Leeming Rd West has had false information used to exclude it from the assessment, this includes stating there is a closed gate restricting access to the site from the west which is false as there is no gate at all. The CBH submission states that because of this closed gate, road condition and low rating that it assumes 100% of movements will be from Great Eastern Highway side of Leeming Rd. This is false as seen during the last harvest.

The applicant is also required to provide a Construction Management Plan which will allow Council to better understand and manage the

13.1 CEO'S Office

13.1.1 Lease Agreement for Northam Pistol Club, Portion of Reserve 3303, 98 Clarke Street Northam

Clarification was sought in relation to:

- How the Pistol Club were able to build a structure without shire approval.
 - Executive Manager Development Services advised that the shire simply was not aware that it had been done. However once we became aware, we reached out to the Pistol Club to explain the breach and have been assisting them through the process of retrospective approval since. It was noted that the Pistol Club had not thought they needed approval as they were replacing a shed with a shed (like for a like).
- If there is any liability risk for the shire.
 Chief Executive Officer advised that in his view the exposure would be limited, however it would very much depend on the circumstance. The Shire was simply unaware that the works had been undertaken and as soon as we were made aware of the situation steps were taken to correct it.
- If the Pistol Club would need to follow the same procedure a rate payer would.





Executive Manager Development Services advised that the club would be able to apply for retrospective approval but would still need to comply with all necessary building requirements and specifications.

A. BACKGROUND / DETAILS



Background

Council at its Ordinary Meeting held on 21 July 2021 resolved to grant development approval for the construction of a temporary grain receival and storage facility at Lots 9002, 18, 19 and 20 Leeming Road, Grass Valley.

The existing development currently consists of six open bulkheads, temporary sample hut, weighbridge and staff amenities.

The original development approval was granted for a temporary period of 12 months. A 24 month extension was granted by Council at last month's OCM to enable CBH to continue to provide additional grain storage and to plan for the development of their new permanent facility on the site.

Application Details

CBH is now seeking approval to construct an additional three open storage bulkheads with a capacity of 123,140 tonnes to provide emergency storage to cater for the current forecast of another significant harvest and the large amount of carryover grain from the previous season.

The existing temporary weighbridge, sample hut and staff facilities will continue to be utilised. New access roads and stormwater detention are also proposed as part of this application.

B. CONSIDERATIONS

- (a) to amend the approval so as to extend the period within which any development approved must be substantially commenced;
- (b) to amend or delete any condition to which the approval is subject;



- (c) to amend an aspect of the development approved, which if amended, would not substantially change the development approved;
- (d) to cancel the approval.

The application to construct an additional three bulkheads can be considered under the provisions of sub-clause (c) as it is amending an aspect of the development approval that does not substantially change the development approval (i.e. a temporary grain receival and handling facility).

There are no policy implications associated with this proposal.

The Applicant has consulted with Main Roads WA who have advised that they have no objections to the approval of the three additional bulkheads.

C. OFFICER'S COMMENT



The assessment of the original application identified the main issues to be traffic generation and stormwater management.

Traffic

A Traffic Impact Assessment has been submitted with the application to provide an assessment of the increase in traffic movements as a result of the additional storage, which will increase from 251kt to 374kt.

The TIA indicates that the truck movements for the upcoming season will exceed the existing capacity and last year's truck movements during harvest. The intent of the additional emergency storage is to reduce the outgoing movements during harvest as shown in the scenarios in the following table from page 3 of the TIA:

CBH have consulted Main Roads WA regarding the proposed development and resulting additional traffic generation. Main Roads have raised no objections to approval of the development relating to potential impacts from the additional truck movements on Great Eastern Highway and the intersection with Leeming Road.

Shire Officers agree with the Main Roads assessment regarding the operational phase of the development. Leeming Road is capable of catering for additional heavy vehicle movements and is constructed to acceptable standard for accessing and egressing the site from an easterly direction, which is the direction the TIA indicates the harvest traffic will be generated.

However, the TIA does not provide an assessment of the traffic movements associated with the construction phase of the development. CBH Officers have advised that approximately 20,000 tonnes of gravel will be required to construct the additional bulkheads, which equates to approximately 350 truck movements importing gravel onto the site from a local supplier.

Previously the gravel was sourced from a local gravel pit on Gentle Road entering the site from an easterly direction, which resulted in a number of



complaints being received regarding the impacts on the condition of Grass Valley South Road. To better understand and manage the number, frequency and impact of the truck movements during the construction phase, a condition is recommended requiring submission and approval of a Construction Management Plan.

Stormwater

The development application also contains a Stormwater Management Plan, which proposes the construction of an additional onsite drainage basin to manage stormwater runoff from the proposed bulkheads and associated accessways to retain manage stormwater on-site.

Future Development

CBH have indicated that a masterplan for the site is currently being prepared and that they are keen to discuss their plans with Shire Officers in the near future.

Scheme Amendment No. 16 that proposes to rezone portions of the land to General Industry to facilitate the future development of the site by CBH, including construction of a rail spur, is currently with the Western Australian Planning Commission for final approval.

Conclusion

The approval of this application will not substantially change the intent of the original development approval to develop the land for the purposes of a temporary grain receival and storage facility, and is acceptable to consider under the provisions of clause 77 of the Deemed Provisions.

The application is recommended for approval subject to the reimposition of the original conditions of approval, except where varied by this amendment including the requirement for approval of a Construction Management Plan.

LOT 9002 LEEMING ROAD, GRASS VALLEY, WA 6403 STORAGE ADDITIONS TO EXISTING GRAIN HANDLING & STORAGE FACILITY

CBH is seeking development approval from the Shire of Northam for proposed additions (storage bulkheads) to an existing grain handling and storage facility located at Lot 9002 Leeming Road, Grass Valley. The subject application is prepared in accordance with Schedule 2 (Deemed Provisions) of the Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015 and the Shire of Northam Local Planning Scheme No. 6.

Site Details

Lot 9002 Leeming Road, Grass Valley (subject site) is located within the Avon Industrial Park as shown in Figure 1 below.



Figure 1: Location Plan



Background

At the 21 July 2021 Ordinary Council Meeting, Council resolved to approve an application to obtain development approval to construct a temporary grain receival and storage facility at its Meenaar site located within the Avon Industrial Park. Condition 2 of this development approval limited the approval to a period of 12 months from the date of the commencement of the approved use.

CBH lodged a further development application to amend this condition 2 which time limited the use of the facility to 12 months. At the 20 July 2022 Ordinary Council Meeting, Council resolved to approve the amended development application for the continued use of the temporary grain receival and storage facility for a further 24 months.

As you know, CBH had a record harvest last year where its existing storage infrastructure was not enough to keep up with the record crop. The Shire of Northam assisted CBH with this storage shortfall through approving this development application for open storage bulkheads at the Meenaar CBH site.

Given the current forecast of another significant harvest for FY22/23 and the large amount of carryover grain that remains at many of our receival sites, we have identified the potential need to build emergency storage at identified sites with forecasted storage deficits for this harvest. The Meenaar CBH site is one of these sites where there is a strong likelihood that emergency storage could be needed. As such CBH is seeking development approval from the Shire of Northam for an additional three storage bulkheads.

Context and Land Use

The subject land is located within the Shire of Northam. Access to the site is from the south via Leeming Road which is an access road under the control of the Shire of Northam. The subject site is zoned 'general industry' under the Shire's Local Planning Scheme No. 6. The subject site is surrounded by 'rural' zoned land to the south and west and land immediately east of the subject site is also zoned 'general industry'. The site is adjacent to a parks and recreation reserve to the north than buffers land reserved as railway.

Town Planning Considerations

The proposed development is considered to be consistent with Clause 68 of Schedule 2 (Deemed Provisions) of the Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015 and the provisions of the Shire of Northam Local Planning Scheme No. 6. The subject land is zoned 'general industry under the Shire's Local Planning Scheme No. 6. The development proposed does not require any public consultation as it is a 'D' (discretionary) use under the provisions of Local Planning Scheme No. 6.

