The Decade that was: 2007 to 2017:

It has been 10 years since a Council was elected to the Shire following the merger of the Town of Northam and Shire of Northam Local Government Authorities in 2007 so I thought it opportune to place on the record my take on the past 10 years.



1. Preamble:

The two LGA's merged on 1st July 2007, with Commissioner Mr Gavin Troy representing the Council, previous Town CEO, Mr Bruce Meade and the CEO of the new LGA. Previous Shire CEO, Mr Alan Middleton had agreed to exit his role following the merger. In October, 2007 previous town Mayor Ray Head and Shire President Bert Llewellyn had both been elected to the new Council along with eight others including four inexperienced newcomers.

At the first Council meeting, I was elected as President and Laurie Glass was elected as Deputy President. We could not have had a greener Council leadership team as neither Laurie nor I had had any previous Local Government Councillor experience.

Very early on, the new Council dealt with an agenda item involving bringing a relocated asbestos clad house in to the Shire (town) with a relaxation of "setbacks" and some other mandatory compliance matters, which Officers recommended dealing with as a retrospective approval. I now know that this is not an uncommon approach but as a new Council we rejected the recommendation, denied approval and sent a message to everyone that this was not the way we expected development to occur. We had rules in place and expected everyone to understand and comply with them.

I spent a few sleepless nights that month pondering how a small property developer with limited financial resources was affected by this decision and I still try and put myself in the shoes of a proponent to appreciate their side of the story when I deliberate on matters before Council.

- 2. As President, I have presided over a number of demolitions/decommissioning of assets, mainly in the town of Northam, including:
 - The old Recreation Centre and rodeo grounds replaced with a new Recreation Centre:
 - The netball clubrooms and playing court area on Clarke Street currently abandoned;
 - The lawn tennis club facility and courts in Clarke Street currently our skate park;
 - The old basketball outdoor courts soon to be a car parking area;
 - The May Street tennis courts replaced with Killara Respite Care facility extensions;
 - The Tattersall's/Fitzgerald's Hotel currently green space;
 - Withnells Garage facilities on Fitzgerald Street following the 2011 severe storm;
 - Brake and Clutch Services building currently the new Nissan site;
 - Main Roads facility replaced with a new facility;



- The old Doctor's rooms/house in Wellington Street probably heritage considerations;
- The old hospital currently under development as a new shopping centre;
- Victoria oval currently vacant;
- Railways/Federals Football Clubs change/club rooms on Jubilee Oval; and
- Old Caltex Service Station site/Brabazon House on Fitzgerald Street currently a mostly undeveloped public parking space.

3. New land developments have included:

- Mauravillo Estate in Wundowie;
- Federal Detention Centre on Mitchell Avenue;



7.2 PRESENTATIONS

<u>Lindsay Broadhurst and Paul Fourie - Main Roads WA</u>

A presentation was made by the above in relation to the proposed Orange Route, this has been provided as Attachment 1.

Clarification was sought in relation to the following:

- The main purpose was for the Orange Route. It was advised that this is
 to provide a safe dual use for heavy vehicles and the general public
 and has been designed to allow RAV 7 vehicles to continue into the
 metropolitan area.
- Whether community consultation had been undertaken and whether Main Roads would have any issues with the Shire advising business owners that may be impacted. It was advised that it is believed to be

preliminary at this stage, however as it has been an ongoing project it is not a 'secret'. It was advised that there would be no concerns with the Shire advising business owners of the proposal.

- Whether the route can continue from Clackline to Northam. It was advised that this has been reviewed and it is the intent to provide dual carriage way from Clackline to Northam to accompany the works proposed for the Orange Route.
- Whether it would be more effective to combine with the existing Great Eastern Highway at the portion where this meets. It was advised that the Great Eastern Highway has several property access points which is something being avoided as it poses safety and traffic issues, in addition, when the assessments are undertaken it identifies that it is more effective to construct a new road as opposed to undertaking work on the existing road. It was advised that there are also safety issues associated with the existing highway as there is several property access points.
- It was queried what is being done about the portion of Great Eastern Highway from the Lakes to Northam as this is a blackspot and significant risk being responsible for many lives. It was raised that the Orange Route plan has been on the 'backburner' for some time with no clear understanding of when it will be initiated. It was advised that Main Roads proposes to prepare a development strategy in order to identify the priorities and what should be undertaken first. This strategy will be put forward to Infrastructure Australia/federal government. There is currently no budget to undertake these upgrade works or the Orange Route.
- Clarification was sought in relation to the demand as it was believed
 that rail transport is a primary method for transport. It was advised that
 the primary use for the Orange Route is to accommodate for road
 transport which there is a demand for, in particular across the state,
 where rail transport may be more utilised for across the country.
- It was queried whether an economic impact assessment would be undertaken to 'sell' the Orange Route to the federal government. It was advised that this would form part of their assessment for the development strategy as previously discussed.



Planning History

- 1970 Investigations commence to determine the most desirable route for the Mundaring to Northam section of the proposed Perth to Adelaide National Highway (PANH)
- 1973 The Eastern Corridor endorsed as one of Perth's four development corridors by the State Government and Planning Review of Mundaring to Northam section of PANH commences
- 1985 Eastern Corridor Major Road Study (ECMRS) commissioned by State Planning Commission, Main Roads Department, Shire of Mundaring and Shire of Swan.
- **1988** Western Australian State and Local Governments adopt the ECMRS recommendations relating to GEH and the Orange Route
- 1994 Perth to Wooroloo section of the Orange Route gazetted in the MRS



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Planning History (cont.)

1995 PANH Strategy Study; Midland to Clackline; Final Report completed recommending that Orange Route is preferred over GEH.

2007 Perth-Adelaide Corridor Strategy - List of short-term and long-term priorities for the corridor. Orange Route proposal should be reconsidered.

2015 Main Roads initiated Network Assessment for PANH which has reviewed standards, connectivity and included preparation of Concept Design.



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Key Objectives

Objective 1: To extend the RAV 7 (36.5 m Double Road Train vehicles) network into the Metro area

Objective 2: Create a more efficient route with fewer conflicts

Objective 3: Provide a connection of the Orange Route to Roe Highway, and beyond to NorthLink and the future upgrade of Reid Hwy

Objective 4: Improve road safety by removal of heavy vehicles through the residential areas of Mundaring, Sawyer's Valley and Baker's Hill town sites

Objective 5: Deliver a high standard entry to the greater Perth area at the western end of the National Highway, connecting both sides of Australia

Key Assumptions

- Scope The adopted alignment from previous planning studies will be assumed unless a fatal flaw is identified or better solution is worth further investigation. Intersection type and location may be adjusted to accommodate current planning and demands
- Function The route will provide a Safe and Efficient RAV 7 Freight Route
- Form Dual divided carriageway Roe Hwy to east of Gidgegannup (Toodyay Rd intersection) as Control of Access, freeway standard, and then as a rural highway east of Toodyay Road.



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Key Assumptions (cont.)

- Connectivity Grade separation Roe Hwy to east of Gidgegannup (Toodyay Rd intersection), then at grade intersections, with priority control and control of access, and consideration of safety improvements where possible.
- Land use assumptions 2031 Metropolitan Land Use Forecast (MLUFs) projections with consideration of 3.5m Framework (2051).
- Constraints / Environmental Impacts Environmental Desktop Study has been completed. No significant constraints with regards to infrastructure, social, environmental or engineering identified at this stage, that couldn't be addressed.



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




Western Section (MRS) Connections – Existing Planning




Western Section (MRS) Connections – Proposed



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
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
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Eastern Section (Wundowie to Clackline)



12.1 CEO'S Office

12.1.1 Special Council Meeting – October 2017

- The President advised that he will be attending a Graduation Ceremony at Northam Senior High School at 6:30pm on this date, representing the Shire. There were discussions held around whether establishing the Committees could be dealt with at a different meeting to ensure that the meeting would conclude by 6:30pm, the CEO confirmed that this is possible.
- It was advised that this date is being recommended due the possibility
 of the CEO attending a conference in Melbourne on that week.
 Discussion was held around the Declaration to Office and how this has
 historically been undertaken by the CEO, it was noted that this can
 also be undertaken by a Justice of the Peace.

12.2 ENGINEERING SERVICES

12.2.1 Purchase of New Grader

- Clarification was sought in relation to trading the grader as opposed to auctioning. The Executive Manager Engineering Services advised that the supplier was not interested in trading the vehicle.
- Clarification was sought around the proposed price for the vehicle to be sold. The Executive Manager Engineering Services advised that Officers have had discussions with the Auctioneer and this is believed to be a fair price.
- It was queried whether a reserve price would be set. The Executive Manager Engineering Services advised that this would occur.

- Clarification was sought in relation to an aerial location plan. The

- Discussion was held around the track near Martin Road and how this is used as a designated road however is unnamed/an easement.

 typographical error. This has now been corrected in the Ordinary
 Council meeting agenda accordingly.
- Clarification was sought in relation to 2.2(1) k, creating a nuisance on a
 public thoroughfare without a permit, it was queried whether a
 'nuisance' can be created with a permit. The Coordinator Governance
 / Administration advised that this would include buskers.
- Clarification was sought in relation to the error made for this process. The
 Coordinator Governance / Administration advised that the matter was
 not brought back to Council to close off the review when this was
 required in order to initiate the process to amend/make the local law.
- Clarification was sought in relation to when the Standing Orders Local
 Law will be presented to Council. The Chief Executive Officer advised
 that is currently being delayed until the conclusion of the Local
 Government Elections where this will then be workshopped with Council
 prior to presenting for endorsement.

12.4.4 Proposed Extractive Industries Amendment Local Law 2017

Clarification was sought in relation to 6.4, Blasting Penalty within Attachment 1. The Executive Manager Corporate Services advised that this is a typographical error and is correct in the existing Local Law. Council's Manager Recreation Services has confirmed that Northam PCYC have booked Meeting Room 3 (MR3) at the Recreation Centre from 9th October to 15th December 2017, 8.30am to 5.00 pm and Lesser Hall from 9th October to 22nd December 2017, Weekdays from 8.30am to 8.00pm.

The cost associated with these bookings is \$12,600 (60 days of MR3 at \$210.00 per day) plus \$3,850 (55 days of Lesser hall at \$70.00 per day) to give a total of \$16,450.

Officers have received verbal advice in regards to the PCYC fees available for hiring facilities. BRIEF

Council is requested to consider an application for development approval for an over height outbuilding and a relocated building envelope at Lot 407 Brushtail Brow, Bakers Hill.

The application is being referred to Council as the proposed outbuilding exceed the maximum permissible wall and ridge height provisions of Local Planning Policy No. 24 – Outbuildings in the Rural Residential, Rural Smallholding and Rural Zones.

It is recommended Council approve the development application, subject to conditions.

BACKGROUND / DETAILS



Lot 407 Brushtail Brow, Bakers Hill (the site) is zoned 'Rural Residential' and is 2.21ha in area. The site is located in a cul-de-sac. Refer Attachment 1 – Location Plan.

Officers issued delegated development approval for a single house on the property on 7 March 2017.

Proposal:

The proposed outbuilding is 10m X 18m (180m²). The proposed structure also includes a 6m X 10m (60m²) lean-to structure.

The owner proposes to construct the outbuilding to a wall height of 6m (4m permitted by LPP24) and a roof ridge height of 6.58m (5m permitted by LPP24).

The proposed outbuilding is to be clad in Colorbond® and is to be located behind the single dwelling on the lot. The applicant has made a detailed report for Councils consideration as to the request to vary site requirements from Local Planning Policy No.24. Refer Attachment 3 – Letter of Justification.

The applicant advises that the additional height is required to house large work vehicles, including a tipper and machinery within a contained environment to keep the property neat and tidy. The landowner advises that he drives and maintains a large tipper truck which requires regular maintenance with the tipper body in the 'tipped' position to allow access to parts – hence the requirement for the additional height. The landowner further advises that he needs to be able to perform these duties in all weather conditions. The owner also advises that the outbuilding will also be used to store household equipment, tools, a ride-on lawnmower and a tractor.

It is important to note that the parking of commercial vehicles is permitted on land zoned rural residential where the lot size is 1 hectare or larger.

CONSIDERATIONS

Financial / Resource Implications

There are no financial or budgetary implications for the Shire in relation to the recommendations of this report.

Legislative Compliance



Lot 407 Brushtail Brow, Bakers Hill is zoned 'Rural Residential'. It has a legal area of 2.2122 hectares.

