15 April 2013, and this appeared to be a reasonable option. The RDBHCDC agreed to submit amended plans as attached to reflect a joint arrangement. If changes to the proposal are required in the future, it will require further Council approval.

Following development approval, the Disabled Bakers Hill Carriage Driving Centre Inc (RDBHCDC) will need to obtain a licence agreement prior to commencing any works on the site. This is the equivalent of a lease agreement where a number of groups share the same area of land.

It is proposed that the conditions of the licence provide for the following responsibilities:

RDBHCDC is responsible for:

- all outgoings
- the cost of construction
- building and contents insurance for any buildings and contents
- the legal cost of drawing up the licence

Shire of Northam is responsible for:

- agreeing to a five year lease, with a five year renewal option
- providing the land at peppercorn rental

It is recommended that Council approve the request as it is providing an opportunity for the less fortunate to enjoy life and improve their quality of life.

RECOMMENDATION

That Council grant approval for Riding for the Disabled Bakers Hill Carriage Driving Centre Inc (RDBHCDC) to undertake riding and carriage driving on Reserve 39601, Bakers Hill subject to the following conditions:

- 1. All development being in accordance with the approved plans.

- 3. A Drainage Plan to be provided and approved by the Shire.

- The outbuilding must not be used for commercial or industrial purposes, or for human habitation, unless the prior written approval of the Council is applied for and granted.

PURPOSE

Council is required to consider a Modification 1 to the previously endorsed Local Structure Plan known as the Wundowie Northwest Precinct Local Structure Plan ("WNPLSP").

BACKGROUND

At the Ordinary Council Meeting held on 15 August 2012, a resolution was made as follows:

"That Council,

- 1. endorse the attached schedule of submissions and the recommendations contained therein with respect to adoption of the WNPLSP.
- 2. adopt the WNPLSP without modification.
- 3. authorise the Shire President and Chief Executive Officer to sign and execute the WNPLSP without modification and attach the Shire's common seal; and
- 4. forward the signed and executed WNPLSP without modification and Council's decision to the Western Australian Planning Commission for final approval."

The Structure Plan was endorsed by the Western Australian Planning Commission on 30 October 2012.

A condition of the Structure Plan states:

"Lots within a Bushfire-Prone Area are subject to a further Structure Plan amendment for the purposes of identifying building envelopes prior to the subdivision of the lot(s)."

An application for the Modification 1 which is the western portion of the WNPLSP (incorporating existing Lots 2 and 3 Golflinks Road) has been received which demonstrates building envelope allocations and specific bushfire prone lots.

The allocation of bushfire prone areas and the positioning of building envelopes within the Modification 1 area are considered to be minor amendments to the endorsed WNPLSP.

Council is required to consider adopting in final Modification 1 to the WNPLSP.

STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS

Lots 2 and 3 are currently zoned "Rural Smallholdings" under the provisions of Town Planning Scheme No 3 and will be zoned "Rural Residential" under proposed Local Planning Scheme No 6. Lot 2 is approximately 161.7729 hectares and Lot 3 is approximately 183.6259 hectares.

Structure Plans are governed by Clause 5.21 of TPS 3. Clause 5.21 does not specifically deal with the requirements of a modification to an endorsed structure plan. However, advice received from the Department of Planning allows for the consideration of a minor amendment to an endorsed structure plan to be undertaken by Council without the requirement for advertising and without the requirement for lodging detailed supporting documentation.

Therefore, public consultation has not taken place in relation to Modification 1 to the WNPLSP as it is not considered to be required in the circumstances.

CONFORMITY WITH THE PLAN FOR THE FUTURE

GOAL: To maintain a balance between maintenance of our lifestyle and sense of community with population growth and accompanying development.

The WNPLSP, when implemented, will cater for population growth over a lengthy period of time and will allow for a large number of land parcels which will be adequate for maintaining community lifestyle choices.

GOAL: To anticipate the land use needs within the Shire and implement planning decisions that ensures availability of appropriately zoned land that compliments orderly and environmentally sustainable growth and development.

The lots incorporated within the WNPLSP are appropriately zoned. The WNPLSP has been assessed in accordance with environmental and sustainability principles and decisions made in determining the WNPLSP will provide for long term growth for the locality of the Wundowie Northwest Precinct.

Modification 1 will provide guidance to property owners when lodging development applications in terms of bushfire protection methods and will enable the Shire to enforce bushfire protection methods should it be deemed necessary.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

The applicant is not required to pay any application or advertising fees as the modification is considered to be minor in nature.