Through their assessment of the previous application, the Shire of Northam identified the main issues to be traffic generation and stormwater management. Both issues were satisfactorily addressed by CBH and conditions of development approval were able to ensure that there were no adverse effects on the locality. CBH would be supportive of similar conditions being imposed on any subsequent development approval to ensure any potential impacts continue to be mitigated appropriately as it is noted that there have been specific concerns in relation to the impact of the facility on both Leeming and Grass Valley South roads. Notwithstanding a Stormwater Management Plan and Traffic Impact Statement have been provided with lodgement of the application to assists with the Shire's consideration of the proposal.



Traffic Management

As CBH are expecting another significant harvest in 2022/23 in order for our network to be able to service growers and cope with the task we have identified sites throughout the network where emergency storage is required. We propose to construct 3 new temporary OBH's with nameplate storage capacity of 123kt at Meenaar. This will increase the total site storage capacity from 251kt to 374kt. Note that the total site storage capacity includes 109kt which is expected to be held at the site as carryover grain from the prior year. The following notes are applicable to the Shire's consideration of storage capacity and its traffic impacts:

- Listed capacity is also not an accurate representation of what can be received due to
 operational intricacies that impact the sites. This namely because of "loss by
 division/loss by commodity" where multiple grain types are required to be stored/tarped
 within the same OBH, resulting in less efficient storage.
- The max case does not take into account the carryover amounts which refer to the amounts that will be retained/store in the storage from the prior year.
- Thereby reducing the effective storage amount for the current period by the carryover amount, our carryover estimate leading in to the 2022/23 harvest is 109kt.
- This means that the effective max storage capacity for the 2022/23 harvest with the proposed emergency storage build is 265kt.
- The effect of constructing the emergency storage is that out loading movements during the busy harvest period to keep the site open for grower receivals are eliminated.

Based on the average payload of 50.1t, the table below provides an estimate of the FY22/23 harvest period truck movements, with and without the proposed emergency OBH and with comparison to the previous year's volumes and movements.

As shown, the movements for FY22/23 regardless of the emergency TBH construction are expected to exceed the existing capacity and last year's truck movements, but the construction of the emergency TBH allows movements to be reduced in comparison to the scenario where the emergency TBH is not installed for the 2022/2023 harvest. Further detail on the impact of roads is provided under Section 4.2 of the Traffic Impact Statement that is provided in conjunction with lodgement of this application.



Stormwater Management

An onsite drainage basin will be constructed that caters for a 5-year ARI event with all stormwater runoff from the proposed bulkheads and associated accessways directed to this drainage basin system where all surface water will be detained on-site up to the 5-year ARI event. A Stormwater Management Plan has been provided in conjunction with lodgement of the application for the Shire's consideration.

Noise & Dust Management

CBH shall ensure that noise from the specification and installation of any mechanical equipment as well as traffic and construction noise does not exceed assigned levels prescribed in the *Environmental Protection (Noise) Regulations 1997*, when it is received at a neighbouring property. CBH undertakes frequent noise and dust monitoring across its sites to ensure that dust and noise levels are measured and are mitigated whenever there is an exceedance.

Conclusion



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1. Introduction

1.1. The Project

CBH are in the process of planning for an emergency specification open Bulkhead (OBH) expansion to their existing Meenaar site to be delivered before the 2022 harvest. The Meenaar site is located within the Avon Industrial Park, approximately 20km east of the existing CBH Avon site, along Great Eastern Highway (GEH).

The Meenaar site has been operating in a temporary manner for one year, after CBH constructed 6x emergency bulkheads on the site ahead of the 2021 harvest.

The 2022 emergency OBH expansion involves the construction of three new bulkheads (TBH 07,08 and 09) to provide 1231,140t of storage. Refer to **Appendix A – CBH Concept Plan** which shows the proposed bulkhead areas.

Figure 1 shows the general location of the Meenaar site.

1.2. Purpose

The purpose of this report is to outline and quantify the proposed stormwater management measures to be

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adopted for the emergency bulkhead construction. This SWMP has been prepared ahead of detailed designs for the bulkhead construction and will be utilised to guide the future design work.

1.3. History

Shawmac previously prepared a Stormwater Management Plan to support the 2021 emergency expansion. Refer to document 2106010-REP-005. The 2021 SWMP identified the stormwater management measures to be adopted for the previous emergency bulkhead construction. In general, these included:

- · Maintaining the two existing discharge points from the site.
- Installation of 2x new drainage basins just upstream of each site discharge point to compensate postdevelopment outflow rates to pre-developed levels for up to the 5-year ARI event.
- The basins were designed to be free-draining (i.e. with an outlet at base level) so that they would empty between design events.
- Design of internal open drains and culverts in accordance to CBH's emergency bulkhead design criteria for up to the 5-year ARI event.

Although the 2021 SWMP proposed that the basins were to be free draining, they were not constructed this way. The reason behind this is not known, but may be due to a common Shire requirement to retain stormwater drainage on site.





2. Pre-developed Situation

2.1. General

For the purpose of this SWMP, the pre-developed descriptions will mainly reflect the situation prior to construction of the 2021 emergency bulkheads. Both the 2021 and 2022 emergency constructions seek to replicate the pre-developed situation as far as practical.

2.2. Site Characteristics

The pre-developed site was vacant and cleared of almost all significant vegetation. The site is bound by Leeming Road to the south, railway and Great Eastern Highway to the north, industrial development to the east and farmland to the west. The site is generally featureless except for a sand quarry located in the central northern part of the site and a number of rock outcrops throughout the site.

2.3. Topography

Figure 3 shows the topography (2m contours) of the site and its immediate surrounds, as well as the 2021

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emergency bulkhead construction. The site is undulating, and ranges in height from approximately 226m AHD along the eastern boundary to 251m AHD in the central northern area. A ridge in the northern part of the site and saddle in the southern portion results in the land falling to the north, east and southwest. The typical gradients are in the order of 1.5% to 7%.

2.4. Geotechnical

Galt Geotechnics undertook a geotechnical investigation of the site in July 2021 which involved excavation of 6 test pits at depths ranging from 1.0m to 2.9m. Galt described the subsurface conditions generally as follows:

- Northern portion (TBH05/06):
 - Thin layer of topsoil over variable thickness gravelly soil (gravelly sand/sandy gravel) and residual to extremely weathered rock (sandy clay to clay) to the maximum investigated depth of 2.3m.
- Balance of site:
 - Thin layer of topsoil over residual to extremely weathered rock. The weathered rock varies significantly between Sandy Clay/Clay, Clayey Sand and gravelly soils.

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A previous geotechnical investigation was undertaken by GHD in September 2010 for the entire Avon Industrial Park. GHD described the soils the of the site as generally consisting of a layer of topsoil over residual and extremely weathered granitic gneiss soil, overlying granite gneiss bedrock. Localised yellow sand and gravelly sand/sandy gravel were encountered in the proximity of the existing quarry, with the thickness of sandy material ranging from 0.9m to 2.7m depths. Several rock outcrops were identified throughout the site.

Permeability tests were undertaken by GHD which indicated the permeability of the site soils range from 0.08m/day to 0.1m/day. GHD advised that stormwater disposal through infiltration is not recommended.

2.5. Environmental

The site is almost completely cleared of natural vegetation and there is little environmental value within the site. The northern and eastern portion of the site fall towards Grass Valley Brook on the northern side of Great Eastern Highway. Grass Valley Brook combines with Mortlock River and then Avon River at Northam. The south western portion of the site falls towards an unnamed creek which traverses through farm land and connects to Mortlock River approximately 5km south east of the site.