The Local Planning Scheme No 6 requires development approval to be issued for the keeping of a commercial vehicle within the "Rural Zone" if the property is less than 1 hectare. It also stipulates a number or requirements for that approval as per below –

The parking and repair of commercial vehicles on any Residential or Rural Residential zoned lot of 1 hectare or less shall be in accordance with the following requirements:

- (a) the lot on which the vehicle is parked contains only a single house (including any associated outbuilding) provided that the local government may permit the parking of such vehicle on a lot which contains grouped dwellings if it is of the opinion that this will not adversely affect the amenity of the grouped dwelling development or the surrounding area;
- (b) the vehicle is used by an occupant that is lawfully occupying the dwelling on the lot;
- (c) the vehicle is parked entirely on the subject lot within a garage or is located on a hard stand area, sited and partially screened so as to reasonably minimise the visual effect as viewed from the road reserve or from a neighbouring property to the satisfaction of the local government;
- (d) the vehicle does not exceed 3.6 metres in height (including any load), 2.5 metres in width and 8 metres in length;
- (e) the vehicle is not started or manoeuvred on-site between the hours of 10.00pm and 6.00am the following day without the prior approval of the local government;
- (f) whilst on the lot, the vehicle's motor is not left running when the vehicle is unattended or in any event for any period in excess of five (5) minutes;
- (g) the vehicle, whilst on the lot, is not loaded with goods or materials that may cause nuisance, risk or pollution to the detriment of the amenity of the area or nearby residents;
- (h) the vehicle is not carrying a refrigeration unit which is operating on a continuous or intermittent basis:
- (i) whilst on the lot, there is no transfer of goods or passengers from one vehicle to another vehicle, loading and unloading of the vehicle, or storage of goods associated with the use of the vehicle;



- (j) the vehicle is not used or operated as a tow truck or other emergency vehicle between the hours of 10.00pm to 6.00am in a manner that adversely affects the residential amenity of the area; and
- (k) only minor servicing, including minor mechanical repairs and adjustments, and/or cleaning that generates easily contained liquid waste is carried out on the lot. All cleaning and servicing shall be screened from any nearby road reserve/s and the disposal of waste products shall be to the satisfaction of the local government.

It is assumed that on lots within the zone that are over 1 hectare they are required to comply with those provision although a development approval is not specifically required.

Policy Implications

Shire of Northam Local Planning Policy No.24 – Outbuilding in the Rural Residential, Rural Smallholding and Rural Zones (LPP24) applies to this development proposal.

The proposed outbuilding was assessed against the provisions of Clause 5 (Development Guidelines) and found to be inconsistent with the provisions of Clause 5.2 – Wall Height and Ridge Height.

The proposed shed proposes a 6m wall height and a 6.58m ridge height, therefore exceeding the wall height and ridge height provisions of LPP24.

Note: Clause 4.3.2 of LPP24 establishes that, for the purposes of calculating total floor area of an outbuilding, a lean-to is deemed to form part of the overall floor area only if it is enclosed on two (2) or more sides (including the shared wall with the existing or proposed outbuilding). Therefore, because the proposed lean-to structure is open on 3 sides, it is excluded from the total floor area.



Inconsistency with a provision of LPP24, in and of itself, however, is not reason to refuse the application. Instead the application must be assessed against the relevant objectives of LPP24, which state as follows:

- Recognise the unique characteristics of rural residential development within the Shire as it relates to outbuilding size and construction;
- Provide Acceptable Development standards for outbuildings in rural residential areas; and
- Ensure that constructed outbuildings are not utilised for unapproved purposes.

Stakeholder Engagement / Consultation

Consultation was undertaken with the adjoining landowners. No objections were received.

Risk Implications

There are no risk implications for the Shire in relation to the recommendations of this report.

OFFICER'S COMMENT

As Lot 407 Brushtail Brow is located in a cul-de-sac, and the oversized outbuilding is situated behind the dwelling, visibility of the structure will be limited.

It is considered that the outbuilding has been positioned so as to be as unobtrusive as possible when viewed from the street or the respective adjoining properties. The proposed outbuilding will be located within the designated building envelope and Officers consider that the existing vegetation will largely screen the structure from view of Brushtail Brow.

The building envelope relocation (Attachment 4) is consistent with the general setback provisions of Local Planning Scheme No 6 and will locate the shed further away from other building envelopes within the subdivision.

The applicant has advised colours in-keeping with the native vegetation are also to be utilised to further screen the development.

Given the nature of proposed uses within the outbuilding, the development would be considered appropriate and not subject to setting further precedent approvals for similar structures given the specific nature of the proponent's requirements.

It is therefore recommended that Council grant approval subject to conditions as outlined in the Officer's recommendation.










RE:PROPOSED OUTBUILDING LOT 407 BRUSHTAIL BROW, BAKERS HILL

I provide the following justification in support of the proposed outbuilding exceeding the maximum floor area and height requirements permitted for an outbuilding within the Rural Residential Zone

- Firstly we have positioned the outbuilding along with the proposed new single house entirely within the designated 2000m² building envelope.
- Also, our house plans have been approved and we currently have a signed building contract, expecting build to start by June 2017.
- In addition we have positioned the outbuilding so as to be as unobtrusive as possible when viewed from the street or the respective adjoining properties. The shed will be located in the north-western corner of the lot still maintaining 16 metre minimum setbacks to these respective lot boundaries. The existing vegetation will largely screen the shed from view from Brushtail brow which is the street access to our lot. Our lot borders the state forest on one side, our southern neighbours are on the other side of the crest of the hill and the northern property is downhill from our property. Lots 412 and 413 Wovlie Rise located to the south of our lot will have no visibility of the shed given the extensive vegetation between these lots and our lot and the elevation difference. Likewise the shed will not be visible from the adjoining lot to the east at Lot 413 Brushtail Brow with extensive vegetation between the two lots. Lot 406 Brushtail Brow is situated to the north of the subject lot but is separated by a services easement and given the large northern setback proposed it is considered that the outbuilding will have no negative amenity impact on this property. The western property in the street, as you can see are completely treed and have no occupants (Please see nearmaps photo image below).
- The large outbuilding size and floor area is required so as to house large work vehicles including a tipper and machinery within a contained environment so as to keep the property neat and tidy. Due to the nature of my work I drive and maintain a large tipper truck which requires regular maintenance with the tipper body in the 'tipped' position to allow access to parts. I need to be able to perform these duties in all weather conditions. The outbuilding will also be utilised to store any household equipment that would normally be kept in a shed normal tools such as lathe, mill, drill press, work benches, ride on lawnmower, tractor etc. The shed serves the purpose of maintaining an orderly environment within the designated building envelope and keeping a clean presentable property.



- Whilst the outbuilding is larger than the acceptable policy provisions, given the
 extensive vegetation surrounding the lot, the outbuilding will have no negative amenity
 impact (building bulk or privacy) on any adjoining property.
- The shed will also be built out of the colourbond 'green' so as to blend as much as
 possible and have little to no, aesthetic downfall for the area.

Department Child Protection

It was outlined that there was positive feedback provided from the evacuation centre exercise. The first 30 minutes of opening the centre was 'chaos' however this settled further into the exercise. It was also advised that members from other organisations such as Council's CESM and WA Police representatives also attended.

Northam Hospital

It was outlined that the building works are underway. There are a number of issues occurring such as the builders setting off the fire alarms and also staff cars being broken into whilst parked near the Bowling Club.

5.2.1 Risk Project

The committee will be asked to select their top 5 hazards for the Shire of Northam. We would like as many members for discussion and selection of the top hazards. Below is the list of possible hazards.

These risks will then be discussed in future workshops and treatments developed

DISCUSSION

Mr Hendriksen advised that the Northam District Operations Advisory Committee (DOAC) outlined the top five as fire (bushfire and structural), flood, storm, earthquake and rail crash.

Discussion was held around what were believed to be the high risk hazards.





The members present generally agreed that there is a clear four hazards being fire (bushfire and structural), flood, storm and earthquake.

There was discussion held around the fifth hazard with consideration being given to animal and plant biosecurity and human epidemic as higher priorities however there was discussion held around terrorism and the HAZMAT items.

The committee members present generally agreed that animal and plant biosecurity was believed to be a higher risk as it would have greater impacts and more likely to occur in the local government area.







PROPOSED REVOCATION OF WESTPLAN DAMBREAK

I write to advise you of the State Emergency Management Committee's (SEMC) intention to revoke Westplan Dambreak. As your organisation has a role or responsibility within Westplan Dambreak (see attachment 1), and in accordance with State Emergency Management (EM) procedures, I seek your endorsement for this revocation to proceed.

By way of background, prior to the introduction of the *Emergency Management Act* (the EM Act) in 2005, emergency management in Western Australia (WA) was guided by 'Policy Statement No. 7", which had no legislative basis. Westplan Dambreak was established under this policy statement, and responsibility for the management of dambreak was assigned to the Water Corporation. This arrangement was only in respect to public dams managed by the Water Corporation, and there were (and are) no specific arrangements in place for non-public dams within the State.

Following the introduction of the EM Act, hazards identified as posing a significant risk to the State were defined as a "hazard" and a Hazard Management Agency (HMA) was prescribed by regulations for emergency management for that hazard. As the Water Corporation designs, constructs and manages its dams in accordance with nationally accepted best practice in dam safety management⁹⁷, they did not support the inclusion of dambreak as a hazard or the organisation being prescribed as an HMA in EM legislation. As such, Westplan Dambreak exists as a narrowly focused legacy document outside the current EM legislative and planning framework.

State EM Preparedness Procedure 3 — Revocation of an EM Plan, including Hazard Specific Plans (Westplans) requires endorsement from relevant stakeholders such as yourself, and that a risk assessment and gap analysis be undertaken prior to a revocation report being submitted to SEMC for approval.

In 2015, the SEMC undertook an assessment of dambreak to ascertain the risk to the State. Six credible dambreak scenarios were used to undertake the risk assessment. These were divided into two groups, namely 'regulated' (self-regulated), such as public and tailing dams aligning with the ANCOLD Guidelines and 'non-regulated', for example private dams.

The resultant report, available on the Office of Emergency Management (OEM) website, assessed that there are no 'intolerable' or 'extreme' risks related to dambreak at a State level. This report informed the SEMC's position that there is no longer a need for Westplan Dambreak. The report did, however, identify 'opportunities for improvement', particularly in relation to the management of dam safety in WA and the management of private and 'gully' dams at the local and district levels. Because Westplan Dambreak is not considered a suitable mechanism to address these concerns, the Department of Water convened a 'Dam Safety: Officers Working Group' to consider these improvement opportunities.

In summary, I seek your endorsement to revoke Westplan Dambreak, and would appreciate a written response detailing the reasons for your support or otherwise for inclusion in the revocation report. 6. GENERAL BUSINESS

6.1 Flood Warning Levels

Mr Hendriksen advised that he attended a recent meeting with key stakeholders to discuss the flood warning levels for the Avon and Mortlock rivers as a result of the February 2017 flood event.

Maps of the flood levels were shown to the committee members present which outlined.

The Avon River at the weir river monitor station

- Minor flood level reset to (1m),
- Moderate flood level reset to (2m)
- Major flood level reset to (2.3m)

The Mortlock River at ODriscoll's monitor station

- Minor flood level reset to (2.5m),
- Moderate flood level reset to (3m)
- Major flood level reset to (3.5m)

Discussion was held around how the levels/measurements were established (e.g. whether it was from the ground level, normal water level etc.) in addition to how the markers were set. Mr Hendriksen advised the committee that the markers/levels are set by using objects such as bridges (e.g. major flood level would result in the Seabrook Bridge being under water). It was stated that significant progress has been made around this area as there were previously no levels set.

Discussion was held around the warning and notification process. Mr Hendriksen outlined that this is undertaken through the DFES Emergency Announcement on their website.

Concerns were raised in relation to this work only covering a portion of the Shire and not extending to other areas such as Spencers Brook and Bakers Hill. In addition, there were concerns that the levels set may be 'underselling' the actual water level of the flood.

6.2 Rural Urban Interface (RUI) exercise

Mr Hendriksen provided an update and some information in relation to this exercise. The exercise is to evaluate the performance of fire fighters in the Rural Urban Interface and is being undertaken in Wundowie on 28th October 2017.

There will be an evacuation centre at the Wundowie Hall where relevant staff will be provided with the opportunity to experience the operation of an





evacuation centre. Ms Spadaccini advised that she would be willing to provide training before the exercise if required.

Affected landowners have been notified through a letter drop and are given the opportunity to advise Officers if they do not wish to participate.

There will be an open day at the Wundowie Oval on 15^{th} October where people can find out information about this exercise.

The next LEMC meeting is scheduled for Thursday, 7th December 2017.

BACKGROUND / DETAILS

Council initiated Amendment No. 11 to its Local Planning Scheme No.6 on 15th March 2017 (Minute No. C. 2975). The proposed Amendment relates to Lot 23 (No. 9) Jessup Terrace, Northam (the subject site). Refer Attachment 1 – Location Plan.



The required documentation has been prepared and lodged by Peter D Webb and Associates on behalf of the landowners Lester Willem DeBoer, Kevin Gregory Rose and Barry Raymond Rose.

Purpose of Amendment:

The purpose of the proposed Amendment is to recode part of the subject land to facilitate the property being developed in conjunction with Lot 20 Mitchell Avenue, Northam, also owned by the same landowners.

A copy of the Scheme Amendment Document is attached. Refer Attachment 2 – Scheme Amendment Document.

Environmental Assessment:

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1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of this Scheme Amendment to the Shire of Northam Local Planning Scheme No. 6 (LPS 6) is to recode part of Lot 23 (#9) Jessup Terrace, Northam from "Residential R15" to "Residential R15/30".

The Applicant seeks Council Approval to recode part of the subject land to facilitate the property being developed in conjunction with Lot 20 Mitchell Avenue, Northam, also owned by the same landowner.

The Applicant's justification in support of the Scheme Amendment is summarised as follows:

- The proposal is assessed as being in accordance with the relevant State Planning and Development Control Policies of the WAPC;
- The subject land is contained in the Shire of Northam Local Planning Strategy as being suitable for increased residential development;
- The proposed Scheme Amendment does not affect the existing Avon and Mortlock Rivers Special Control Area;
- The proposed Scheme Amendment is outside of the mapped Bushfire Prone Area of the site; and
- The subject land is immediately adjacent to other Residential R15/30 coded land.

The Applicant therefore, seeks the Council's favourable consideration of this Scheme Amendment.