In the future, at subdivision stage, land will be ceded to the Shire for public open space and drainage infrastructure.

OFFICER'S COMMENT

The endorsed WNPLSP placed requirements over the entire Structure Plan area for the placement of building envelopes on bushfire prone lots via a modification to the WNPLSP.

Modification 1 to the WNPLSP has identified building envelopes for the area comprised within Lots 2 and 3 Golflinks Road, Wundowie and is considered by staff and the Department of Planning to be minor in nature.

The allocation of bushfire prone lots and the position of building envelopes have been scrutinised by staff and are considered to be appropriate. Provisions for AS:3959 will be imposed on bushfire prone lots at subdivision stage by the lodgement of a Restrictive Covenant against the titles of the properties.

Specific road design, layout and alignment together with drainage requirements will be addressed at subdivision stage via the lodgement and approval of engineering drawings.

Any further proposal for subdivision which involves the other landholdings within the WNPLSP area will be required to undertake a modification to the WNPLSP to address the same issues which are discussed as part of this report prior to the lodgement of a subdivision application with the Western Australian Planning Commission.

The layout of Modification 1 to the WNPLSP has not substantially changed from the endorsed WNPLSP and, based on this, it is recommended that Council adopt the Modification 1 to WNPLSP and endorse the Executive Manager of Development Services to forward the modified Structure Plan to the Western Australian Planning

PURPOSE

A request has been received from the Eastern Metropolitan Regional Council (EMRC) for the Shire of Northam to consider a fee for service arrangement for the management of Lotterywest funding and coordination for a regional marketing campaign for the Avon Descent Family Fun Days. The request is for a \$5,000 contribution.

BACKGROUND

The Eastern Metropolitan Regional Council (EMRC) is a regional local government constituted under the Local Government Act (1995) working on behalf of six member councils (City of Swan, City of Belmont, City of Bayswater, Town of Bassendean, Shire of Mundaring and Shire of Kalamunda).

The Avon Descent white water race is a two-day time sporting event held on the first weekend of August each year as competitors challenge the Avon and Swan Rivers in paddle and power craft over the 124 kilometres from Northam to Bayswater. The race is coordinated by the Northam's Avon Descent Association and celebrated its 40th anniversary in 2012.

The Avon Descent Family Fun Days have been staged for 13 years in conjunction with the Avon Descent white water race, and comprises of five events held over the race weekend in riverside locations along the Avon and Swan Rivers by the local governments of Bayswater, Belmont, Northam, Swan and Toodyay.

Since 2005, following a change in Lotterywest funding criteria and subsequent discussions with stakeholders, the EMRC has coordinated the annual Lotterywest grant application and acquittal for all the Avon Descent Family Fun Days on behalf of participating councils – including three member councils (Cities of Bayswater, Belmont and Swan) and two non-member councils (Shires of Northam and Toodyay). The Town of Bassendean also plays a small part in the Avon Descent event by promoting viewing areas along the river in their area (rather than staging an event) and receives minimal financial and promotional benefits.

Each participating council prepares its event budget and receives an allocation of the funding from the EMRC provided by Lotterywest to assist with their event staging costs. Since 2010 (following direction from Lotterywest), the EMRC has coordinated a multimedia regional marketing campaign to promote the Family Fun Days. This marketing campaign includes flyers (made available to the participating local governments for distribution), print media in the West Australian and community newspapers, a range of websites and radio advertising. Once this marketing campaign was introduced, the local governments were no longer able to allocate any of their Lotterywest funding toward additional marketing of the events and the Shire allocated funds for promotion of the event.

In 2012 the Shire of Northam received \$27,154.98 (ex GST) from Lotterywest via EMRC towards event staging costs. The Shire allocated a further \$6,000 to the event and its promotion, including approximately \$2,000 for radio advertising as the EMRC campaign has to date not included advertising on local radio

Shire of Northam Officers have been negotiating with the EMRC to have Radio West 864 AM and Hot FM 96.5 included in the Avon Descent Family Fun Days regional marketing campaign. Recent advice provided by the EMRC indicates that this will incur minimal additional cost and is therefore likely to be provided. This would therefore negate the requirement for the Shire of Northam to undertake its own radio advertising campaigns for the Avon River Festival.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

The EMRC is requesting a fee of \$5,000 (ex GST) per annum to undertake the management of Lotterywest funding and coordination for a regional marketing campaign for the Avon Descent Family Fun Days. The Shire's 2012/13 Budget has \$68,028 allocated for the Avon Descent and River Festival, of which \$27,000 is from the Lotterywest grant.