2.6. Catchment and Surface Water Flows

Based on the location of the proposed OBH's and the existing topography, the site can be divided into two catchments. Catchment 'A' is located over the western portion of the site and discharges towards a culvert underneath Leeming Road which outfalls into the creek line running south to Mortlock River. Part of the adjacent farm to the west of the CBH site also contributes to this outlet. Catchment 'B' is located over the eastern portion of the site and discharges towards a creek line which flows into culverts under the railway, Great Eastern Highway and then Grass Valley Brook.

The proposed TBH07 is situated on the boundary between Catchment 'A', 'B' and the external catchment which falls north towards the railway line and Great Eastern Highway. CBH's design standards (open drains) will result in all runoff from TBH07 being directed to Catchment 'A' or 'B'. Given that the area of TBH07 within the external catchment is negligible in comparison to the overall catchment, the external catchment will be excluded from further assessment.

The existing catchments were assessed using ARR's (2001) Index Flood Method. **Table 1** below shows the estimated pre-existing flow rates for various Average Recurrence Intervals.

3. Stormwater Management Strategy

3.1. Strategy Overview

The proposed stormwater management strategy is identical to that adopted for the 2021 emergency bulkhead construction, including construction of the basins to not be free draining (i.e. without a low level culvert outlet). Note that the basin design parameters described in the 2021 SWMP reflect a free draining scenario. For this 2022 SWMP, the basin design parameters are much more onerous to reflect the increase catchment area for the site expansion as well as the removal of the low level culvert outlets.

Similar to the 2021 construction, the proposed overall drainage strategy primarily involves the retention of the two existing discharge points. Basin's A' and 'B' will be located just upstream of these locations and will be sized to CBH's design criteria to retain the entirety of the critical 5-year event. For events greater than this, the basins will overtop towards the existing discharge points. Typically, for Meenaar, the critical 5-year event (24 hours) of 54.8mm represents 78% of the average rainfall received in the month of July (70.1mm).

The proposed OBH's and other infrastructure areas are almost entirely located within either Catchment 'A' or 'B' and accordingly, the earthworks designs will seek to maintain the existing catchment boundaries and overall areas as far as practical, and to direct runoff from the entire infrastructure area to one of the basins.

There is a small area of the northern part of the bulkheads (TBH07) that sits just outside the Catchment 'A' or 'B' boundary. This is a portion of land on the northern side of the natural ridge which falls to the north. This area will be captured in the open drains and directed to the two drainage basins to prevent uncontrolled runoff towards the north. This will require the basins to be slightly larger by proportion due to the change in catchment area.

As the site has poor infiltration characteristics and no low level outfall, the basins will start to fill after the first rains and drain very slowly, if at all. It is possible that the basin will fill and leave insufficient capacity for further rainfall events, then overtop towards the existing flow paths. There is risk of scour and transport of sediments occurring to the downstream land should the basins overtop. Provision will be made for this, through the construction of a controlled weir outfall from the basin and installation of loose rock to reduce velocities and promote sheet flow, but it should be noted that these measures are not 100% effective and ongoing monitoring and some repair work are likely to be required.

It is understood that after service life, CBH either decommission the basin and emergency bulkheads (and restore the site to its original conditions) or implement a permanent drainage solution in line with the planned permanent expansion of Meenaar site.

3.2. Design Criteria and Modelling Assumptions

Based on the adopted strategy and CBH's emergency bulkhead design specifications, the key stormwater

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management design criteria are summarised as follows:

- The existing internal and external catchments should retain their current flow paths through to the existing site discharge points as far as practical.
- The basin is to be sized for the critical 5-year event, with no outfall and a 300mm freeboard.
- The basin, open drains and culverts are to be sized for the 5-year ARI event in accordance with CBH requirements.
- A nominal 100mm/day infiltration rate has been assumed to reflect some seepage and evaporation.
- The basins should have provision for a controlled weir overflow and scour protection measures.
- Open drains are to be set at a minimum 300mm deep below the bottom of pavement, or 600mm below surface where no pavement is to be installed.
- Culvert headwater heights are to be limited to a maximum 300mm below shoulder surface level.
- Culverts may have a minimum 400mm cover.
- Minimum drain fall of 0.3% in accordance with CBH requirements.
- No scour protection (likely problem areas (>2m/s velocity to be highlighted), except for basin outlets.

A preliminary XPSTORM model has been built for the proposed works. The following key assumptions were utilised:

- Infiltration losses were assumed as 15mm from pervious areas. Nil losses were assumed for impervious
 areas.
- Rainfall intensities and temporal patterns are consistent with ARR 2019.
- Mannings 'n' value of 0.03 was assumed for open drains, to allow lower construction tolerances and some vegetation growth.
- The temporary OBH's are assumed to be impervious, and runoff occurs in one direction, consistent with
 the earthworks design. Note that when the tarping is installed runoff from half the OBH will fall in the
 opposite direction. The open drains have been checked for capacity under these conditions.





3.3. Stormwater Quantity

Table 2 and Error! Reference source not found, provide summaries of the modelling outcomes of the basins and culverts, respectively. All results reflect the 5-year event.

Culvert and open drains have not been modelled in detail at this stage. These designs will be finalised in conjunction with the detailed earthworks designs, consistent with the design criteria outlined in the previous section of this report.



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1. Introduction

1.1. Background

CBH are proposing to construct emergency open bulkheads (TBH) at their existing Meenaar site in preparation for the 2022 harvest. It is proposed to construct three new emergency TBH's (TBH 07,08,09) with 123,140t capacity which will utilise the existing site access/exit and marshal/sample/weigh facilities.

Shawmac have been commissioned to prepare a Traffic Impact Statement assessing the impacts of the proposed emergency OBH storage on the surrounding road network.




Figure 1: Site Location

Figure 1 shows the existing site and location of the proposed emergency TBH's. Refer to **Appendix A – CBH** Concept Plan for full details of the proposal.

The emergency TBH's are anticipated to be in place for one year only.

2. Existing Situation

2.1. Road Network




Figure 2: Road Hierarchy Layout

The layout and hierarchy of the existing road network according to the Main Roads Western Australia (MRWA) Road Information Mapping System is shown in **Figure 2**.

As shown, Leeming Road is classified as an Access Road.

2.2. Speed Limit




Figure 3: MRWA Speed Limit of Surrounding Road Network

As per MRWA's Road Information Mapping System, Leeming Road has a posted speed limit of 50 km/h. **Figure 3** shows the speed zoning of the surrounding road network.

2.3. Carriageway Width and Cross Section

The carriageway and configuration of the relevant acjacent roads are summarised in Table 1.

The above measurements were taken from survey previously provided by CBH.





2.4. Traffic Volumes

The latest traffic volumes for Leeming Road were obtained from MRWA Traffic map as summarised in **Table 2** and **Table 3**.

As shown in **Figure 4**, the traffic count is located north of the CBH site and the pre-existing developed industrial area. In addition, the CBH site is at the end of the sealed section of Leeming Road where there is expected to be negligible public traffic as there is a closed gate restricting public and CBH access from the unsealed section of Leeming Road. Therefore, the traffic volumes along Leeming Road fronting the CBH site are expected to be much lower that the traffic count volumes. For conservatism, the traffic count volumes have been adopted for the existing traffic fronting the CBH site/ In addition, it is assumed that the traffic count volumes did not include any CBH traffic.

Considering the conservative approach mentioned above for assessing existing traffic fronting the CBH site, an annual growth factor has not been applied to the 2020/21 volumes and are considered suitable for the purpose of the 2022/23 assessment.

Detailed traffic count data is attached in Appendix A.

2.5. RAV Status

As per MRWA HVS network mapping tool:

- Leeming Road (East of Site access)
 - Categorised under the Tandem Drive RAV 7.3 and Tri Drive 1.3 network with the following conditions.
 - Maximum speed 70km/h.
 - All operators must carry current written approval from the road asset owner permitting use of the road.
- Leeming Road (West of Site access)
 - Categorised under the Tandem Drive RAV 3.1 and Tri Drive 1.1 network with the following conditions.
 - Maximum speed 40km/h.
 - All Operators must carry current written approval from the road asset owner permitting use of the
 road. No Operation on unsealed road segment when visibly wet, without road owner's approval.