For the purposes of the *Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations* 2015, this proposed Scheme Amendment is a 'Standard' Scheme Amendment.



2.0 INTRODUCTION

Peter Webb & Associates (PWA) acts for the current landowners of Lot 23 (#9) Jessup Terrace, Northam and lodges this request on their behalf, seeking the Shire of Northam's support for a Scheme Amendment for the recoding of the northern part of subject site from "Residential R15" to "Residential R15/30".

This proposed Scheme Amendment aims to increase residential development opportunities on the subject site, in a manner similar to adjacent land in accordance with the Shire's Town Planning Framework.

The Shire's brief assessment on this proposal is respectfully sought, and following a supportive report to Council for initiation, the formal Scheme Amendment documents and further information will be provided to the Shire, as might be required.



3.0 LOCATION & SITE DETAILS

The subject land comprises Lot 23 (#9) Jessup Terrace, Northam. Lot 23 is described on Certificate of Title Volume 1769, Folio 621. (Refer to **Annexure 1**: Certificate of Title).

The registered proprietors of the site are outlined below:

The subject site is currently accessed via an informal (unsealed) road extending from Jessup Terrace.




Figure 1: Location Plan (source: Landgate)

The area of the subject site is 7369m² (see Location Plan at Figure 1).

The subject site is currently zoned "Residential R15" in the Shire of Northam Local Planning Scheme No. 6 (LPS 6).

The subject site is currently vacant and slopes down from north to south.

The land characteristics of this site include limited remnant vegetation and access to urban services (once developed together with adjacent lots).

The subject land has the following locational attributes:

 It is located close to existing and developing urban parts of Northam and is adjacent to existing "Residential R15/30" coded land;

- It will have access to all urban infrastructure services;
- It is only 3 minutes' drive from major shopping centre facilities (Northam Town Centre) and schools;
- It has no environmental/fire management issues on the land which cannot be addressed and which might otherwise, prevent further development; and
- It is intended to be developed together with adjoining (already coded R15/30) land (Lot 20 Mitchell Avenue).

4.0 SCHEME AMENDMENT PROPOSAL

4.1 Amendment Specifications

The proposed Scheme Amendment to Local Planning Scheme No. 6 (LPS 6) seeks to recode part of the subject site from 'Residential R15" to "Residential R15/30".

The only part of the site to be recoded is the northern part of the site which is outside the Avon and Mortlock Rivers Special Control Area, and also the part that is outside of the Bushfire Prone Area.

To amend the Scheme in this way, is consistent with land to the east where the R15/30 "coding line" sits outside of the Special Control Area.

4.2 Rationale in Support of Amendment

The owners of the land wish to development the northern part of the subject site together with Lot 20 Mitchell Avenue (which they also own) as part of a single development.

The proposed recoding of the land is supported by the Shire of Northam's Local Planning Strategy.

Further rationale in support of the Scheme Amendment is outlined in response to the various Planning requirements associated with the site, detailed in Section 5.0 of this Report.

4.3 Concept Plan

The proposed Scheme Amendment will enable a resultant subdivision/development which is depicted in the *attached* Concept Plan included at **Annexure 2**.

The Concept Plan identifies a layout for the R15/30 area, which has smaller lots, and the balance (unchanged) portion of the subject site to be developed for dwellings on larger lots (at R15).

Lot 20 Mitchell Avenue will also be part of any future development/subdivision of the subject land. The owners of the subject land also own Lot 20 Mitchell Avenue, so development/subdivision will be undertaken across the two lots in a single stage.



5.0 STRATEGIC & STATUTORY FRAMEWORK

5.1 Local Planning Context

5.1.1 Local Planning Scheme No. 6

The subject land is zoned "Residential R15" in the Shire of Northam Local Planning Scheme No. 6 (LPS 6).

Clause 4.3.1 of LPS 6 will apply to the recoded portion of the land, as it deals with dual density coded land.

In those circumstances, the local government will have the discretion in approving development or subdivision at the higher coding if it is connected to reticulated sewerage and is consistent with any Local Planning Policy relating to higher density residential uses.

The land is currently affected by the Avon and Mortlock Rivers Special Control Area.




Figure 3: LPS 6 Zoning Map Excerpt (Lot 156 shown)

The site is directly adjacent to land that is coded R15/30 and which "coding line" follows the Avon and Mortlock Rivers Special Control Area line. See LPS 8 Zoning Map Extract at **Figure 3**.

The purpose of the Avon & Mortlock Rivers Special Control Area is to -

 (a) Preserve the ecological values of the Avon and Mortlock Rivers as a significant drought refuge for freshwater fishes and water birds;



- (b) Avoid development that would negatively impact upon the ecological values and landscape qualities of the area;
- (c) Ensure that land use in the area, including grazing, cultivation and recreational activities does not degrade the area;
- (d) Ensure that any development takes place in such a manner so as to safeguard the welfare of people in the area; and
- (e) Ensure that future infrastructure development does not adversely alter the capacity of the area to convey floodwaters.

As such, LPS 6 states that there is a general presumption against rezoning of land within the Special Control Area for more intensive residential uses.

Therefore, the proposed Scheme Amendment is for the part of the land that is located outside of the Special Control Area.

5.1.2 Shire of Northam Local Planning Strategy

The Shire of Northam Local Planning Strategy (LPS) shows the subject land is to be developed for "Future Residential".

The Vision/Objective for Housing under the LPS is, "to ensure a sufficient supply of suitably zoned and serviced residential land in established settlements to accommodate future housing growth and to provide for housing choice and variety in neighbourhoods with a community identity and high levels of affordability, accessibility, safety, sustainability and visual amenity."

This Scheme Amendment is also consistent with the set Strategies for Housing given:

- This Amendment encourages the take up of existing residential land in the Northam townsite prior to proceeding with new land releases;
- This Amendment directs new housing development to the Northam townsite;
- This Amendment will provide for development which capitalises on existing services in the immediate area; and
- This Amendment will provide for additional housing types in a central location.

5.2 State Planning Context

5.2.1 State Planning Policies

State Planning Policy 3.7 – Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas

The WAPC State Planning Policy 3.7 (SPP 3.7) – Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas states that strategic planning proposals within bushfire prone areas are to be accompanied by a bushfire assessment (relevant to the nature and scale of the development), identification of any bushfire



hazard issues; and an assessment against the bushfire protection criteria contained in Appendix 4 of the Guidelines.

The subject land is identified as being partly within a designated bushfire prone area on the Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) *Map of Bush Fire Prone Areas 2016* (see Figure 4, below).



Figure 4: Bushfire Prone Areas Mapping

A Bushfire Attack Level (BAL) Assessment has been prepared by Bushfire Ready Consultants and is included at **Annexure 3**. The BAL Assessment has concluded the BAL rating for the site is BAL:12.5, and a Bushfire Management Plan may be required at Development/Subdivision Application stage.

5.2.2 Development Control Policies

Development Control Policy 2.2- Residential Subdivision

The objectives of DC Policy 2.2 are to:

- To establish a consistent and coordinated approach to the creation of residential lots throughout the State;
- To adopt criteria for residential lots which will ensure that each lot is provided with a suitable level of amenity, services and access; and
- To facilitate the supply of residential lots of a wide range of sizes and shapes which
 reflect the statutory provisions of local planning schemes, the availability of reticulated
 sewerage and the need for frontage to public roads.

The Scheme Amendment is in complete accordance with these objectives.



SCHEME AMENDMENT REPORT



The **General Requirements** of the Policy Measures at **Clause 3.1** of DC 2.2 indicate that the WAPC will have regard for the following, when considering applications for subdivision of land:

- (a) all new residential lots shall be capable of development in accordance with the R-Code density assigned to it;
- (b) all new residential lots shall be located within an area which is suitable for subdivision in terms of physical characteristics, such as topography, drainage and natural features;
- (c) all new residential lots shall be located within a system of vehicle and pedestrian movement; and
- (d) all new residential lots shall be served by a suitable level of community facilities including schools, retail facilities, etc, as determined under other policies adopted by the WAPC.

In direct response to these general requirements, we provide the following with respect to the subject site:

- (a) all new development sites or lots created on the land will be capable of development in accordance with the R-Codes (maximum density R30);
- (b) all new development sites or lots created on the land will take into account the topography of the site and include appropriate drainage systems as required;
- (c) all new development sites or lots created on the land will have access to sealed roads and will link with existing pedestrian footpaths; and
- (d) the development is located close to existing schools, shops and public open space.

The proposed increased residential zoning sought by this Scheme Amendment is therefore, in complete accordance with the General Requirements criteria of DC Policy 2.2.

5.3 Other Planning Considerations

5.3.1 Services

The subject land will be provided with reticulated power, telecommunications, scheme water and sewer services.

There is sewer infrastructure that traverses the site which will need to be retained within easements. This can be formalised at development and/or subdivision stage.

5.3.2 Roads

A sealed part of Jessup Terrace currently does not extend to the subject site due to a portion of the Jessup Terrace road reserve further east, being privately owned.

It is requested that the Shire investigate this further and commence proceedings to acquire the road reserve so that Jessup Terrace can be extended and used as it was intended to be.





A Bushfire Attack Level (BAL) assessment is a means of measuring the severity of a buildings potential exposure to ember attack, radiant heat and direct flame contact in a bushfire event, and thereby determining the construction measures required for the proposed build / dwelling. The methodology used for the determination of the BAL rating and the subsequent building construction standards, are directly referenced from Australian Standards AS3959:2009 Construction of Buildings in Bushfire Prone Areas.


The BAL rating is determined through identification and assessment of the following parameters:

- Fire Danger Index (FDI) rating which is assumed to be FDI-80 for WA.
- All classified vegetation is within 100m of the subject building.
- Separation distance between the building and the classified vegetation source/s.
- Slope of the land under the classified vegetation

AS3959:2009 has six (6) levels of BAL. based on the radiant heatflux exposure to the building and also identifies the relevant sections for building construction, as detailed below;

BACKGROUND / DETAILS

Reserve 22412 is Crown Land zoned with a management order to the Shire of Northam for the purposes of "Bush Fire Brigade Purposes". The reserve contains the current Bakers Hill Volunteer Bushfire Brigade shed.

The town site improvement works have been the subject of ongoing discussions and design reviews between the Shire of Northam and Main Roads for several years, with the final design presented to Council by Main Roads representatives on 17th May 2017 in the Council Chambers.

Following subsequent discussions with Main Roads staff provided a report to Council in April 2017, seeking endorsement of the following recommendations in order for the project to proceed:



That Council:

- 1. Pursuant to section 56 of the Land Administration Act 1997, resolves for the dedication of road and road widening as shown on Main Roads WA drawing number 1660-291-1, subject to Main Roads WA indemnifying the Shire of Northam & Minister for Lands against any claims that may arise as a result of the dedications relating to widening of Great Eastern Highway, in accordance with section 56(4) of the Land Administration Act 1997.
- 2. Initiate the permanent closure of Yates Street, as shown on Main Roads WA drawing number 1660-291-1, by publically advertising the Councils intention for a period of 35 Days. (Noting that the matter must come back before Council for determination/resolution, once the public submission period closes)
- 3. Consent to excise the land required for the widening of Great Eastern Highway from reserves 3308 and 4166 as shown on Main Roads WA drawing number 1660-291-1
- 4. Consent for Main Roads WA and its contractors to enter Reserve 3308 & 4166 to carry out construction works which are expected to be scheduled to commence prior to the excision from the reserves being completed
- 5. Request the Department of Lands to amalgamate the current (to be closed) Yates Street into reserve 4166.

The road widening required on the corner of Great Eastern Highway and Tames Road were not included in the original plans or resolution above.

Main Roads Western Australia (MRWA) previously wrote to the Shire of Northam (Shire) on 30 March 2017 in relation to land requirements associated with proposed road works at Bakers Hill.

Council at its meeting held on the 19th of April supported MRWA's request. In a letter dated 19 May 2017 from the Shire to MRWA, the Shire confirmed its support for the proposal.

With respect to Reserve 22421, can you please provide the following:







Notes to the Financial Statements (items in bold represent new notes)

Operating Income

- 1. Governance is over budget by \$29,164, due to timing of a grant received from Northam Wheatbelt Development Commission for urban renewal planning.
- 2. General Purpose Funding is under budget due to the FAGS Grant being under budget by \$31,329
- 3. Other Property & Services over budget \$44,899 this is directly related to the receipt of insurance income for the Wundowie Pool claim of \$37,824 and Private works additional income from the upgrade of Byfield Street of \$4,844 received not budgeted for

Operating Expenditure

- 4. Recreation and Culture is \$170,378 under budget, predominantly due to the timing of the depreciation not being brought to account of \$185,608
- 5. Transport is under budget by \$677,374 due to depreciation of \$526,734 not brought to account and the timing of roads maintenance programme expenditure, \$289,087.
- 6. Other Property & Services is over budget \$43,999 due predominantly to public works overhead recovery timing \$75,718 and Plant under allocation of \$48,236.

Operating Income by Nature and Type

7. Other revenue is over budget by \$44,146 due to the items disclosed at points 1 & 2 above.

Operating Expenditure by Nature and Type

- 8. Employee Costs are under budget by 8% predominantly due to lower than anticipated expenditure in Killara for \$31,321, Planning of \$20,795, Works Maintenance Department for \$65,902.
- 9. Materials and contracts are under budget by 38%, due to a timing issues between budget and actual expenditure as disclosed in the notes presented above.
- 10. Depreciation of \$672,540 was not brought to account due to the EOFY adjustments still being carried out.
- 11. Interest expense incurred in July was accrued back into the previous financial year.