CONFORMITY WITH THE PLAN FOR THE FUTURE

KEY RESULT AREA: BUILDING OUR COMMUNITY

GOAL: To maintain a balance between maintenance of our lifestyle and sense of

community with population growth and accompanying development.

OFFICER'S COMMENTS

EMRC member councils financially contribute to EMRC regional event programmes, including the Avon Descent Family Fun Days, while the Shires of Northam and Toodyay are currently not charged for this service provision.

EMRC takes responsibility for the management of Lotterywest grant application/acquittals process as well as the coordination of a regional marketing campaign for the Avon Descent Family Fun Days. Whilst the actual family fun day events are held over only one weekend, this project requires officer time throughout the

year due to the grant application, management and acquittal process, and coordination of the regional marketing campaign. EMRC have estimated that this project requires over 700 hours of EMRC Project Officer time per annum.

To improve equity and to ensure that EMRC can sustain the resources required to coordinate the project, the EMRC has proposed a fee for service arrangement. EMRC states that the request of \$5,000 (ex GST) for service provision from each non-member council taking part in the Avon Descent Family Fun Days is less than half of the current estimated cost for Project Officer time that would usually be charged to external organisations.

The EMRC marketing campaigns to date has been very professional, although the communities in the Avon region have been somewhat disadvantaged in that the radio campaigns did not include any regional radio stations. With the inclusion of RadioWest and HotFM in the 2013 radio advertising campaign, the Northam and Toodyay communities will receive a more equitable allocation of the promotional efforts. Advertising in the Hills Gazette and the Avon Valley Gazette will also be included in the 2013 campaign.

Given these additional benefits, and the simplified application and acquittal process required by the Shire of Northam for the Lotterywest grant allocation due to the coordination efforts of the EMRC, a fee for service would be warranted. With the addition of advertising on the local regional radio stations, a fee for service of \$2,000 is considered reasonable and equitable. This is then offset by the savings on radio advertising that the Shire of Northam would otherwise undertake.

As the current agreement between Lotterywest and the EMRC is scheduled for revue prior to the 2014 Avon Descent Family Fun Days, there may be a requirement for renegotiations of the fee for service dependent on future grant agreements.

PURPOSE

For Council to consider a request from a joint committee of the Northam Aero Club and the West Australian Balloon and Airship Club (the Committee) to seek Council support to host the National Hot Air Ballooning Championships in Northam.

BACKGROUND

Shire of Northam Officers have been approached by a joint committee of the Northam Aero Club and the West Australian Balloon and Airship Club (the Committee) to seek Council support to host the National Hot Air Ballooning Championships in Northam.

The Australian Ballooning Federation is currently seeking Expressions Of Interest (EOI) for the hosting of both the 2014 and 2015 Championships, with specific dates for the events to be at the discretion of the successful host organisation (subject to meteorological conditions and other ballooning events). EOI's close on 31 May 2013 for both the 2014 and 2015 events.

The annual event is held over an approximate 10 day period and usually involves around 25 to 30 competitors. The 2013 event has recently been held in Canowindra, NSW and attracted 22 competition pilots and 8 fiesta pilots (including 3 USA and 1 British pilot).

The Committee has advised that they are seeking to submit an EOI to host the event at Northam in the spring of 2014 and have submitted a request for early notional support from Council to support their bid.

Correspondence received indicated a request for support from the Shire of Northam for the following:

1. Provision of a venue for the purpose of briefing, operations centre, presentations etc

A central venue is required that could be used for presentations, welcome and farewell dinners, pilot briefings, and operations centre. The Northam Recreation Centre has been identified as the preferred venue, as it has capacity to cater for groups of between 60 and 200 people for various purposes, as well as an operations room.

Until details of venue requirements are received an estimate cost for venue hire cannot be calculated.

2. Sponsorship for transportation and accommodation of event officials

The hosts of the event are required to provide accommodation and transportation for the event officials. The Committee has provided an estimate cost as being between \$12,000 and \$15,000 and the Committee are requesting that Council fund this outlay.

3. Sponsorship for provision of gas to competitors

The correspondence received includes a request for sponsorship of provision of gas in order to attract competitors to the event, however follow up correspondence indicates that sponsorship from suppliers (Elgas, Origin, BOC & Kleenheat) would also be sought. It is estimated that the cost for gas will be in the vicinity of \$30,000.