Figure 5: RAV Status - Tandem Drive Network




Figure 6: RAV Status - Tri Drive Network

Figure 5 and Figure 6 shows the Tandem Drive and Tri-Drive network along Leeming Road.

It is noted the RAV status along Leeming Road varies and the classification changes from Tandem Drive 7.3 to 3.1 and Tri Drive 1.3 to 1.1. The maximum trucks able to access Leeming Road are RAV 7 trucks up to the site access.

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2.6. Crash History




Figure 7: MRWA Crash report mapping

Crash data for the relevant roads in the vicinity of the site was sourced from MRWA Crash Analysis Reporting System (CARS) for the 5-year period ending 31/12/2021. This is shown in **Figure 7**.

Only one crash has been recorded along Leeming Road. The crash occurred on 13/01/2021 and involved a head on collision involving two vehicles. The severity is listed as "Property damage only".

2.7. Changes to Surrounding Transport Networks

There are no known changes to the acjacent network that have the potential to affect the assessment. It is understood that in the medium term, it is likely that the intersection of Leeming Road and Great Eastern Highway will be upgraded, however this is outside the planned timeframe for the operation of the emergency bulkheads.





3. Traffic Generation

3.1. Development Details

CBH propose to construct three new temporary TBH's to provide a total nameplate storage capacity of 123,140t. This will increase the total site storage capacity from 251,520t to 374,660t.

CBH have advised that the nameplate capacity is seldom able to be achieved. This is because of "loss by division/loss by commodity" where multiple grain types are required to be stored/tarped within the same TBH, resulting in less efficient storage. CBH have advised that maximum effective storage capacity for this site is generally around 94% of nameplate i.e., there is 6% lost due to loss by division/loss by commodity inefficiency. The effective existing storage capacity would therefore be 236,429t, increasing to 352,180t after construction of the emergency TBH.

However, CBH note that at present there is a large volume of "carry-over" grain at many sites including Meenaar. This is grain that, due to logistical constraints, has not been able to be removed from sites and exported prior to the upcoming harvest. This has left many sites, including Meenaar with a shortfall in capacity, and needing emergency storage to be built.

3.2. Haulage Vehicle




Figure 8: Typical Tandem Drive RAV7

It is proposed to use RAV7 trucks up to 36.5m long for the transport of grain. **Figure 8** shows a typical RAV7 vehicle. In addition, CBH also noted that while this site is rated for RAV7, deliveries would include haulage using RAV4 or even as low as RAV1 vehicles.

3.3. Operating Hours and Receival Period

The campaign period for receival of grains will start mid-Cctober and last 2-3 months. It is noted that the amount of daily receival varies depending on the supply.

CBH propose to operate the site 12 hours a day (6 AM to 6 PM) and Monday to Sunday with minor variations of start and finish times.

3.4. 5-year Average Traffic Data

The Meenaar Site has only been in operation since last year's harvest (2021/22). Therefore, CBH have only last year's traffic data as follows:

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- 2021/22 ieceivals 109,597t
- Average truck payload 50.1t
- Origin direction split 12.77% north, 4.03% south, 43.95% east, 39.25% west.

The traffic / receival data indicates that the site is currently not being loaded to full capacity. However, given the significant harvest this year, CBH is anticipating an increase in received tonnes to the site (compared to last year). In addition, CBH note that at present there is a large volume of "carry-over" grain at many sites including Meenaar. This is grain that, due to logistical constraints, has not been able to be removed from sites and exported prior to the upcoming harvest. Therefore, although the entire Meenaar site provides a significant amount of storage, well over last year's receivals, it is understood that a large portion of this is not available for receivals.

3.5. Predicted Traffic without Emergency OBH

CBH are proposing to construct the emergency TBH's to increase site capacity so that more grain can be stored through the harvest and inefficient out loading movements within the harvest period are avoided.

During the harvest, once site capacity is reached, out loading movements may be required to restore capacity and allow grain to continue to be received from the nearby farms. This will involve shifting the grain from Meenaar to the next available site with storage capacity, with movement occurring towards the export port. This double-handling of grain is inefficient in terms of cost and adds additional traffic to the surrounding road network.

For comparative purposes it is useful to assess what would occur if the proposed emergency bulkheads are not constructed.

CBH expect that the 2022/23 harvest receivals will exceed the available capacity of the site by approximately the volume of the planned emergency storage. This would result in receivals of approximately 115,752t (123,140t x 94% efficiency). Based on the average truck payload of 50.1t, this would result in an additional 2,310 truck movements within the harvest period for out loading.

Note that for the purposes of this assessment a single 'movement' is defined as a round trip i.e. the site entry/delivery and site exit/return home comprise one movement.

If the emergency TBH is constructed, then the 2,310 truck movements still need to occur to move the grain for export, but this would occur outside the harvest period, when there are less trucks on the road network.

3.6. Predicted Traffic with Emergency OBH

Regardless of whether the emergency OBH's are built, the same higher than average delivery movements to the Meenaar site will occur during the harvest. The effect of constructing the emergency storage is that out loading movements during the busy harvest period are eliminated.

CBH expect that the 2022/2023 harvest will result in approximately 231,021t of grain being transported to the

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Meenaar Site however, due to previous years of "carry-over" grain, it is understood that there is only 115,270t of storage available for receivals. Based on the average payload of 50.1t, **Table 4** provides an estimate of the 22/23 harvest period truck movements, with and without the proposed emergency OBH and with comparison to the current available storage.

As shown, the movements for 2022/2023 regardless of the emergency TBH construction are expected to exceed the existing capacity and last year's truck movements, but the construction of the emergency TBH allows movements to be reduced in comparison to the scenario where the emergency TBH is not installed for the 2022/2023 harvest.

3.7. Haulage Route

All trucks will enter and leave the CBH site via the existing access/exit off Leeming Road. CBH anticipate that the site catchment will result in the following movement directional split:

- North 12.77%
- South 4.03%
- East 43.95%
- West 39.25%

Based on the road network and given the condition and low RAV status of Leeming Road (west of the proposed site access, which access is also closed off by a gate, it is assumed that 100% of movements will entire the site from a right turn off Leeming Road and all vehicles will access the site from Great Eastern Highway.

3.8. Peak Period Assessment

Although the harvest period is expected to occur over a period of approximately 2-3 months, it is known that there is a peak within this period. Specific data for Meenaar was not available to define this peak period, but data from other CBH sites indicate that generally 80-85% of grain is received within 28 days.

For the purposes of assessing the peak period impacts, the following assumptions have been made:

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- 85% of total grain tonnes are received within, and evenly distributed over 28 days.
- Truck deliveries occur over a 12-hour period, and 10% of all daily volumes are received within a peak hour.

Based on these assumptions:

- 3,920 truck movements will occur during the 28-day peak.
- 140 movements will occur each day of the 28-day peak.
- 14 movements will occur during a peak hour.




Figure 9: Peak Daily/ Hour Volumes (CBH Only)

Figure 9 shows the peak daily / hourly movement volumes based on the previously discussed traffic distribution. Note that figures have been rounded up to the nearest whole number.

4. Traffic Impact Assessment

4.1. Assessment Years

The development is assessed based on current network condition (2022).

4.2. Impact on Roads

4.2.1. Road Minimum Widths

The sealed widths of the surrounding roads were checked against the Rural Road Minimum Width in accordance with Appendix A of the MRWA RAV assessment guideline. The comparison is shown below in **Table 5**.

4.3. Road Safety

The crash history of the adjacent road network (as previously outlined in **Section 2.6**) does not suggest any atypical safety issues in the existing road network. The additional traffic movements generated by the emergency bulkhead is not considered to increase the likelihood of crashes to unacceptable levels.