BACKGROUND / DETAILS

This Local Law was previously considered by Council in February 2017 however due to an error in the process, this must be recommenced.

In accordance with s.3.16 of the Local Government Act 1995 (the Act), the Shire completed a statutory review of the Activities on Thoroughfares and Public Places and Trading Local Law 2008. This process has now been completed and therefore Officers are requesting to initiate s.3.12 of the Act in order to commence the amendment process.

During the statutory review process staff provided their recommendations for amendment of this Local Law.

Council, at its meeting held 19 July 2017, subsequently resolved to undertake an amendment of the Shire's Activities on Thoroughfares and Public Places and Trading Local Law 2008.

Section 3.12 of the Act prescribes the statutory procedures for making an amendment local law, requiring:



- The purpose and effect of the proposed amendment local law is to be included in the agenda and the minutes of the meeting at which they are considered.
- A Statewide and Local public notice of the proposed amendment local law is to be published, detailing:
 - o The purpose and effect of the proposed amendment local law;
 - Where a copy of the proposed amendment local law may be inspected; and
 - o A minimum 6 weeks public submission period.
- A copy of the notice and the proposed amendment local law is to be provided to the Minister for Local Government and any other Minister responsible for administering the Act/s under which the Local Law is proposed to be made.
- After the close of the public submission period, a further report will be presented to Council to enable Council's consideration of any public submissions and, where the consequentially proposed local law is not substantially different from that advertised in the public notice, the Council may then resolve by absolute majority to make the amendment local law.
- The amendment local law must then be published in the Government Gazette and a copy of the gazetted amendment local law is to be provided to the relevant Minister/s and the Parliamentary Joint Standing Committee on Delegated Legislation.
- A Local Public Notice must then be given stating the title of the amendment local law, a summary of its purpose and effect and advising where copies may be inspected or obtained.

This report seeks to commence the s.3.12 process, to initiate the Shire of Northam Activities on Thoroughfares and Public Places and Trading Amendment Local Law 2017.

OFFICER'S COMMENT

The proposed Activities on Thoroughfares and Public Places and Trading Amendment Local Law 2017 has been drafted to address the matters raised by staff as well as other minor amendments - refer attached.

In accordance with the provisions of the Act it is necessary to initiate the amendment process which requires the Shire to give State wide public notice of the proposed amendment local law for public inspection. This also includes displaying copies of the amendment local law at the Shire office and both of the Shire's library services.

A copy of the proposed amendment local law, this report and a copy of the public notice advertisements, will also be forwarded to the Minister for Local Government Sport and Cultural Industries for review. At the expiry of the comment period (minimum of six weeks) all submissions will be reported back to Council prior to the amendment local law being considered for adoption.

Under the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1995 and under all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Northam resolved on 23rd July 2008 to make the following local law.

PART 1—PRELIMINARY

1.1 Citation

This local law may be cited as the Shire of Northam Activities on Thoroughfares and Public Places and Trading Local Law 2008.

1.2 Definitions

In this local law unless the context otherwise requires—

- "Act" means the Local Government Act 1995;
- "applicant" means a person who applies for a permit;
- "authorized person" means a person authorized by the local government under section 9.10 of the Act to perform any of the functions of an authorized person under this local law;
- "built-up area" has the meaning given to it in the Road Traffic Code 2000;
- "bulk rubbish container" means a bin or container designed or used for holding a substantial quantity of rubbish and which is unlikely to be lifted without mechanical assistance, but does not include a bin or container used in connection with the local government's regular domestic rubbish collection service;
- "carriageway" has the meaning given to it in the Road Traffic Code 2000;
- "CEO" means the chief executive officer of the local government;
- "commencement day" means the day on which this local law comes into operation;
- "Council" means the council of the local government;
- "crossing" means a crossing giving access from a public thoroughfare to—
 - (a) private land; or
 - (b) a private thoroughfare serving private land;
- "district" means the district of the local government;
- "footpath" has the meaning given to it in the Road Traffic Code 2000;
- "garden" means any part of a thoroughfare planted, developed or treated, otherwise than as a lawn, with one or more plants;
- "intersection" has the meaning given to it in the $\it Road\ Traffic\ Code\ 2000;$
- ${\bf "kerb"}$ includes the edge of a carriageway;
- "lawn" means any part of a thoroughfare which is planted only with grass, or with a similar plant, but will include any other plant provided that it has been planted by the local government;
- "liquor" has the meaning given to it in section 3 of the Liquor Control Act 1988;
- "local government" means the Shire of Northam;
- "local government property" means anything except a thoroughfare—
 - (a) which belongs to the local government;
 - (b) of which the local government is the management body under the $Land\ Administration\ Act\ 1997;$ or
 - (c) which is an "otherwise unvested facility" within section 3.53 of the Act;
- "lot" has the meaning given to it in the Planning and Development Act 2005;
- "owner" or "occupier" in relation to land does not include the local government;

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"permissible verge treatment" means any one of the 4 treatments described in clause 2.8(2), and includes any reticulation pipes and sprinklers;

"permit" means a permit issued under this local law;

"permit holder" means a person who holds a valid permit;

"person" does not include the local government;

"premises" for the purpose of the definition of "public place" in both this clause and clause 6.1, means a building or similar structure, but does not include a carpark or a similar place;

"public place" includes any thoroughfare or place which the public are allowed to use, whether or not the thoroughfare or place is on private property, but does not include—

- (a) premises on private property from which trading is lawfully conducted under a written law; and
- (b) local government property;
- "Regulations" means the Local Government (Functions and General) Regulations 1996;
- "sign" includes a notice, flag, mark, structure or device on which may be shown words, numbers, expressions or symbols;
- "thoroughfare" has the meaning given to it in the Act, but does not include a private thoroughfare which is not under the management control of the local government;
- "town planning scheme" means a town planning scheme of the local government made under the Planning and Development Act 2005;

"townsite" means all townsites within the district which are-

- (a) constituted under section 26(2) of the Land Administration Act 1997;
- (b) referred to in clause 37 of Schedule 9.3 of the Act; or
- (c) within Spencers Brook or Seabrook;

"vehicle" includes-

- (a) every conveyance and every object capable of being propelled or drawn on wheels, tracks or otherwise; and
- (b) an animal being ridden or driven,

but excludes-

- (a) a wheel-chair or any device designed for use by a physically impaired person on a footpath; and
- (b) a pram, a stroller or a similar device; and
- "verge" means that part of a thoroughfare between the carriageway and the land which abuts the thoroughfare, but does not include any footpath.

1.3 Application

This local law applies throughout the district.

1.4 Repeal

- (1) The following local laws are repealed—
 - Shire of Northam By-law Relating to Trading in Public Places published in the *Government Gazette* of 7 July 1989;
 - Shire of Northam By-law to Regulate Hawkers published in the Government Gazette of 31 May 1960 and as amended and published in the Government Gazette of 14 June 1974;
 - Shire of Northam By-laws Relating to Road Reserves as published in the Government Gazette on 8 May 1987;
 - Town of Northam By-laws Relating to Stalls published in the Government Gazette of 24 July 1981 and as amended and published in the Government Gazette of 4 December 1981 and 3 August 1990;
 - Town of Northam By-laws Relating to the Control of Hawkers published in the Government Gazette of 23 October 1981 and as amended and published in the Government Gazette of 3 August 1990;
 - Town of Northam By-laws Relating to Street Trading published in the Government Gazette of 17 March 1989;
 - Town of Northam By-laws Relating to the Use and Misuse of Streets, Kerbs, Verges, Footpaths and Public Places published in the *Government Gazette* of 4 October 1985 and as amended and published in the *Government Gazette* of 3 August 1990;
 - Town of Northam By-laws Relating to Signs, Hoardings and Bill Posting published in the Government Gazette of 17 January 1992;
- (2) Where a policy was made or adopted by the local government under or in relation to a local law repealed by this local law, then the policy is to be taken to no longer have any effect on and from the commencement day.
- (3) The Council may resolve that notwithstanding subclause (2) specified policies continue, or are to be taken to have continued, to have effect on and from the commencement day.



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PART 2-ACTIVITIES ON THOROUGHFARES AND PUBLIC PLACES

Division 1—General

2.1 General prohibitions

A person shall not—

- (a) plant any plant on a thoroughfare—
 - (i) except grass or a similar plant within 6m of an intersection; and
 - (ii) which exceeds or which may exceed 0.75m in height so that the plant is within 6m to 10m of an intersection;
- (b) damage a lawn or a garden or remove any plant or part of a plant from a lawn or a garden unless— $\,$
 - (i) the person is the owner or the occupier of the lot abutting that portion of the thoroughfare and the lawn or the garden or the particular plant has not been installed or planted by the local government; or
 - (ii) the person is acting under the authority of a written law;
- (c) plant any plant (except grass or a similar plant) on a thoroughfare so that it is within 1m of a carriageway;
- (d) place on any footpath any fruit, fruit skins or other substance or fluid (whether vegetable or otherwise, but not water) which may create a hazard for any person using the footpath;
- (e) unless at the direction of the local government, damage, remove or interfere with any signpost, direction plate, guidepost, notice, shelter, shed, fence or any structure erected on a thoroughfare by the local government or a person acting under the authority of a written law;
- (f) play or participate in any game or sport so as to cause danger to any person or thing or impede the movement of vehicles or persons on a thoroughfare; or
- (g) within a mall, arcade or verandah of a shopping centre, ride any bicycle, skateboard, rollerblades or similar device.

2.2 Activities allowed with a permit—general

- (1) A person shall not, without a permit-
 - (a) dig or otherwise create a trench through or under a kerb or footpath;
 - (b) subject to Division 3 of this Part, throw, place or deposit any thing on a verge except for removal by the local government under a bulk rubbish collection, and then only in accordance with the terms and conditions and during the period of time advertised in connection with that collection by the local government;
 - (c) cause any obstruction to a vehicle or a person using a thoroughfare as a thoroughfare;
 - (d) cause any obstruction to a water channel or a water course in a thoroughfare;
 - (e) throw, place or drain offensive, noxious or dangerous fluid onto a thoroughfare;
 - (f) damage a thoroughfare;
 - (g) light any fire or burn any thing on a thoroughfare other than in a stove or fireplace provided for that purpose or under a permit issued under clause 5.13;
 - (h) fell any tree onto a thoroughfare;
 - (i) unless installing, or in order to maintain, a permissible verge treatment—
 - (i) lay pipes under or provide taps on any verge; or
 - (ii) place or install any thing on any part of a thoroughfare, and without limiting the generality of the foregoing, any gravel, stone, flagstone, cement, concrete slabs, blocks, bricks, pebbles, plastic sheeting, kerbing, wood chips, bark or sawdust;
 - (j) provide, erect, install or use in or on any building, structure or land abutting on a thoroughfare any hoist or other thing for use over the thoroughfare;
 - (k) on a public place use anything or do anything so as to create a nuisance;
 - (l) place or cause to be placed on a thoroughfare a bulk rubbish container; or
 - (m) interfere with the soil of, or anything in a thoroughfare or take anything from a thoroughfare.
- (2) The local government may exempt a person from compliance with subclause (1) on the application of that person.

2.3 No possession and consumption of liquor on thoroughfare

- (1) A person shall not consume any liquor or have in her or his possession or under her or his control any liquor on a thoroughfare unless—
 - (a) that is permitted under the $Liquor\ Control\ Act\ 1988$ or under another written law; or
 - (b) the person is doing so in accordance with a permit.
- (2) Subclause (1) does not apply where the liquor is in a sealed container.

Division 2—Vehicle crossing
Subdivision 1—Temporary crossings

2.4 Permit required

- (1) Where it is likely that works on a lot will involve vehicles leaving a thoroughfare and entering the lot, the person responsible for the works shall obtain a permit for the construction of a temporary crossing to protect the existing carriageway, kerb, drains and footpath, where—
 - (a) a crossing does not exist; or

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- (b) a crossing does exist, but the nature of the vehicles and their loads is such that they are likely to cause damage to the crossing.
- (2) The "person responsible for the works" in subclause (1) is to be taken to be-
 - (a) the builder named on the building licence issued under the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1960, if one has been issued in relation to the works; or
 - (b) the registered proprietor of the lot, if no building licence has been issued under the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1960 in relation to the works.
- (3) If the local government approves an application for a permit for the purpose of subclause (1), the permit is taken to be issued on the condition that until such time as the temporary crossing is removed, the permit holder shall keep the temporary crossing in good repair and in such a condition so as not to create any danger or obstruction to persons using the thoroughfare.

Subdivision 2—Redundant vehicle crossings

2.5 Removal of redundant crossing

- (1) Where works on a lot will result in a crossing no longer giving access to a lot, the crossing is to be removed and the kerb, drain, footpath, verge and any other part of the thoroughfare affected by the removal are to be reinstated to the satisfaction of the local government.
- (2) The local government may give written notice to the owner or occupier of a lot requiring her or him to—
 - (a) remove any part of or all of a crossing which does not give access to the lot; and
 - (b) reinstate the kerb, drain, footpath, verge and any other part of the thoroughfare, which may be affected by the removal,

within the period of time stated in the notice, and the owner or occupier of the lot shall comply with that notice.

Division 3—Verge treatments
Subdivision 1—Preliminary

2.6 Definition

In this Division, unless the context otherwise requires—

"acceptable material" means any material which will create a hard surface, and which appears on a list of acceptable materials maintained by the local government.

2.7 Application

This Division only applies to townsites.