Representatives of the Committee attended a Council Strategic Forum in April 2013 to make a presentation to Council in relation to their request for support. At the time of writing this report the Committee has not been able to provide details of facility requirements nor accurate estimates for the cost of travel and accommodation.

Additional Requirements of the Shire of Northam

Whilst not indicated as a direct request from the Committee, the Australian Ballooning Federation's invitation to submit an EOI includes a request to the host city or town to fund and arrange a community carnival where hot air balloons will conduct a night glow (weather permitting).

Council Officers anticipate that the cost of hosting of a community festival would be in the vicinity of \$25,000 to \$30,000. External funding could be sought to assist the hosting of such an event.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

The implications for the Shire of Northam could be significant; dependent on the level of support (if any) that Council determines to commit to the Ballooning Championships and / or festivities that accompany it.

CONFORMITY WITH THE PLAN FOR THE FUTURE

KEY RESULT AREA: BUILDING OUR COMMUNITY

GOAL: To maintain a balance between maintenance of our lifestyle and sense of

community with population growth and accompanying development.

OFFICER'S COMMENTS

The Australian Ballooning Championships have previously been held in Northam in 1981 and 1984, and have in recent years been held in Mildura, Benella and Canowindra over in the Eastern States. The Committee believes that the events there have produced significant tourism development and local promotion, and details on the events can be found on the following websites:

www.abf.net.au

www.canowindrachallenge.org.au

The Championships will likely attract approximately 200 participants and 30 balloons, and according to the Australian Ballooning Federation around 1,000 people to the host region (competitors & crew, officials, event staff, media and spectators). A media statement by the Canowindra News on 29 April 2013 indicates that more than 8,000 people attended the night "Balloon Glow" and associated activities at the recent Championships held at Canowindra, NSW; a significant rise from previous year's spectators.

Should Council determine to consider supporting a bid to host the Championships in Northam, timing of the event will be crucial to its success and the benefits to the region.

Spring is when the Avon Valley is at its most picturesque, and would be the ideal time of year to host the event. Whilst the Committee has indicated a preference to host the event in 2014, it is considered that this will not provide sufficient lead up time for the community to plan and secure additional funding for the festival and other activities to build on the Championships. In order to maximise social and economic benefit to the local community, the associated festivities and events need to appeal to a broad audience, and would come at considerable cost. In order to secure substantive external funding and sponsorship, adequate time to prepare a business case and apply for funding is required, as opportunities for funding may only become available once per year (e.g. EventsCorp Regional Events funding).

As ballooning activities occur at dawn, the number of spectators travelling from Perth to see the balloons alone may be limited therefore additional activities and attractions that would make the event more appealing to visitors requires consideration as well as the costs and planning associated with this. Furthermore, there are limited provisions for

visitor accommodation in and around Northam that would enable any significant number of spectators to stay overnight therefore collaboration with surrounding tourism districts, particularly York and Toodyay, would be required to ensure accommodation options are available.

Should the Council support a bid to host the Ballooning Championships in Northam, the hosting of the 2015 rather than the 2014 event would provide far greater opportunity to further leverage the event by providing greater capacity to plan and resource supporting events. Also, there is limited capacity for Shire staff to take on the planning and management of more events, and therefore without either additional time or provision of additional staffing hours the capacity to prepare for a significant festival event in 2014 is limited.

Should Council determine to support the hosting of the Ballooning Championships in Northam, it is recommended that a working party be established to ensure broad support by the Northam and surrounding communities. Collaboration with surrounding local governments, the Chamber of Commerce, Avon Tourism, Experience Perth and other stakeholders will be crucial to ensuring social and economic benefits to the region.

Council provides significant support to a range of public events hosted in the Shire of Northam, including the Bakers Hill Motorama, Wundowie Iron Festival and Northam Flying 50, which receive up to \$15,000 per event. The Shire of Northam has also sponsored the Northam Avon Descent Association for many years through an annual allocation of \$20,000. It is therefore considered that sponsorship for the Australian Ballooning Championships of \$15,000 would be appropriate for the scale of the event, particularly as the Council would also be expected to host a community celebration that would incorporate the "balloon night glow". It is recommended that an agreement would be established with the Committee to ensure maximum collaboration on the seeking of external funding and undertaking of marketing campaigns for the Championships and the community festival.

RECOMMENDATION