4.4. Safe Intersection Sight Distance – Site Exit

The Safe Intersection Sight Distance (SISD) is the minimum distance which should be provided on the major road at any intersection. SISD provides sufficient distance for a driver of a vehicle on the major road to observe a vehicle on a minor road approach moving into a collision situation (e.g. in the worst case, stalling across the traffic lanes) and to decelerate to a stop before reaching the collision point.

The SISD for the site exit along Leeming Road is assessed based on the following parameters:

- An observation time of 3 seconds as per Austroads Part 3;
- A reaction time of 2.5 seconds;
- Deceleration coefficients for the purpose of SISD calculations are 0.36 for light vehicles and 0.28 for heavy vehicles (Road Train Type 2 – RAV 7 equivalent);
- Driver eye height is 2.4m for trucks and 1.1m for cars; and

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Design speed for cars at 60km/h and trucks at 50km/h.

Figure 10 and Figure 11 show the available sight distance along Leeming Road from the site access. Note that although Leeming Road continues as an unsealed track extending west from the end of the cul-de-sac, there is a sight board and gate that prevent access. For Illustrative purposes, the sight distance measurements extend past the sight board and gate along the track.

The available sight distances are measured at approximately 520m and 510m to the west and east, respectively, as shown in **Figure 12**.

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Based on the sight distance parameters, **Table 6** shows a comparison between the required and available sight distances from the site access. As shown, the available sight distances are significantly greater than the minimum requirements.

4.5. Entering Sight Distance - Site Exit

The Entering Sight Distance (ESD) is the minimum distance for driver of a RAV, entering a through road, having appropriate sight distance to see a sufficient gap in oncoming traffic that will allow a RAV, with greater length and lower acceleration capacity, to clear the intersection safely.

The ESD is assessed based on the following parameters:

- · A reaction time of 4 seconds, and
- Deceleration coefficients of 0.29 (up to 90km/hr).

The Entering Sight Distance (ESD) for existing and proposed access locations has been assessed in accordance with RAV Route Assessment Guideline (updated May 2022). A comparison of available and required ESD for RAV vehicles are summarised in **Table 7**.

As shown, the ESD are sufficient to achieve minimum requirements in accordance with the MRWA RAV Assessment Guideline.






5. Conclusions

This Traffic Impact Statement has been prepared for the proposed Emergency TBH to be installed at CBH's existing Meenaar site. The TIS concluded:

- The estimated traffic generation can be accommodated within the capacity of the adjacent road network.
- The additional traffic generated by the site is not considered to increase the likelihood of crashes to unacceptable levels.
- The seal and carriageway widths of the surrounding road network generally meet the relevant RAV network requirements.
- There is sufficient sight distance at the existing site exit.







5.1 JASON WHITEAKER - INDUCTION COMMITTEE OF COUNCIL

DISCUSSION

- Ms Donna Moody requested the structure & process of meeting be considered. The meeting held 6 April the agenda was rushed through, and Elders were not given adequate time for consideration. It was agreed that the presentations at the previous meeting were time consuming and these be limited in the future.
- Ms Donna Moody questioned whether there was to be the opportunity for the Elders to take ownership of the Committee. CEO, Jason Whiteaker explained the position of the NCAG as a formal Committee of Council established under the Local Government Act. How the committee is run is governed by the Act. The Elders cannot take ownership of the Committee but can take leadership roles. Being a Committee of Council, the Elders are given a strong voice on cultural matters and decisions made are reported directly back to Council and are to be actioned.
- Mrs Deborah Moody asked why the committee are not receiving sitting fees. Mr Jason Whiteaker explained that the Local Government Act precluded the Shire from paying people to sit on Committees of Council. Ms Shirley Slater asked if this is something that Council can change their policy on, in which Mr Whiteaker explained that it is State Government legislation, and the Shire of Northam Council has no power to change it and must follow the legislation.





Mr Whiteaker stated that he hoped the Committee would see the bigger picture beyond the issue of payment for meeting attendance and leave a legacy for future generations by ensuring Council is celebrating Aboriginal Culture and capturing cultural knowledge for the community so this is not lost. Guidance is provided by the committee, however stories are collected outside the operations of the Committee and individuals are paid for their time when recording stories and knowledge.

Ms Donna Moody requested that the CEO, Jason Whiteaker investigates ways the Committee could be restructured so Elders and the Aboriginal Community can benefit from payment of their personal time and knowledge. Mr Whiteaker stated that Council could look at the NCAG becoming an informal group, who would then be eligible to receive payment, but in doing this the Committee would lose its strength of having a direct line to Council, where decisions made at NCAG meetings are reported to Council for implementation.

Mr Jermaine Davis stated that when invited to nominate, it was clearly raised to him that it was not to be a paid position to sit on the NCAG, that it was to be a voluntary role. He suggested that each Elder could be contacted to raise and communicate issues and concerns to be discussed at the meeting rather than getting a set agenda they have no input into. Mr Whiteaker agreed that 10 minutes could be dedicated to the start or conclusion of the meeting for Elders to raise topics and issues for discussion.



An update was provided by the Executive Manager Community Services, Ms Jo Metcalf.

- The Northam Yorga's Group are now meeting at the BKB.
- Tourism WA will be doing a photo shoot on the 9th May and the TV show Getaway will be featuring the BKB in a piece on the Avon Valley.

Mrs Victoria Williams gave an update on Stage 2 of the BKB.

- The Shire has funding for upgrades and repairs for existing things within the centre.
- The graphic as you enter the exhibition is to be changed.
- There will be new installations in the Welcome Space to give the impression of trees and new lighting effects.
- Some of the graphics of the wall panels are to be re-done, including the first panel where feedback has been that writing is too small.
- New stories will be collected from those who are yet to be captured, both written and video.





- Glitches to the touch screen will be repaired, so that all of the content doesn't pop up on the screen at once.
- Season monitors will be re-programmed and fitted with new speakers.
- The lighting will be improved to highlight the names on the wooden beams in the sorry space, as they are barely visible at the moment.
- Speakers will be upgraded to include directional speakers, as the sounds are currently competing with each other.
- There will be new showcases installed in the shop area for the stock.
 These will also be designed to provide better theft prevention.
- A digital screen will be installed out the front of the centre to highlight the exhibition and give people a glimpse of what they are paying for if they come in.

Ms Shirley Slater asked if the stories of the Ballardong soldiers be included in the updates to the exhibition, as she believes this will provide greater interest for the schools. Mrs Victoria Williams said that these could be programmed in to feature seasonally around ANZAC Day and Remembrance Day.

Ms Jo Metcalf updated the Committee that the BKB Centre Coordinator, Ms Robyn Davis has resigned. She will be finishing on 17 May 2022. Mr Jason Whiteaker, advised that an Elder is to sit on the interview panel for the selection of the new BKB Centre Coordinator. Mrs Yvonne Kickett recommended that Mrs Kathy Davis and Mrs Deborah Moody are the best Elders to be on the selection panel for the recruitment of the new Coordinator.

Ms Jo Metcalf provided an update on the Community Arts Network Noongar Lullabies Project. Session one was very successful, and on Friday 6 May ABC TV will be filming for national TV for a program on arts programs and community wellbeing. Ms Metcalf encouraged the committee to attend and advise others in the community to attend. It was suggested by Ms Donna Moody that Clontarf Academy and the Wirrpanda Girls be contacted to see if they are able to attend.