Subdivision 2—Permissible verge treatments

2.8 Permissible verge treatments

- (1) An owner or occupier of land which abuts on a verge may on that part of the verge directly in front of her or his land install a permissible verge treatment.
- (2) The permissible verge treatments are—
 - (a) the planting and maintenance of a lawn;
 - (b) the planting and maintenance of a garden provided that—
 - (i) clear sight visibility is maintained at all times for a person using the abutting thoroughfare in the vicinity of an intersection or bend in the thoroughfare or using a driveway on land adjacent to the thoroughfare for access to or from the thoroughfare; and
 - (ii) where there is no footpath, a pedestrian has safe and clear access of a minimum width of 2m along that part of the verge immediately adjacent to the kerb;
 - (c) the installation of an acceptable material; or
 - (d) the installation over no more than one third of the area of the verge (excluding any vehicle crossing) of an acceptable material in accordance with paragraph (c), and the planting and maintenance of either a lawn or a garden on the balance of the verge in accordance with paragraph (a) or (b).

2.9 Only permissible verge treatments to be installed

- (1) A person shall not install or maintain a verge treatment which is not a permissible verge treatment.
- (2) The owner and occupier of the lot abutting a verge treatment referred to in subclause (1) are each to be taken to have installed and maintained that verge treatment for the purposes of this clause and clause 2.10.

2.10 Obligations of owner or occupier

An owner or occupier who installs or maintains a permissible verge treatment shall—

(a) keep the permissible verge treatment in a good and tidy condition and ensure, where the verge treatment is a garden or lawn, that a footpath on the verge and a carriageway adjoining the verge is not obstructed by the verge treatment;



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- (b) not place any obstruction on or around the verge treatment; and
- (c) not disturb a footpath on the verge.

2.11 Notice to owner or occupier

The local government may give a notice in writing to the owner or the occupier of a lot abutting on a verge to make good, within the time specified in the notice, any breach of a provision of this Division.

Subdivision 3—Existing verge treatments

2.12 Transitional provision

(1) In this clause—

"former provisions" means the local law of the local government which permitted certain types of verge treatments, whether with or without the consent of the local government, and which was repealed by this local law.

- (2) A verge treatment which—
 - (a) was installed prior to the commencement day; and
 - (b) on the commencement day is a type of verge treatment which was permitted under and complied with the former provisions,

is to be taken to be a permissible verge treatment for so long as the verge treatment remains of the same type and continues to comply with the former provisions.

Subdivision 4—Public works

2.13 Power to carry out public works on verge

Where the local government or an authority empowered to do so under a written law disturbs a verge, the local government or the authority—

- (a) is not liable to compensate any person for that disturbance;
- (b) may backfill with sand, if necessary, any garden or lawn; and
- (c) is not liable to replace or restore any-
 - (i) verge treatment and, in particular, any plant or any acceptable material or other hard surface; or
 - (ii) sprinklers, pipes or other reticulation equipment.

Division 4—Property numbers
Subdivision 1—Preliminary

2.14 Definition

In this Division, unless the context requires otherwise—

"Number" means a number of a lot with or without an alphabetical suffix indicating the address of the lot by reference to a thoroughfare.

Subdivision 2—Assignment and marking of numbers

2.15 Assignment of numbers

The local government may assign a Number to a lot in the district and may assign another Number to the lot instead of that previously assigned.

Division 5—Fencing

2.16 Public place-Item 4(1) of Division 1, Schedule 3.1 of Act

The following places are specified as a public place for the purpose of item 4(1) of Division 1 of Schedule 3.1 of the Act—

- (a) a public place, as that term is defined in clause 1.2; and
- (b) local government property.

Division 6—Signs erected by the local government

2.17 Signs

- (1) A local government may erect a sign on a public place specifying any conditions of use which apply to that place.
- (2) A person shall comply with a sign erected under subclause (1).
- (3) A condition of use specified on a sign erected under subclause (1) is to be for the purpose of giving notice of the effect of a provision of this local law.

2.18 Transitional

Where a sign erected on a public place has been erected under a local law of the local government repealed by this local law, then on and from the commencement day, it is to be taken to be a sign erected under clause $2.17\,\mathrm{if}$ —

- (a) the sign specifies a condition of use relating to the public place which gives notice of the effect of a provision of this local law; and
- (b) the condition of use specified is not inconsistent with any provision of this local law.



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Division 7—Driving on a closed thoroughfare

2.19 No driving on closed thoroughfare

- (1) A person shall not drive or take a vehicle on a closed thoroughfare unless—
 - (a) that is in accordance with any limits or exceptions specified in the order made under section 3.50 of the Act; or
 - (b) the person has first obtained a permit.
- (2) In this clause—

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"closed thoroughfare" means a thoroughfare wholly or partially closed under section 3.50 or 3.50A of the Act.

PART 3—ADVERTISING SIGNS ON THOROUGHFARES

Division 1—Preliminary

3.1 Definition

In this Part, unless the context otherwise requires-

- "advertising sign" means a sign used for the purpose of advertisement and includes an "election sign";
- "direction sign" means a sign which indicates the direction of another place, activity or event, but does not include any such sign erected or affixed by the local government or the Commissioner of Main Roads:
- "election sign" means a sign or poster which advertises any aspect of a forthcoming Federal, State or Local Government election; and
- "portable direction sign" means a portable free standing direction sign; and
- "portable sign" means a portable free standing advertising sign.

Division 2—Permit

3.2 Advertising signs and portable direction signs

- (1) A person shall not, without a permit—
 - (a) erect or place an advertising sign on a thoroughfare; or
 - (b) post any bill or paint, place or affix any advertisement on a thoroughfare.
- (2) Notwithstanding subclause (1), a permit is not required in respect of a portable direction sign which neither exceeds 500mm in height nor $0.5 \mathrm{m}^2$ in area, provided that the sign is placed or erected on a thoroughfare on an infrequent or occasional basis only to direct attention to a place, activity or event during the hours of that activity or event.
- (3) Notwithstanding subclause (1), a person shall not erect or place an advertising sign—
 - (a) on a footpath;
 - (b) over any footpath where the resulting vertical clearance between the sign and the footpath is less than 2.5m;
 - (c) on or within 3m of a carriageway;
 - (d) in any other location where, in the opinion of the local government, the sign is likely to obstruct lines of sight along a thoroughfare or cause danger to any person using the thoroughfare; or
 - (e) on any natural feature, including a rock or tree, on a thoroughfare, or on any bridge or the structural approaches to a bridge.

3.3 Matters to be considered in determining application for permit

In determining an application for a permit for the purpose of clause 3.2(1), the local government is to have regard to—

- (a) any other written law regulating the erection or placement of signs within the district;
- (b) the dimensions of the sign;
- (c) other advertising signs already approved or erected in the vicinity of the proposed location of the sign;
- (d) whether or not the sign will create a hazard to persons using a thoroughfare; and
- (e) the amount of the public liability insurance cover, if any, to be obtained by the applicant.

3.4 Conditions on portable sign

If the local government approves an application for a permit for a portable sign, the application is to be taken to be approved subject to the following conditions—

- (a) the portable sign shall—
 - (i) not exceed 1m in height;
 - (ii) not exceed an area of 1m² on any side;
 - (iii) relate only to the business activity described on the permit;

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- (iv) contain letters not less than 200mm in height;
- (v) not be erected in any position other than immediately adjacent to the building or the business to which the sign relates;
- (vi) be removed each day at the close of the business to which it relates and not be erected again until the business next opens for trading;
- (vii) be secured in position in accordance with any requirements of the local government;
- (viii) be placed so as not to obstruct or impede the reasonable use of a thoroughfare or access to a place by any person; and
- (ix) be maintained in good condition; and
- (b) no more than one portable sign shall be erected in relation to the one building or business.

3.5 Conditions on election sign

If the local government approves an application for a permit for the erection or placement of an election sign on a thoroughfare, the application is to be taken to be approved subject to the sign— $\frac{1}{2} \left(\frac{1}{2} + \frac{1}{$

- (a) being erected at least 30m from any intersection;
- (b) being free standing and not being affixed to any existing sign, post, power or light pole, or similar structure;
- (c) being placed so as not to obstruct or impede the reasonable use of a thoroughfare, or access to a place by any person;
- (d) being placed so as not to obstruct or impede the vision of a driver of a vehicle entering or leaving a thoroughfare or crossing;
- (e) being maintained in good condition;
- (f) not being erected until the election to which it relates has been officially announced;
- (g) being removed within 24 hours of the close of polls on voting day;
- (h) not being placed within 100m of any works on the thoroughfare;
- (i) being securely installed;
- (j) not being an illuminated sign;
- (k) not incorporating reflective or fluorescent materials; and
- (l) not displaying only part of a message which is to be read with other separate signs in order to obtain the whole message.

PART 4—OBSTRUCTING ANIMALS, VEHICLES OR SHOPPING TROLLEYS

Division 1—Animals and vehicles

4.1 Leaving animal or vehicle in public place or on local government property

- (1) A person shall not leave an animal or a vehicle, or any part of a vehicle, in a public place or on local government property so that it obstructs the use of any part of that public place or local government property, unless that person has first obtained a permit or is authorized to do so under a written law.
- (2) A person will not contravene subclause (1) where the animal is secured or tethered for a period not exceeding 1 hour.
- (3) A person will not contravene subclause (1) where the vehicle is left for a period not exceeding 24 hours.

4.2 Prohibitions relating to animals

- (1) In subclause (2), "owner" in relation to an animal includes—
 - (a) an owner of it;
 - (b) a person in possession of it;
 - (c) a person who has control of it; and
 - (d) a person who ordinarily occupies the premises where the animal is permitted to stay.
- (2) An owner of an animal shall not-
 - (a) allow the animal to enter or remain for any time on any thoroughfare except for the use of the thoroughfare as a thoroughfare and unless it is led, ridden or driven;
 - (b) allow an animal which has a contagious or infectious disease to be led, ridden or driven in a public place; or
 - (c) train or race the animal on a thoroughfare.
- (3) An owner of a horse shall not lead, ride or drive a horse on a thoroughfare in a built-up area, unless that person does so under a permit or under the authority of a written law.

 $Division\ 2-\!\!-\!Shopping\ trolleys$

4.3 Definition

In this Division—

"retailer" means a proprietor of a shop in respect of which shopping trolleys are provided for the use of customers of the shop; and



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"shopping trolley" means a wheeled container or receptacle supplied by a retailer to enable a person to transport goods.

4.4 Shopping trolley to be marked

A retailer shall clearly mark its name or its trading name on any shopping trolley made available for the use of customers.

4.5 Person not to leave trolley in public place

A person shall not leave a shopping trolley in a public place other than in an area set aside for the storage of shopping trolleys.

4.6 Retailer to remove abandoned trolley

- (1) If a shopping trolley is found in a public place, other than in an area set aside for the storage of shopping trolleys, the local government may advise (verbally or in writing) a retailer whose name is marked on the trolley of the location of the shopping trolley.
- (2) A retailer shall remove a shopping trolley within 24 hours of being so advised under subclause (1), unless the retailer—
 - (a) requests the local government to collect and deliver the shopping trolley to the retailer; and
 - (b) pays any fee for that collection and delivery (imposed and determined under and in accordance with sections 6.16 to 6.19 of the Act) within the period specified by the local government.

4.7 Retailer taken to own trolley

In the absence of any proof to the contrary, a shopping trolley is to be taken to belong to a retailer whose name is marked on the trolley.

PART 5—ROADSIDE CONSERVATION

 $Division \ 1-\!\!-\!\!Preliminary$

5.1 Definition

In this Part-

"MRWA" means Main Roads Western Australia;

"protected flora" has the meaning given to it in section 6(1) of the Wildlife Conservation Act 1950:

"rare flora" has the meaning given to it in section 23F of the Wildlife Conservation Act 1950;

"Roadside Conservation Committee" means the Roadside Conservation Committee established under the Land Resource Policy Council within the Office of Premier and Cabinet, but now located in the Department of Environment and Conservation; and

"special environmental area" means an area designated as such under clause 5.7.

5.2 Application

This Part does not apply to the townsite.

Division 2-Flora roads

5.3 Declaration of flora road

The local government may declare a thoroughfare which has, in the opinion of the local government, high quality roadside vegetation to be a flora road.

5.4 Construction works on flora roads

Construction and maintenance work carried out by the local government on a flora road is to be in accordance with the "Handbook of Environmental Practice for Road Construction and Road Maintenance Works" (April 2005) prepared by the Roadside Conservation Committee.

5.5 Signposting of flora roads

The local government may signpost flora roads with the standard MRWA "flora road" sign.

5.6 Driving only on carriageway of flora roads

- (1) A person driving or riding a vehicle on a flora road shall only drive or ride the vehicle on the carriageway.
- (2) Subclause (1) does not apply where—
 - (a) conditions on the thoroughfare do not reasonably permit a vehicle to remain on the carriageway;
 - (b) there is no carriageway; or
 - (c) an exemption from the application of subclause (1) has been obtained from the local government.

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Division 3—Special environmental areas

5.7 Designation of special environmental areas

The local government may designate a thorough fare, or any part of a thorough fare, as a special environmental area which—

- (a) has protected flora or rare flora; or
- (b) in the opinion of the local government, has environmental, aesthetic or cultural significance.

5.8 Marking of special environmental areas

The local government is to mark and keep a register of each thoroughfare, or part of a thoroughfare, designated as a special environmental area.

Division 4—Planting in thoroughfares

5.9 Permit to plant

A person shall not plant any plant or sow any seeds in a thoroughfare without first obtaining a permit.

