As defined in section 5.60B of the Local Government Act 1995, a person has a **proximity interest** in a matter if the matter concerns a proposed change to a planning scheme affecting land that adjoins the person's land; or a proposed change to the zoning or use of land that adjoins the person's land; or a proposed development (as defined in section 5.63(5)) of land that adjoins the person's land.

As defined in 34C of the Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996, an **impartiality interest** means an interest that could, or could reasonably be perceived to, adversely affect the impartiality of the person having the interest and includes an interest arising from kinship, friendship or membership of an association.

A. BACKGROUND / DETAILS

The draft 2020/21 budget has been provided as a separate attachment to this agenda and has been compiled based on the parameters established in the Council integrated planning documents including: the long term financial plan; the corporate business plan; and the strategic community plan.

Council considered the detail within the budget via a series of workshops and a budget meeting held on June 17, 2020. At this meeting Council endorsed a draft budget and requested the Chief Executive Officer to give local public notice of the differential rating requirements required to fund the budget, based on no increase to the rates in dollar or Council fees and charges over the 2019/20 financial year.

The proposed differential rates have subsequently been published on Councils Website as per the amended statutory requirement 6.36 of the Local Government Act 1995.

C. OFFICER'S COMMENT

The budget has been prepared to include information required by the Local Government Act 1995, Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996 and Australian Accounting Standards. The main features of the draft budget include:

Rate Increase

Council adopted no increase to rates in the Dollar over the 2019/20 financial year at the 17 June 2020 Ordinary Council Meeting, in addition Council adopted to write off \$45,060.45 of rates associated properties that had increases due the annual yearly UV revaluation.

Rubbish and Recycling Fees

Council adopted no increase to fees and charges over the 2019/20 financial year at the 17 June 2020 Ordinary Council Meeting.

The result of the final surplus calculations are that Council has an end of year untied surplus of \$442,980. The larger-than-usual surplus was generated due to the transfer of funds to the Leave Liability Reserve – the Leave Liability Reserve offsets the Leave provision and is included in the surplus calculation whereas other reserve accounts are not. It has been used to decrease budgeted debt and includes an additional transfer of \$230,510 from leave Liability Reserve as of the 30 June 2020, after which the Leave Provision will be fully cash-backed. Part of the untied surplus has been allocated to utilities for the Northam Aquatic Facility (\$30,000) and an allocation for solar installation at the Facility (\$96,000) which is expected to reduce utility expenditure by \$20,000 per annum. Reserve transfers have also been carried out for surplus funds from the Waste operations \$150,000 and Killara Adult Day Care \$250,000, in accordance with normal practice.

Minor adjustments resulting from the Draft Budget Adoption on 17 June 2020 have been carried out – these affect both the surplus and the budget as presented. In addition, grant funding was received from DFES for various projects. Minor adjustments have also been included and are presented in the table below. The amendments have no impact on the budget.

Annual fees and reimbursement of costs

The recommendations include the setting of annual sitting fees and allowances for members. This includes the President's allowance of \$45,000, the Deputy President's allowance of \$11,250, and members' annual sitting fees of \$19,750 and \$23,600 for the President. A \$3,500 allowance is included for each member to provide for costs associated with information and communication technology expenses incurred by members in carrying out their functions on behalf of the Shire. Other claims such as travel will need to be submitted quarterly or more frequently should a member so require. All payments may be made direct to members' designated bank accounts. These fees and allowances are in accordance with Sec 5.98, 5.98A, 5.99 and 5.99A of the Local Government Act and the Local Government (Administration) Regulations.

These fees are within the determinations for Band 2 as set by the Salaries and Allowances Tribunal 8 April 2020. These annual fees & allowances remain unchanged from the 2019/20 financial year. Please follow the link for review

Insurance Bridges

An evaluation has been carried out on Councils Insurance coverage, with the Councils Bridge assets becoming a focus. Insurance costs for bridges in 2019/20 was approximately \$110,000. Staff have assessed the bridges taking into consideration risks associated with floods, bushfires, arson, location and construction material. Staff have spoken to a number of local governments - approximately 50% of local governments insure their bridges while the other and 50% don't insure, of the local governments approached. Staff have also spoken with Mainroads who also do not insure bridges but in contrast recommend that local governments insure their bridges.

The table presented below represents Shire bridges that have been assessed as low risk. It is recommended that these bridges are not insured for the 2020/21 financial year to the value of \$38,751 – see Full Evaluation Attachment 1.