4. Meetings

5. Reporting

Minutes and recommendations of each NCAG meeting shall be presented to the next Ordinary Meeting of the Council

The NCAG is responsible for liaising with all relevant business units to complete and submit the RAP Impact Measurement Questionnaire to Reconciliation Australia

6. Duties and Responsibilities

The following activities will be carried out by the NCAG:

- · Provide guidance and assistance to Council on the future development of the BKB.
- Provide input and advice in relation to the development of a Shire of Northam Reconciliation Action Plan.
- . Meet with the Full Shire of Northam Council, not less than once each year to discuss progress of the Reconciliation Action Plan and BKB
- Develop a RAP within the context of the Shire of Northam's core business and inline with:
 - Over-arching community strategic plan and corporate business plan.
 - Any existing Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander employment strategy
 - Any existing supplier diversity strategy
 - Any existing equity and diversity policies.
- · Establish a collaborative/consultative process for engaging staff across the organisation so that they can provide ideas for the RAP and comment on drafts.
- Develop a project plan and timeline to development, launch and begin implementing the RAP, including consultation with Reconciliation Australia at regular intervals.

The basic principles considered in establishing a standard lease fee reflects a fair and equitable contribution of provision of a facility, the venue's pattern of use, location and the potential to obtain Community Grants assistance, as follows:-

- 2.1 The Shire levy an annual administration rent equivalent to the cost of building insurance, to all community, sport and recreation groups, not including the abovementioned Community Halls, and is reviewed annually.
- 2.2 Lessees or Licensees will be responsible for the full cost of the lease document preparation, registration and other costs associated with the execution of the agreement.
- 2.3 Lessees or Licensees must agree with Council to manage the "Demised Premises" on behalf of the community and to offer a service to the community that provides a net benefit.
- 2.4 The Lessee or Licensee will be responsible for the payment of outgoings, operating costs, and minor maintenance obligations.
- 2.5 The Lessee or Licensee will not be responsible for Shire land rates, but will be responsible for rubbish service rates.
- 2.6 The Shire will insure the "Demised Premises" at replacement value and pass on the cost to the Lessee as per 2.1. The Shire will perform any structural repairs, improvements and maintenance in accordance with levels determined within its budget forecast.
- 2.7 In the case of the Lessee or Licensee who leases a Council building and obtains approval to carry out extensions, alterations and/or additions, Council will insure the improvements as part of its insurance portfolio at replacement value.
- 2.8 The Lessee or Licensee will be responsible for contents insurance for their contents, and also hold public liability for their activities and



- workers compensation insurance for their employees (if applicable) to the value stipulated in the agreement.
- 2.9 The Lessee or Licensee will be responsible for the cost of repair of any internal damage, vandalism, corrective maintenance or damage to external doors, glass windows, security lighting and any other external facility through misuse by a club representative, member or guest. The Shire may carry out any corrective works and recoup the full cost from the Lessee.
- 2.10 The Lessee or Licensee will be responsible for keeping the building clean and tidy at levels predetermined within the agreement.
- 2.11 The Lessee or Licensee will not incur any costs for property damage excluding contents occasioned by fire, fusion, explosion, lightning, civil commotion, storm, tempest, or earthquake.
- 2.12 On an annual basis, Lessees and Shire representatives will meet to carry out a property inspection to determine the extent to which the Lessee or Licensee have met their lease/licence obligation and to consider any specified building maintenance schedules for the following twelve month period within the Shire's budget parameters.

Delegated Authority Register

Delegation F06 allows for the disposal of property by lease or licence. As the leased area is greater than 1,000m2 this lease cannot be approved under delegated authority.

A. BACKGROUND / DETAILS

Spencers Brook Road project is a fully funded project under the Regional Road Safety Program endorsed by Council as a part of the 2021/2022 financial year's budget.

In compliance with legislative requirements, a request for these works was prepared and advertised on Tuesday 05 July 2022 to Friday 15 July 2022 in order to seek suitably qualified contractors to complete the works on the Shire's behalf.

The Spencers Brook Road project consists of three main components of work, being:

- 1. Road shoulder reconstruction
- 2. Spray seal/asphalt works
- 3. Line marking

Road shoulder reconstruction has already been awarded by council at a cost of \$851,583.88 ex. GST (RFQ 03/2022).

With a value of work of \$318,926.62 ex GST being recommended for award under this contract, this will leave \$243,181.50 for the line marking component of works. The line marking component being estimated at around \$250,000-\$300,000 to complete.

Section 3.57 of the Local Government Act 1995 requires a local government to invite tenders before it enters into a contract of a prescribed kind under which another person is to supply goods and services.

INTRODUCTION

The provisions for the adoption of a Heritage List under the provisions of the Northam Local Planning Scheme No. 5 are outlined in Schedule 2 of the Flanning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015 known as the Deemed Provisions.

<u>Note:</u> Deemed provisions are those provisions that are automatically incorporated into a local planning scheme.

2. SCHEME PROVISIONS UNDER SHIRE OF NORTHAM LOCAL PLANNING SCHEME NO. 6

The provisions state:

- 8. Heritage list
- (1) The local government must establish and maintain a heritage list to identify places within the Scheme area that are of cultural heritage significance and worthy of built heritage conservation.
- (2) The heritage list
 - (a) must set out a description of each place and the reason for its entry in the heritage list; and
 - (b) must be available, with the Scheme documents, for public inspection during business hours at the offices of the local government; and
 - (c) may be published on the website of the local government.
- (3) The local government must not enter a place in, or remove a place from, the heritage list or modify the entry of a place in the heritage list unless the local government —
 - (a) notifies in writing each owner and occupier of the place and provides each of them with a description of the place and the reasons for the proposed entry;
 - (b) invites each owner and occupier to make submissions on the proposal within 21 days of the day on which the notice is served or within a longer period specified in the notice; and
 - (c) carries out any other consultation the local government considers appropriate;
 and
 - (d) following any consultation and consideration of the submissions made on the proposal, resolves that the place be entered in the heritage list with or without modification, or that the place be removed from the heritage list.
- (4) If the local government enters a place in the heritage list or modifies an entry of a place in the heritage list the local government must give notice of the entry or modification to —
 - (a) the Heritage Council of Western Australia; and
 - (b) each owner and occupier of the place.

Description:

G. J. Coles and Co., Limited (fmr), located at 178 Fitzgerald Street East, is a single storey masonry building with a corrugated steel hip roof displaying characteristics of the Inter-War Functionalist and Art Deco styles of architecture.

The building is located on a corner lot adjacent to the Avon Street Mall and town park area. The building has a rendered masonry parapet with detailed vertical pilasters. A curved cantilevered awning addresses the corner and features a stepped parapet with horizontal detailing and signage that reads 'Northam Travel and Cruise'. The underside of the awing is clad with pressed tin detailing.

The ground floor is largely glazed with a fixed glass and brass framing. The corner has fixed faceted glazing. The glazing rests on a low plinth that is clad with blue ceramic tile. The entrance is through a set of aluminium framed glazed shop front doors addressing Fitzgerald Street East.

The building extends down along Avon Street Mall. The rear of the brick building is painted with a face brick base. The roof is clad with short sheet corrugated steel and features steel roof cowls. The building has been adapted with several large openings extending along the northern façade.

HISTORICAL

Notes:

The following information includes extracts from the heritage assessment of 23-325 & 16-334 Fitzgerald Street and 1-15 & 12-18 Peel Terrace, Northam, prepared by Greenward Consulting, June 2015.

The construction of these premises was announced in 1937 in the following extract from *The West Australian (10 July 1937)*:

Work has begun on the erection of premises to cost £3,130, with an additional £2,400 for shop fronts and counters, for G. J. Coles and Co., Limited, at the corner of Fitzgerald and Avon streets, Northam. The site has a frontage of 43ft. 8in to the main street and a depth of 198ft to Avon-street. Modern display windows of curved glass on the front and for 20 feet down Avon street will be well sheltered from the heat by a 10ft. cantilever verandah with recessed blinds. Black and cream tiles will lead up to entrances of inlaid terrazzo floors and four plate glass doors. The counters are of a good modern design, being finished in walnut plywood and staybrite steel titted with bag pockets, recesses and other tittings, for ease of working. A complete set of wall fittings has been designed in similar material to that of the counters. About £160 will be spent on the electrical work, with electric fans 20ft. apart. The whole of the building will be tire-proofed with special layers of heat-protecting material over the whole of the roof. The architects are Mr. F. G. B. Hawkins, in association with Mr. H. A. Norris, of Melbourne, and the successful contractor is H. Scholield. The shop fronts and counters are being executed by Wunderlich, Ltd., and Arcus, Ltd., respectively.