5.10 Relevant considerations in determining application

In determining an application for a permit for the purpose of clause 5.9, the local government is to have regard to—

- (a) existing vegetation within that part of the thoroughfare in which the planting is to take place; and
- (b) the diversity of species and the prevalence of the species which are to be planted or sown.

Division 5—Clearance of vegetation

5.11 Permit to clear

A person shall not clear and maintain in a cleared state, the surface of a thoroughfare within 1.5m of that person's land without first obtaining a permit and any other approvals which may be required under any written law.

5.12 Application for permit

In addition to the requirements of subclause 7.1(2), a person making an application for a permit for the purpose of clause 5.11 shall submit a sketch plan clearly showing the boundary of the person's land and the portions of the thoroughfare joining that person's land which are to be cleared.

Division 6—Fire management

5.13 Permit to burn thoroughfare

A person shall not burn part of a thoroughfare without first obtaining a permit or unless acting under the authority of any other written law.

5.14 Application for permit

In addition to the requirements of subclause 7.1(2), an application for a permit for the purposes of clause $5.13 \mathrm{\ shall}$ —

- (a) include a sketch plan showing the portions of a thoroughfare which are proposed to be burned; and
- (b) advise of the estimated fire intensity and the measures to be taken to protect upper storey vegetation from the burn.

5.15 When application for permit can be approved

The local government may approve an application for a permit for the purpose of clause 5.13 only if the burning of the particular part of the thoroughfare will—

- (a) reduce a fire hazard and alternative means of reducing that hazard, such as slashing or the use of herbicides, are considered by the local government to be not feasible or more detrimental to native flora and fauna than burning; or
- (b) in the opinion of the local government, be beneficial for the preservation and conservation of native flora and fauna.

5.16 Prohibitions on burning

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this local law, an application for a permit for the purpose of clause 5.13 is not to be approved by the local government—

- (a) for burning between 31 August and 1 May of the following year where the intensity of the burn could damage native flora and fauna; or
- (b) in any year to any person for any part of a thoroughfare which is on the opposite side of the carriageway to that portion of the thoroughfare for which a permit to burn has been approved in the same year.

Division 7—Firebreaks

5.17 Permit for firebreaks on thoroughfares

A person shall not construct a firebreak on a thoroughfare without first obtaining a permit.

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5.18 When application for permit cannot be approved

- (1) The local government is not to approve an application for a permit for the purpose of clause 5.17 where the thoroughfare is less than 20m wide.
- (2) Subclause (1) does not apply where the firebreak is, in the opinion of the local government, desirable for the protection of roadside vegetation.

Division 8—Commercial wildflower harvesting on thoroughfares

5.19 General prohibition on commercial wildflower harvesting

Subject to clause 5.20, a person shall not commercially harvest native flora on a thoroughfare.

5.20 Permit for revegetation projects

- (1) A person shall not collect seed from native flora on a thoroughfare without first obtaining a permit.
- (2) The local government may approve an application for a permit under subclause (1) only where—
 - (a) the seed is required for a revegetation project in any part of the district; and
 - (b) the thoroughfare, or the relevant part of it, is not a special environmental area
- (3) Unless the local government specifically provides to the contrary on a permit, if the local government approves an application for a permit for the purpose of subclause (1) it is to be taken to be approved subject to the following conditions—
 - (a) the collection of the seed is to be carried out so as not to endanger the long time survival of the native flora on the thoroughfare; and
 - (b) any licence or approval which may be required under any other written law is to be obtained by the applicant.

PART 6—TRADING ON THOROUGHFARES AND PUBLIC PLACES

Division 1—Stallholders and traders Subdivision 1—Preliminary

6.1 Definition

In this Division, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Competition Principles Agreement" means the Competition Principles Agreement executed by each State and Territory of the Commonwealth and the Commonwealth of Australia on 11 April 1995;

"public place" includes—

- (a) any thoroughfare or place which the public are allowed to use whether or not the thoroughfare or place is on private property; and
- (b) local government property,

but does not include premises on private property from which trading is lawfully conducted under a written law;

- "stall" means a movable or temporarily fixed structure, stand or table in, on or from which goods or services are sold, hired or offered for sale or hire;
- "stallholder" means a person in charge of a stall;
- ${\bf "stall holder's\ permit"}\ means\ a\ permit\ is sued\ to\ a\ stall holder;$
- "trader" means a person who carries on trading;
- "trader's permit" means a permit issued to a trader; and
- "trading" includes-
 - (a) the selling or hiring of, the offering for sale or hire of or the soliciting of orders for goods or services in a public place;
 - (b) displaying goods in any public place for the purpose of—
 - (i) offering them for sale or hire;
 - (ii) inviting offers for their sale or hire;
 - (iii) soliciting orders for them; or
 - (iv) carrying out any other transaction in relation to them; and
 - (c) the going from place to place, whether or not public places, and-
 - (i) offering goods or services for sale or hire; or
 - (ii) inviting offers or soliciting orders for the sale or the hire of goods or services,

but does not include—

(d) the delivery of pre-ordered goods of services to the purchaser of those goods or services or to the person nominated by the purchaser of those goods or services whether or not payment for those goods or services is accepted on delivery; or

the taking of further orders for goods or services from the purchaser of those preordered goods or services or from the person nominated by the purchaser of those preordered goods or services when those orders are taken at the same time as a previous order is being delivered, whether or not payment is made for those goods or services at the time of taking the order;



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- (e) the setting up of a stall or the conducting of a business at a stall under the authority of a stallholder's permit;
- (f) the selling or the offering for sale of goods and services to, or the soliciting of orders for goods and services from a person who sells those goods or services;
- (g) the selling or the offering for sale or hire by a person of goods of her or his own manufacture or services which he or she provides; and
- (h) the selling or hiring or the offering for sale or hire of—
 - (i) goods by a person who represents a manufacturer of the goods; or
 - (ii) services by a person who represents a provider of the services,

which are only sold directly to consumers and not through a shop.

Subdivision 2—Permits

6.2 Stallholder's permit

- (1) A person shall not conduct a stall on a public place unless that person is—
 - (a) the holder of a valid stallholder's permit; or
 - (b) an assistant specified in a valid stallholder's permit.
- (2) Every application for a stallholder's permit shall-
 - (a) state the full name and address of the applicant;
 - (b) specify the proposed number of assistants to be engaged by the applicant in conducting the stall, as well as their names and addresses if already engaged;
 - (c) specify the proposed location of the stall;
 - (d) specify the period of time for which the permit is sought, together with the proposed days and hours of operation;
 - (e) specify the proposed goods or services to be sold or hired or offered for sale or hire from the stall; and
 - (f) be accompanied by an accurate plan and description of the proposed stall.

6.3 Trader's permit

- (1) A person shall not carry on trading unless that person is—
 - (a) the holder of a valid trader's permit; or
 - (b) an assistant specified in a valid trader's permit.
- (2) Every application for a trader's permit shall—
 - (a) state the full name and address of the applicant;
 - (b) specify the proposed number of assistants, if any, to be engaged by the applicant in trading, as well as their names and addresses if already engaged;
 - (c) specify the location or locations in which the applicant proposes to trade;
 - (d) specify the period of time for which the permit is sought, together with the proposed days and hours of trading;
 - (e) specify the proposed goods or services which will be traded; and
 - (f) be accompanied by an accurate plan and description of any proposed structure or vehicle which may be used by the applicant in trading.
- (3) The conditions subject to which the local government may approve an application for a trader's permit include that the permit holder is permitted to remain at a particular location for as long as there is a customer making a purchase, but if there is no customer making a purchase the permit holder must move on from that location within a reasonable time of the last purchase having been made.

6.4 No permit required to sell newspaper

Notwithstanding any other provision of this local law, a person who sells, or offers for sale, a newspaper only is not required to obtain a permit.

6.5 Relevant considerations in determining application for permit

- (1) In determining an application for a permit for the purposes of this Division, the local government is to have regard to—
 - (a) any relevant policies of the local government;
 - (b) the desirability of the proposed activity;
 - (c) the location of the proposed activity;
 - (d) the principles set out in the Competition Principles Agreement; and
 - (e) such other matters as the local government may consider to be relevant in the circumstances of the case.
- (2) The local government may refuse to approve an application for a permit under this Division on any one or more of the following grounds—
 - (a) that the applicant has committed a breach of any provision of this local law or of any written law relevant to the activity in respect of which the permit is sought;



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- (b) that the applicant is not a desirable or suitable person to hold a permit;
- (c) that—

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- (i) the applicant is an undischarged bankrupt or is in liquidation;
- (ii) the applicant has entered into any composition or arrangement with creditors; or
- (iii) a manager, an administrator, a trustee, a receiver, or a receiver and manager has been appointed in relation to any part of the applicant's undertakings or property; or
- (d) such other grounds as the local government may consider to be relevant in the circumstances of the case.

6.6 Conditions of permit

- (1) If the local government approves an application for a permit under this Division subject to conditions, those conditions may include—
 - (a) the place, the part of the district, or the thoroughfare to which the permit applies;
 - (b) the days and hours during which a permit holder may conduct a stall or trade;
 - (c) the number, type, form and construction, as the case may be, of any stand, table, structure or vehicle which may be used in conducting a stall or in trading;
 - (d) the goods or services in respect of which a permit holder may conduct a stall or trade;
 - (e) the number of persons and the names of persons permitted to conduct a stall or trade:
 - (f) the requirement for personal attendance at the stall or the place of trading by the permit holder and the nomination of assistants, nominees or substitutes for the permit holder;
 - (g) whether and under what terms the permit is transferable;
 - (h) any prohibitions or restrictions concerning the-
 - (i) causing or making of any noise or disturbance which is likely to be a nuisance to persons in the vicinity of the permit holder;
 - (ii) the use of amplifiers, sound equipment and sound instruments;
 - (iii) the use of signs; and
 - (iv) the use of any lighting apparatus or device;
 - (i) the manner in which the permit holder's name and other details of a valid permit are to be displayed;
 - (j) the care, maintenance and cleansing of the stall or any structure used for trading and the place of the stall or any structure;
 - (k) the vacating of the place of a stall or trading when the stall is not being conducted or trading is not being carried on;
 - (l) the acquisition by the stallholder or trader of public risk insurance;
 - (m) the period for which the permit is valid; and
 - (n) the designation of any place or places where trading is wholly or from time to time prohibited by the local government.
- (2) Where a permit holder by reason of illness, accident or other sufficient cause is unable to comply with this local law, the local government may at the request of that permit holder authorize another person to be a nominee of the permit holder for a specified period, and this local law and the conditions of the permit shall apply to the nominee as if he or she was the permit holder.

6.7 Exemptions from requirement to pay fee or to obtain a permit

- (1) In this clause—
 - "charitable organisation" means an institution, association, club, society or body whether incorporated or not, the objects of which are of a charitable, benevolent, religious, cultural, educational, recreational, sporting or other like nature and from which any member does not receive any pecuniary profit except where the member is an employee or the profit is an honorarium; and
 - "commercial participant" means any person who is involved in operating a stall or in conducting any trading activity for personal gain or profit.
- (2) The local government may waive any fee required to be paid by an applicant for a stallholder's permit or a trader's permit on making an application for or on the issue of a permit, or may return any such fee which has been paid, if the stall is conducted or the trading is carried on—
 - (a) on a portion of a public place adjoining the normal place of business of the applicant; or
 - (b) by a charitable organisation that does not sublet space to, or involve commercial participants in the conduct of a stall or trading, and any assistants that may be specified in the permit are members of that charitable organisation.
- (3) The local government may exempt a person or a class of persons, whether or not in relation to a specified public place, from the requirements of this Division.

Subdivision 3—Conduct of stallholders and traders

6.8 Conduct of stallholders and traders

- (1) A stallholder while conducting a stall or a trader while trading shall—
 - (a) display her or his permit to do so in a conspicuous place on the stall, vehicle or temporary structure or if there is no stall, vehicle or temporary structure, carry the permit with her or him while conducting a stall or trading;



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- (b) not display a permit unless it is a valid permit; and
- (c) when selling goods by weight, carry and use for that purpose, scales tested and certified in accordance with the provisions of the *Trade Measurement Administration Act 2006*.
- (2) A stallholder or trader shall not-
 - (a) deposit or store any box or basket containing goods on any part of a thoroughfare so as to obstruct the movement of pedestrians or vehicles;
 - (b) act in an offensive manner:
 - (c) use or cause to be used any apparatus or device including any flap or shelf, whereby the dimensions of a stall, vehicle or structure are increased beyond those specified in the permit; or
 - (d) in the case of a trader, carry on trading from a public place, unless there is adequate parking for customers' vehicles reasonably close to the place of trading.

Division 2—Street entertainers Subdivision 1—Preliminary

6.9 Definition

In this Division, unless the context otherwise requires—

"perform" includes to play a musical instrument, sing, mime, dance, give an acrobatic or aerobic display or entertain, but does not include public speaking;

"permit" means a permit issued for the purpose of clause 6.10;

"permitted area" means the area or areas, specified in a permit, in which the permit holder may perform; and

"permitted time" means the time or times, specified in a permit, during which the permit holder may perform.

Subdivision 2—Permits

6.10 Permit required to perform

A person shall not perform in a public place without a permit.

6.11 Variation of permitted area and permitted time

- (1) The local government may by notice in writing to a permit holder vary—
 - (a) the permitted area;
 - (b) the permitted time; or
 - (c) both the permitted area and the permitted time,

shown on a permit.

(2) The local government may direct a permit holder to move from one permitted area to another permitted area, if more than one area is specified in a permit.

6.12 Duration of permit

A permit is valid for a period of 3 months after the date on which it is issued unless it is sooner cancelled under this local law.

6.13 Cancellation of permit

The CEO may cancel a permit if in her or his opinion the volume of sound caused by the permit holder in connection with the performance adversely affects the enjoyment, convenience or comfort of other persons in a public place, or if, in her or his opinion, or in the opinion of an authorized person, the performance otherwise constitutes a nuisance.

6.14 Obligations of permit holder

A permit holder shall not in a public place-

- (a) perform wearing dirty, torn or ragged clothing;
- (b) act in an offensive manner; or
- (c) place, install, erect, play or use any musical instrument or any device which emits music, including a loud speaker or an amplifier—
 - (i) other than in the permitted area; and
 - (ii) unless the musical instrument or device is specified in the permit.

Division 3—Outdoor eating facilities on public places

6.15 Definition

In this Division—

"Facility" means an outdoor eating Facility or establishment on any part of a public place, but does not include such a Facility or establishment on private land;

"permit holder" means the person to whom a permit has been issued for the purpose of clause 6.16; and

"public place" has the meaning given to it in clause 6.1.



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6.16 Permit required to conduct Facility

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A person shall not establish or conduct a Facility without a permit.

6.17 Matters to be considered in determining application

In determining an application for a permit for the purpose of clause 6.16, the local government may consider in addition to any other matter it considers relevant, whether or not—

- (a) the Facility is conducted in conjunction with and as an extension of food premises which abut on the Facility, and whether the applicant is the person conducting such food premises;
- (b) any abutting food premises are registered in accordance with the *Health Act 1911* and whether the use of the premises is permitted under the town planning scheme;
- (c) the Facility will comply with any local law made under section 172 of the Health Act 1911;
- (d) users of the Facility will have access to proper and sufficient sanitary and ablutionary conveniences;
- (e) the Facility would-
 - (i) obstruct the visibility or clear sight lines at an intersection of thoroughfares of any person; or
 - (ii) impede pedestrian access; and
- (f) the tables, chairs and other equipment to be used may obstruct or impede the use of the public place for the purpose for which it was designed.

6.18 Obligations of permit holder

- (1) The permit holder for a Facility shall—
 - (a) ensure that the Facility is conducted at all times in accordance with the provisions of this local law and any local law made under section 172 of the *Health Act 1911*;
 - (b) ensure that the eating area is kept in a clean and tidy condition at all times;
 - (c) maintain the chairs, tables and other structures in the eating area in a good, clean and serviceable condition at all times;
 - (d) be solely responsible for all and any costs associated with the removal, alteration, repair, reinstatement or reconstruction of any part of the public place arising from the conduct of the Facility; and
 - (e) be solely responsible for all rates and taxes levied upon the land occupied by the Facility.
- (2) Whenever, in the opinion of the local government, any work is required to be carried out to a Facility, the local government may give a notice to the permit holder for the Facility to carry out that work within the time limited by the notice.
- (3) In subclause (2), "work" includes the removal, alteration, repair, reinstatement or reconstruction of any part of a public place arising from or in connection with the setting up or conduct of a Facility.

6.19 Removal of Facility unlawfully conducted

Where a Facility is conducted without a permit, or in contravention of a condition of a permit, any tables, chairs, umbrellas or other equipment may be removed by an authorized person and impounded in accordance with the Act.

6.20 Use of Facility by public

- (1) A person shall not occupy a chair or otherwise use the equipment in a Facility the subject of a permit unless the person uses them for the purpose of consuming food or drinks provided by the Facility.
- (2) A person shall leave a Facility when requested to do so by the permit holder.

6.21 Temporary removal of Facility may be requested

- (1) The permit holder for a Facility is to temporarily remove the Facility when requested to do so on reasonable grounds by an authorized person or a member of the Police Service or an emergency service
- (2) The permit holder may replace the Facility removed under subclause (1) as soon as the person who directed her or him to remove it allows it to be replaced.

PART 7—PERMITS

Division 1—Applying for a permit

7.1 Application for permit

- (1) Where a person is required to obtain a permit under this local law, that person shall apply for the permit in accordance with subclause (2).
- (2) An application for a permit under this local law shall—
 - (a) be in the form determined by the local government;
 - (b) be signed by the applicant;
 - (c) provide the information required by the form; and
 - (d) be forwarded to the CEO together with any fee imposed and determined by the local government under and in accordance with sections 6.16 to 6.19 of the Act.

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- (3) The local government may require an applicant to provide additional information reasonably related to an application before determining an application for a permit.
- (4) The local government may require an applicant to give local public notice of the application for a permit.
- (5) The local government may refuse to consider an application for a permit which is not in accordance with subclause (2).

7.2 Decision on application for permit

- (1) The local government may-
 - (a) approve an application for a permit unconditionally or subject to any conditions; or
 - (b) refuse to approve an application for a permit.
- (2) If the local government approves an application for a permit, it is to issue to the applicant a permit in the form determined by the local government.
- (3) If the local government refuses to approve an application for a permit, it is to give written notice of that refusal to the applicant.
- (4) Where a clause of this local law refers to conditions which may be imposed on a permit or which are to be taken to be imposed on a permit, the clause does not limit the power of the local government to impose other conditions on the permit under subclause (1)(a).
- (5) Where a clause of this local law refers to the grounds on which an application for a permit may be or is to be refused, the clause does not limit the power of the local government to refuse the application for a permit on other grounds under subclause (1)(b).

Division 2—Conditions

7.3 Conditions which may be imposed on a permit

The local government may approve an application for a permit subject to conditions relating to—

- (a) the payment of a fee:
- (b) the duration and commencement of the permit;
- (c) the commencement of the permit being contingent on the happening of an event;
- (d) the rectification, remedying or restoration of a situation or circumstance reasonably related to the application;
- (e) the approval of another application for a permit which may be required by the local government under any written law;
- (f) the area of the district to which the permit applies;
- (g) where a permit is issued for an activity which will or may cause damage to a public place, the payment of a deposit or bond against such damage;
- (h) the obtaining of public risk insurance in an amount and on terms reasonably required by the local government; and
- (i) the provision of an indemnity from the permit holder indemnifying the local government in respect of any injury to any person or any damage to any property which may occur in connection with the use of the public place by the permit holder.

7.4 Imposing conditions under a policy

- (1) In this clause-
 - "policy" means a policy of the local government adopted by the Council containing conditions subject to which an application for a permit may be approved under paragraph 7.2(1)(a).
- (2) Under paragraph 7.2(1)(a) the local government may approve an application subject to conditions by reference to a policy.
- (3) The local government is to give a copy of the policy, or the part of the policy which is relevant to the application for a permit, with the form of permit referred to in subclause 7.2(2).
- (4) An application for a permit is to be taken not to have been approved subject to the conditions contained in a policy until the local government gives the permit holder a copy of the policy or the part of the policy which is relevant to the application.
- (5) Sections 5.94 and 5.95 of the Act shall apply to a policy and for that purpose a policy is to be taken to be information within section 5.94(u)(i) of the Act.

7.5 Compliance with and variation of conditions

- (1) Where an application for a permit has been approved subject to conditions, or where a permit is to be taken to be subject to conditions under this local law, the permit holder shall comply with each of those conditions.
- (2) The local government may vary the conditions of a permit, and the permit holder shall comply with those conditions as varied.

7.6 Duration of permit

A permit is valid for one year from the date on which it is issued, unless it is—

- (a) otherwise stated in this local law or in the permit; or
- (b) cancelled under clause 7.10.



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7.7 Renewal of permit

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- (1) A permit holder may apply to the local government in writing prior to expiry of a permit for the renewal of the permit.
- (2) The provisions of-
 - (a) this Part; and
 - (b) any other provision of this local law relevant to the permit which is to be renewed,

shall apply to an application for the renewal of a permit mutatis mutandis.

7.8 Transfer of permit

- (1) An application for the transfer of a valid permit is to-
 - (a) be made in writing;
 - (b) be signed by the permit holder and the proposed transferee of the permit;
 - (c) provide such information as the local government may require to enable the application to be determined: and
 - (d) be forwarded to the CEO together with any fee imposed and determined by the local government under and in accordance with sections 6.16 to 6.19 of the Act.
- (2) The local government may approve an application for the transfer of a permit, refuse to approve it or approve it subject to any conditions.
- (3) Where the local government approves an application for the transfer of a permit, the transfer may be effected by—
 - (a) an endorsement on the permit signed by the CEO; or
 - (b) issuing to the transferee a permit in the form determined by the local government.
- (4) Where the local government approves an application for the transfer of a permit, it is not required to refund any part of any fee paid by the former permit holder.

7.9 Production of permit

A permit holder is to produce to an authorized person her or his permit immediately upon being required to do so by that authorized person.

7.10 Cancellation of permit

- (1) Subject to clause 8.1, a permit may be cancelled by the local government if the permit holder has not complied with a-
 - (a) condition of the permit; or
 - (b) provision of any written law which may relate to the activity regulated by the permit.
- (2) On the cancellation of a permit the permit holder-
 - (a) shall return the permit as soon as practicable to the local government; and
 - (b) is to be taken to have forfeited any fees paid in respect of the permit.

PART 8—OBJECTIONS AND APPEALS

8.1 Application of Part 9 Division 1 of Act

When the local government makes a decision—

- (a) under clause 7.2(1); or
- (b) as to whether it will renew, vary, or cancel a permit,

the provisions of Division 1 of Part 9 of the Act and regulation 33 of the Regulations apply to that decision.

PART 9—MISCELLANEOUS NOTICES

9.1 Notice to redirect or repair sprinkler

Where a lawn or a garden is being watered with a sprinkler which is on the lawn or the garden, in a manner which causes or may cause an inconvenience or obstruction to any person using a thoroughfare, the local government may give a notice to the owner or the occupier of the land abutting on the lawn or the garden, requiring the owner or the occupier or both to move or alter the direction of the sprinkler or other watering equipment.

9.2 Hazardous plants

- (1) Where a plant in a garden creates or may create a hazard for any person using a thoroughfare, the local government may give a notice to the owner or the occupier of the land abutting on the garden to remove, cut, move or otherwise deal with that plant so as to remove the hazard.
- (2) Subclause (1) does not apply where the plant was planted by the local government.

9.3 Notice to repair damage to thoroughfare

Where any portion of a thoroughfare has been damaged, the local government may by notice to the person who caused the damage order the person to repair or replace that portion of the thoroughfare to the satisfaction of the local government.



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9.4 Notice to remove thing unlawfully placed on thoroughfare

Where any thing is placed on a thoroughfare in contravention of this local law, the local government may by notice in writing to the owner or the occupier of the property which abuts on that portion of the thoroughfare where the thing has been placed, or such other person who may be responsible for the thing being so placed, require the relevant person to remove the thing.

PART 10—ENFORCEMENT

Division 1—Notices given under this local law

10.1 Offence to fail to comply with notice

Whenever the local government gives a notice under this local law requiring a person to do any thing, if the person fails to comply with the notice, the person commits an offence.

10.2 Local government may undertake requirements of notice

Where a person fails to comply with a notice referred to in clause 10.1, the local government may do the thing specified in the notice and recover from that person, as a debt, the costs incurred in so doing

Division 2—Offences and penalties Subdivision 1—General

10.3 Offences

- (1) Any person who fails to do anything required or directed to be done under this local law, or who does anything which under this local law that person is prohibited from doing, commits an offence.
- (2) Any person who commits an offence under this local law is liable, upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding \$5,000, and if the offence is of a continuing nature, to an additional penalty not exceeding \$500 for each day or part of a day during which the offence has continued.

Subdivision 2—Infringement notices and modified penalties

10.4 Prescribed offences

- (1) An offence against a clause specified in Schedule 1 is a prescribed offence for the purposes of section 9.16(1) of the Act.
- (2) The amount of the modified penalty for a prescribed offence is that specified adjacent to the clause in Schedule 1.
- (3) For the purpose of guidance only, before giving an infringement notice to a person in respect of the commission of a prescribed offence, an authorized person should be satisfied that—
 - (a) commission of the prescribed offence is a relatively minor matter; and
 - (b) only straightforward issues of law and fact are involved in determining whether the prescribed offence was committed, and the facts in issue are readily ascertainable.

10.5 Forms

Unless otherwise specified, for the purposes of this local law—

- (a) where a vehicle is involved in the commission of an offence, the form of the notice referred to in section 9.13 of the Act is that of Form 1 in Schedule 1 of the Regulations;
- (b) the form of the infringement notice given under section 9.16 of the Act is that of Form 2 in Schedule 1 of the Regulations; and
- (c) the form of the notice referred to in section 9.20 of the Act is that of Form 3 in Schedule 1 of the Regulations.

BACKGROUND / DETAILS

In accordance with s.3.16 of the Local Government Act 1995 (the Act), the Shire completed a statutory review of the Extractive Industries Local Law 2008. This process has now been completed and therefore Officers are requesting to initiate s.3.12 of the Act in order to commence the amendment process.

During the statutory review process staff provided their recommendations for amendment of this Local Law. No comments were received from members of the community.

Council, at its meeting held 19 July 2017, subsequently resolved to undertake an amendment of the Shire's Extractive Industries Local Law 2008.