As of September 2021, the front building is unoccupied while the rear is occupied by the Government of Western Australia Country Health Services.



PHYSICAL EVIDENCE

Description:

Poole Street Bridge is located at the northern end of Poole Street to the west of the Northam town centre. The footbridge crosses the Avon River and is approximately 150m long and 2m wide.

The structure consists of large timber piers supporting a system of timber bearers, joists and planks. The piers have diagonal cross bracing that is connected by large iron bolts. The walkway is enclosed by a rounded steel balustrade with a wire mesh infill. The bridge is in poor condition with several failed bearers to the southern end. Many timber planks have collapsed causing the bridge to be unusable. A Keep Out sign is located at each end.

Commemorative plaques and additional historical information are located at the southern end of the Bridge. The bridge is located along the Dorntj Koorliny 'Walking Together' Track, which is a loop trail around Northam.

The bridge is at the eastern most end of the 70km long multi use 'Kep Track' from Mundaring Weir to Northam. In its inception the Track was designed to continue across the bridge and terminate at the old Northam Railway Station; however, lack of funding has prevented this from happening.

Condition: Poor

HISTORICAL

Notes:

The bridge was associated with the development of the Goldfields Water Supply (G.W.S.) Scheme and is representative of wooden bridges built by the PWD in the early twentieth century. It was built to carry the G.W.S. pipeline and to provide a footbridge for the townspeople of Northam. It was the only major river crossing bridge built for the Goldfields Water Supply Scheme, and is a rare example in Western Australia of a structure designed to be both a pipeline bridge and a footbridge, although it is no longer used for either.

The bridge linked two sides of the river, providing easy access to the Northam Railway Station, West Northam, and the nearby shops, hotel, houses and the railway workshop. In summer, Northam children used the bridge for access to Burlong Pool, and in the 1950s the bridge was well used by the many European migrants who temporarily settled at the Holden Migrant Camp.

The pipeline was shifted in 1958 to a new bridge in Burn Street. As of September 2021, the bridge is not in use and closed off to the public due to poor condition.

- The place is closely associated with the development of the Goldfields Water supply pipeline from Perth to Kalgoorlie in the first decades of the century.
- The place is representative of the construction of the pipeline through Northam
 at a time when the town was experiencing growth to the east, and the
 consolidation of its importance as a major rural centre. It is associated with the
 growth in prosperity of the town and district of Northam.
- The place is valued by the community as a visible reminder of the decades of
 use by the population of West Northam during Northam's period of growth in
 the first quarter of the century, and by many workers and children, including
 migrants stationed at the Holden Camp, in the 1950s.
- The place is a rare structure in Western Australia. It is the only bridge built for the Goldfields Water Supply Scheme at a major river crossing which serves as both pipeline bridge and footbridge.



A report was provided to Council in July 2022 highlighting officer concern at the level of engagement from the committee. It is the officers view this disengagement has been influenced largely by the following factors

- Formal structure of the committee;
- Level of detail provided in committee agendas;
- Increased requirement for complying with standing orders and other local government frameworks, such as declarations of interest; and
- Inability for members to raise general business during the meeting.

Brenda DeAtta did an acknowledgement to country. It was agreed either a welcome or acknowledgment to country should be done at the start of each meeting.

Bilya Koort Boodja operations

17 August 2022



- i. Welcome provided to Cheryl Greenough as the new Centre Manager. Cheryl provided a background on herself to the working group, including her heritage as a Koori woman. All family representatives extended a strong welcome to Cheryl.
- ii. Discussion around opening hours. It was agreed that it would be a positive outcome to have the centre hours of opening put back to 9am to 4pm, acknowledging the staff issues the Centre has experienced.
- iii. Cheryl provided an update on the renewal works which are being undertaken in the BKB exhibition space. The group decided to do a walk through with Cheryl to gain a better understanding of the upgrades and provide some input;
 - The text on the wall at the entry to "Welcome to Country" is too small and needs to be enlarged
 - The quote on the wall by Veronica McGuire is not to be changed.
 - The map on the wall as you exit Welcome to Country is too small and should be enlarged to show the entire Nyoongar Nation.
 - QR codes should be incorporated into the map table to allow more immersive interaction and to provide viewers with coordinates/directions to look at landmarks on country.
 - Allow a drone to take pictures to identify the landscapes shown on the map table and obtain Nyoongar names for the landscapes.
 Jermaine Davis from WNRM may already have suitable photos.
 - The suggested Wargyl trail on the map table should depict a serpent with bright colours.
 - More stories are to be collected from Ballardong people outside of the Northam area so the centre is more inclusive of all Ballardong.
 - Two of the season names are spelt in the Whadjuk spelling, can these be changed to the Ballardong spelling.
 - There will also be a pictorial display of a burning Balga tree.
- iv. There were discussions around the use of the meeting rooms. It was agreed that the meeting rooms should be made available to anyone, however there should be a condition for attendees to receive a welcome to country or be required to make an acknowledgement to country and also go through the BKB interpretive centre. The desire of the group was that anyone using the building should leave more culturally aware.

Matters raised by the Shire of Northam pertaining to aboriginal culture:

i. It was discussed that more family names should be included in the Advisory Group with the possibility of proxies being included in the event one of the families cannot be represented on that day.



Valery and Rod Garlett were to be approached to attend as Kirk Garlett is often not available. Others families to be approached to attend are the Winmar family, Yvonne Kickett can represent the Winmar family and the Yarran family, Michelle or Karren.

- ii. Spoke about the challenge around getting elders and family representatives to attend meeting. There was a feeling that come members were having trouble attending due to work pressures. A suggestion was made that as some of the members work, the Shire may be able to speak to employers and advise how important this meeting is so they will allow the family member to attend.
- iii. Discussion around getting a list of people who can do welcome to country and didgeridoo playing etc. The group are to advise the names of people who can provide various services such as Welcome to Country and Didgeridoo playing to the BKB manager to ensure bookings can be fulfilled.
- iv. Discussion around the opportunity to share cultural sites with other members of the community. Once such site is the birthing site on Katrine Road. Was agreed that places such as the birthing site could be used as tourist opportunities however we needed to be careful with cultural sensitivities for example the Birthing Site is a place for women's business and as such men are not able to attend. This being the case it may be an opportunity to do organised tours of the site at regular interval under the guidance of a local female elder.
- v. Discussions were held about the Aboriginal Reserve and the CEO advised the Shire is working with the Aboriginal Lands Trust to resolve the issue. The attendees at the meeting indicated there desire to not have people staying at the site as it is currently a place which can not be accessed or shared by the entire community as it once was. There was support for the Shire to continue to work to address the issues currently being experienced.
- vi. Co-naming of sites. It was agreed this was a strong desire of the committee. The first name to be agreed was for the Avon River. More information will be provided to the next meeting where a name will be agreed and recommended to Council for adoption.

Matters raised by working group:

Payments for Elders attending Advisory Group meetings was an issue raised. It was agreed that this would be put on as a dot point item for the next meeting

(Latest update post meeting) The plan for the Lullabies project participants could perform as part of the Bilya Festival cannot go ahead as key facilitators are not available on that date however a display and some of their songs will be played on CD at the VIP function.



Committee update from CEO Jason Whiteaker:


 Council has disbanded the formal committee. This allows the meeting structure to be more informal. The outcomes of the advisory group meetings will still be reported to Council.

The Group observed 1 minutes silence for Sorry Time.







Appointment of Centre Manager:

 New manager Cheryl Greenough introduced herself as a proud Koori woman from the New South Wales South Coast. She has been living in the Northam area for the past 30 years and has worked at the Shire in a governance role for the past 7 years. She is really excited to be learning about culture through the role.

BKB opening hours:

- Kathy Davis requested the opening hours go back to being 9am 4pm. The group agreed.
- Cheryl has been helping on weekends and will do as necessary.
- Kathy Davis said we need to work as a community to make this place work.
- ACTION: Kathy Davis is available to work Sundays and Liz Stack said she will be available for weekends in the summertime.

Bilya Festival (Avon Descent):

- VIP function to be held at the BKB on 12 August. Cyndy Moody and the Northam Nyoongar Lullabies will be performing.
- A Welcome to Country will be performed at the start of the street parade.
- A large Wargal street puppet is being built and decorated by Kirk Garlett. Daniel Garlett will play the didgeridoo and his dancers will lead the Wargal which will meander through the street.
- A Blessing of the River will be performed before the race.
- ACTION: Jaime Hawkins to find out who is doing the Blessing of the River and inform Kathy Davis. RESPONSE: Daniel Garlett has been organised. Kathy informed.
- Kathy suggested that it should be Liz Stack or Shirley Slater. Liz Stack said Pat Davis should be asked first, as she was the Elder to start the tradition.

Changes to the exhibition:

- Group agreed the text on the wall as you enter the exhibition is too small.
- The quote from Veronica McGuire cannot be changed.
- The map of Nyoongar Country is too small. The map should be enlarged and show the entire Nyoongar Nation.
- QR codes to be incorporated into the map table to allow more immersive interaction.
- Take drone pictures to identify the landscapes on the map table and obtain the Nyoongar names for them. ACTION: Talk to Jermaine Davis at Wheatbelt NRM, as they have photos and videos already collected.
- ACTION: The Wargal trail on the map table to be depicted as a serpent with bright colours.





- More stories are to be collected from Ballardong people outside of Northam, so the centre is more inclusive of all Ballardong.
- Liz Stack asked if the seasons could be changed as some of the panels contain Whadjuk spelling instead of Ballardong. ACTION: Cheryl to investigate.
- There is to be a representation of a burning balga stem. ACTION: Cheryl to clarify where this will be positioned.
- Shirley Slater shared how they would light the balga stem to make fire.

Items for Council

Family representation on the NCAG:

- Winmar and Yarran families should be also represented. Yvonne Kickett can represent the Winmar family. ACTION: Karren and Michelle should be approached to represent the Yarran families.
- ACTION: Valerie and Rod Garlett to be approached to attend meetings. Kirk Garlett
 currently represents the Garlett family however, struggles to attend meetings and
 already contributes a lot to the community.
- Under the Committee of Council structure only one person could represent each family, under the new structure we can have more representatives.
- Donna Moody suggested that not everyone is able to get released from work to attend, so the Shire could speak to those employers to ask if they could release them for the meetings.

ACTION: Group to advise Cheryl if there are any others.

For the playing of the didgeridoo:

Re Fenced Dog Exercise Area in Northam

To whom it may concern,

I am writing in support of a fully fenced dog exercise area within the Shire of Northam. Off-leash dog parks such as Bert Hawke Oval have many benefits for dogs and their owners. They provide the opportunity for dogs to exercise, socialise with other dogs, enjoy the fresh air, practice training techniques, play games and generally race around and burn off energy.

These activities are important for physical health because they prevent problems such as obesity and joint disfunction. They also provide essential mental stimulation and prevent the development of problem behaviours such as destructiveness or excessive barking.

For owners, it's fun to meet other owners, swap tips and even make new friends.

Despite their growing popularity, off-leash dog parks are not however suitable for all dogs. To ensure that owners, their dogs and others can safely enjoy the experience of an off-leash park, there are several important considerations to keep in mind.

Off-leash parks are public areas that are not supervised by trained staff in a controlled environment. There is no screening process to determine which dogs (or owners) may visit. This means the safety of both people and dogs depends on owners being responsible and adhering to good dog park etiquette.

It is highly inadvisable to take a dog to an off-leash park until they have undergone basic training, such as the training offered at puppy preschools, followed by more advanced training. Owners need to be confident that their dog will reliably come to them when called (the 'recall' command). If owners feel unable to keep their dog under control, he or she is not ready for an off-leash park. As an alternative, dogs may benefit from a fenced off area with small, medium and large areas within an off-leash park where they can safely run off leash.

Owners also need to be confident that their dog will relate to other dogs without becoming fearful or aggressive. Dog parks such as Bert Hawke Oval or Henry Street Oval are highly arousing to all dogs due to the physical environment and the presence of other dogs. The stimulation of sudden contact with unfamiliar dogs of varying breeds, sizes and temperaments can be overwhelming for nervous dogs, especially where there is no easy escape from the situation. Dogs have four options available to them flight, fight, freeze or submit. Being on leash reduces their options and often exacerbates the problem. Being off leash increases the owners anxiety which the dog mirrors.

If the dog has not learned to socialise with other dogs, the interactions in an off-leash park, such as being approached by a group, or exposed to rough and tumble play,

mounting, sniffing, chasing and barking, can be perceived as threats rather than sources of enjoyment. Unknown humans approaching can also be over stimulating. Another risk is that the dog may fail to read warning cues from other dogs to 'back off', which can lead to being bitten. A negative experience in an off-leash park has the potential to reinforce behaviour problems, especially for dogs who are not well socialised or have had traumatic experiences.

For these reasons, I support a fully fenced dog exercise area with double gates and a small, medium and large dog area. This way, dogs can have a slow and gentle initial meeting with others through double gates and the opportunity to interact with dogs of a similar size as opposed to a free for all.

Signage would be beneficial asking owners not to enter if their dog is:

- Unvaccinated
- Not wormed
- Unwell
- Not Desexed

It is important owners collect their dogs waste to prevent spread of disease. It is also important to include adequate shade and water to reduce risk of heat stroke, particularly to flat faced breeds. I would also encourage seating areas for owners, so they can relax and demonstrate calm energy as dogs mirror our energy.

Although I couldn't find any current regulation of off-leash dog parks, The Dog and Cat Management Board of South Australia has developed a resource to assist local governments to design and manage these effectively and safely. This resource has suggestions for good planning that may assist you in your choice of fenced off-leash area, including: the provision of different activity zones (to allow both high running areas and quieter areas for one-on-one play between dogs or interactions with owners), secure fencing, multiple entry and exit points to prevent dogs converging at once, adequate water and shade, signage with rules for owners to observe, and dog equipment for enrichment and practising natural skills (such as tyres, tunnels, jumps).

I have trained over 280 dogs in the Wheatbelt to date. By far, the leading trend with dogs exhibiting unwanted behaviour has been a lack of socialisation with people and/or dogs and or lack of physical and/or mental stimulation (particularly working breeds like Kelpies.)

The main reasons people report the absence of these activities, is having no confidence in recall and a fear of other dogs approaching without careful introduction first. And sadly, being time poor to walk around the streets.

Unlike many other trainers I do not offer "lessons" in the park to my clients. Teaching a dog tricks such as jumping through hoops or shaking hands is of little benefit in my opinion. This approach will not stop the dog from barking at home for instance. I am a Behaviorist first and foremost and help owners get the bottom of WHY their dog is exhibiting unwanted behaviors. Very often this has to do with the role the dog is playing and once the owner can communicate to the dog that they can switch off and relax everything changes.



It is helpful though when a dog exhibits fear aggression to people and/or dogs or is timid to the point of stress, to take them NEAR a fenced dog area. Not into, but nearby where the dog can desensitise at a comfortable distance without unsolicited interaction. The owner can then slowly work on reducing reactivity, finish on a high and quit whilst their ahead. Eventually the dog can enter and interact. This has been the case in Merredin and York where fenced off areas have been established.

I hope that this proposal will be considered and am happy to be contacted any time.