Section 3.12 of the Act prescribes the statutory procedures for making an amendment local law, requiring:

- The purpose and effect of the proposed amendment local law is to be included in the agenda and the minutes of the meeting at which they are considered.
- A Statewide and Local public notice of the proposed amendment local law is to be published, detailing:



- o The purpose and effect of the proposed amendment local law;
- Where a copy of the proposed amendment local law may be inspected; and
- o A minimum 6 weeks public submission period.
- A copy of the notice and the proposed amendment local law is to be provided to the Minister for Local Government and any other Minister responsible for administering the Act/s under which the Local Law is proposed to be made.
- After the close of the public submission period, a further report will be presented to Council to enable Council's consideration of any public submissions and, where the consequentially proposed local law is not substantially different from that advertised in the public notice, the Council may then resolve by absolute majority to make the amendment local law.
- The amendment local law must then be published in the Government Gazette and a copy of the gazetted amendment local law is to be provided to the relevant Minister/s and the Parliamentary Joint Standing Committee on Delegated Legislation.
- A Local Public Notice must then be given stating the title of the amendment local law, a summary of its purpose and effect and advising where copies may be inspected or obtained.

This report seeks to commence the s.3.12 process, to initiate the Shire of Northam Extractive Industries Amendment Local Law 2017.

EXTRACTIVE INDUSTRIES LOCAL LAW 2008

Under the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1995* and by all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Northam resolved on 23rd July 2008 to make the following local law.

PART 1—PRELIMINARY

1.1 Citation

This local law may be cited as the Shire of Northam Extractive Industries Local Law 2008.

1.2 Definitions

In this local law, unless the context otherwise requires—

- "Act" means the Local Government Act 1995;
 - "carry on an extractive industry" means quarrying and excavating for stone, gravel, sand, and other material;
 - "CEO" means the Chief Executive Officer of the local government;
 - "Council" means the Council of the Shire of Northam;
 - "district" means the district of the local government;
 - "excavation" includes quarry;
 - "extractive industry" means quarrying and excavating for any stone, gravel, sands, clay, limestone, loam or other material;
 - "infrastructure" means any building, treatment works, screening device, tank or structure;
 - "land", unless the context otherwise requires, means the land on which the applicant proposes carrying on the extractive industry to which the licence application relates;
 - "licence" means a licence issued under this local law;
 - "licensee" means the person named in the licence as the licensee;
 - "local government" means the Shire of Northam;
 - "occupier" has the meaning given to it in the Act;
 - "owner" has the meaning given to it in the Act;
 - "person" does not include the local government;
 - "secured sum" means the sum required to be paid or the amount of a bond, guarantee or other security under clause 5.1;
 - "site" means the land specified by the local government in a licence.

1.3 Application

- (1) The provisions of this local law— $\,$
 - (a) subject to paragraphs (b), (c), (d) and (e)—
 - (i) apply and have force and effect throughout the whole of the district; and
 - (ii) apply to every excavation whether commenced prior to or following the coming into operation of this local law;
 - (b) do not apply to the extraction of minerals under the Mining Act 1978;
 - (c) do not apply to the carrying on of an extractive industry on Crown land;
 - (d) do not apply to the carrying on of an extractive industry on land by the owner or occupier of that land for use on that land; and
 - (e) do not affect the validity of any licence issued under the local law repealed by clause 1.4 of this local law if that licence is currently in force at the date of gazettal of this local law.
- (2) In subclause (1)(d) land includes adjoining lots or locations in the same occupation or ownership of the owner or occupier referred to in subclause (1)(d).



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1.4 Repeal

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The following local laws are repealed-

- Shire of Northam Extractive Industries Local Law 2004 published in the Government Gazette
 of 8 February 2005.
- Town of Northam Local Government Model By-laws (Extractive Industries) No 9 published in the Government Gazette on 12 March 1963 and as amended and published in the Government Gazette on 4 August 1965.

PART 2—LICENSING REQUIREMENTS FOR AN EXTRACTIVE INDUSTRY

2.1.Extractive Industries Prohibited Without Licence

A person must not carry on an extractive industry-

- (a) unless the person is the holder of a valid and current licence; and
- (b) otherwise than in accordance with any terms and conditions set out in, or applying in respect of, the licence.

Penalty \$5000 and a daily penalty not exceeding a fine of \$500 in respect of each day or part of a day during which an offence has continued.

2.2 Applicant To Advertise Proposal

- (1) Unless the local government first approves otherwise, a person seeking the issue of a licence shall, before applying to the local government for a licence—
 - (a) forward by registered mail a notice in the form determined by the local government from time to time to—
 - (i) the owners and occupiers of all land adjoining the land upon which it is proposed to excavate, or within an area determined by the local government as likely to be affected by the granting of a licence, advising of the application and specifying that they may, within twenty-one days from the date of service of the letter, object to or make representations in writing in respect of the issue of a licence by the local government;
 - (ii) every authority or person having control or jurisdiction over any of the things referred to in subclause 2.3(1)(a)(vii) and (viii) within 500 metres from the boundaries of the land, or within an area determined by the local government as likely to be affected by the granting of a licence; and
 - (b) as soon as practicable after complying with the requirements of paragraph (a)—
 - (i) forward a copy of the notice to the CEO; and
 - (ii) publish the notice in a newspaper circulating in the area in which the proposed excavation is located.
- (2) The local government may, within 14 days after receiving a copy of a notice referred to in subclause (1), cause to be displayed, or require the proposed applicant to display, in a prominent position on the land one or more notices—
 - (a) in the form determined by the local government from time to time;
 - (b) the content, size and construction of which have been approved by the CEO;
 - (c) specifying particulars of the proposed excavation; and
 - (d) inviting objections or comments within 21 days from the placement of the notice.

2.3 Application For Licence

- (1) Subject to subclause (3), a person seeking the issue of a licence in respect of any land shall apply in the form determined by the local government from time to time and must forward the application duly completed and signed by each of the applicant, the owner of the land and any occupier of the land to the CEO together with—
 - (a) three copies of a plan of the excavation site to a scale of between 1:500 and 1:2000 showing— $\frac{1}{2}$
 - (i) the existing and proposed land contours based on the Australian Height Datum and plotted at 1 metre contour intervals;
 - (ii) the land on which the excavation site is to be located;
 - (iii) the external surface dimensions of the land;
 - (iv) the location and depth of the existing and proposed excavation of the land;
 - (v) the location of existing and proposed thoroughfares or other means of vehicle access to and egress from the land and to public thoroughfares in the vicinity of the land;
 - (vi) the location of buildings, treatment plant, tanks and other improvements and developments existing on, approved for or proposed in respect of the land;
 - (vii) the location of existing power lines, telephone cables and any associated poles or pylons, sewers, pipelines, reserves, bridges, railway lines and registered grants of easement or other encumbrances over, on, under or adjacent to or in the vicinity of the land;
 - (viii) the location of all existing dams, watercourses, drains or sumps on or adjacent to the land;
 - (ix) the location and description of existing and proposed fences, gates and warning signs around the land; and



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- (x) the location of the areas proposed to be used for stockpiling excavated material, treated material, overburden and soil storage on the land and elsewhere;
- (b) three copies of a works and excavation programme containing—
 - (i) the nature and estimated duration of the proposed excavation for which the licence is applied;
 - (ii) the stages and the timing of the stages in which it is proposed to carry out the excavation;
 - (iii) details of the methods to be employed in the proposed excavation and a description of any on-site processing works;
 - (iv) details of the depth and extent of the existing and proposed excavation of the site;
 - (v) an estimate of the depth of and description of the nature and quantity of the overburden to be removed;
 - (vi) a description of the methods by which existing vegetation is to be cleared and topsoil and overburden removed or stockpiled;
 - (vii) a description of the means of access to the excavation site and the types of thoroughfares to be constructed;
 - (viii) details of the proposed number and size of trucks entering and leaving the site each day and the route or routes to be taken by those vehicles;
 - (ix) a description of any proposed buildings, water supply, treatment plant, tanks and other improvements;
 - (x) details of drainage conditions applicable to the land and methods by which the excavation site is to be kept drained;
 - (xi) a description of the measures to be taken to minimise sand drift, dust nuisance, erosion, watercourse siltation and dangers to the general public;
 - (xii) a description of the measures to be taken to comply with the Environmental Protection (Noise) Regulations 1997;
 - (xiii) a description of the existing site environment and a report on the anticipated effect that the proposed excavation will have on the environment in the vicinity of the land;
 - (xiv) details of the nature of existing vegetation, shrubs and trees and a description of measures to be taken to minimise the destruction of existing vegetation; and
 - (xv) a description of the measures to be taken in screening the excavation site, or otherwise minimising adverse visual impacts, from nearby thoroughfares or other areas;
- (c) three copies of a rehabilitation and decommissioning programme indicating—
 - (i) the objectives of the programme, having due regard to the nature of the surrounding area and the proposed end-use of the excavation site;
 - (ii) whether restoration and reinstatement of the excavation site is to be undertaken progressively or upon completion of excavation operations;
 - (iii) how any face is to be made safe and batters sloped;
 - (iv) the method by which topsoil is to be replaced and revegetated;
 - (v) the numbers and types of trees and shrubs to be planted and other landscaping features to be developed;
 - (vi) how rehabilitated areas are to be maintained; and
 - (vii) the programme for the removal of buildings, plant, waste and final site clean up;
- (d) evidence that a datum peg has been established on the land related to a point approved by the local government on the surface of a constructed public thoroughfare or such other land in the vicinity;
- (e) a certificate from a licensed surveyor certifying the correctness of—
 - (i) the plan referred to in paragraph (a); and
 - (ii) the datum peg and related point referred to in paragraph (d);
- (f) evidence that the requirements of subclauses 2.2(1) and (2) have been carried out;
- (g) copies of all land use planning approvals required under any planning legislation;
- (h) copies of any environmental approval required under any environmental legislation;(i) copies of any geotechnical information relating to the excavation site;
- (j) the consent in writing to the application from the owner of the excavation site;
- (k) the licence application fee specified by the local government from time to time; and
- (l) any other information that the local government may reasonably require.
- (2) All survey data supplied by an applicant for the purpose of subclause (1) shall comply with Australian Height Datum and Australian Map Grid standards.
- (3) Where in relation to a proposed excavation—
 - (a) the surface area is not to exceed 2,000 square metres; and
 - (b) the extracted material is not to exceed 2,000 cubic metres;

the local government may exempt a person making application for a licence under subclause (1) from supplying any of the data specified in paragraphs (b), (d), (e) and (i) of subclause (1).



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PART 3—DETERMINATION OF APPLICATION

3.1 Determination Of Application

- (1) The local government may refuse to consider an application for a licence that does not comply with the requirements of clause 2.3, and in any event shall refuse an application for a licence where planning approval for an extractive industry use of the land has not first been obtained.
- (2) The local government may, in respect of an application for a licence—
 - (a) refuse the application; or
 - (b) approve the application-
 - (i) over the whole or part of the land in respect of which the application is made; and
 - (ii) on such terms and conditions, if any, as it sees fit.
- (3) Where the local government approves an application for a licence, it shall—
 - (a) determine the licence period, not exceeding 10 years from the date of issue; and
 - (b) approve the issue of a licence in the form determined by the local government from time to time.
- (4) Where the local government approves the issue of a licence, the CEO upon receipt by the local government of—
 - (a) payment of the annual licence fee, or the relevant proportion of the annual licence fee to 30 June, determined by the local government from time to time;
 - (b) payment of the secured sum, if any, imposed under clause 5.1;
 - (c) the documents, if any, executed to the satisfaction of the CEO, under clause 5.1; and
 - (d) a copy of the public liability insurance policy required under subclause 7.1(1) shall issue the licence to the applicant.
- (5) Without limiting subclause (2), the local government may impose conditions in respect of the following matters—
 - (a) the orientation of the excavation to reduce visibility from other land;
 - (b) the appropriate siting of access thoroughfares, buildings and plant;
 - (c) the stockpiling of material;
 - (d) the hours during which any excavation work may be carried out;
 - (e) the hours during which any processing plant associated with, or located on, the site may be operated;
 - (f) requiring all crushing and treatment plant to be enclosed within suitable buildings to minimise the emission of noise, dust, vapour and general nuisance to the satisfaction of the local government:
 - (g) the depths below which a person shall not excavate;
 - (h) distances from adjoining land or thoroughfares within which a person must not excavate:
 - (i) the safety of persons employed at or visiting the excavation site;
 - (j) the control of dust and wind-blown material;
 - (k) the planting, care and maintenance of trees, shrubs and other landscaping features during the time in which the extractive industry is carried out in order to effectively screen the area to be excavated and to provide for progressive rehabilitation;
 - (l) the prevention of the spread of dieback, declared plants or other disease;
 - (m) the drainage of the excavation site and the disposal of water;
 - (n) the restoration and reinstatement of the excavation site, the staging of such works, and the minimising of the destruction of vegetation:
 - (o) the provision of retaining walls to prevent subsidence of any portion of the excavation or of land abutting the excavation;
 - (p) requiring the licensee to furnish to the local government a surveyor's certificate each year, prior to the renewal fee being payable, to certify the quantity of material extracted and that material has not been excavated below the final contour levels outlined within the approved excavation programme;
 - (q) requiring the licensee to enter into an agreement with the local government by which it agrees to pay any extraordinary expenses incurred by the local government in repairing damage caused to thoroughfares in the district by heavy or extraordinary traffic conducted by or on behalf of the licensee under the licence;
 - (r) requiring the licensee to enter into an agreement with the local government in respect of any condition or conditions imposed under this local law; and
 - (s) any other matter for properly regulating the carrying on of an extractive industry.

3.2 Payment Of Annual Licence Fee

On or before 30 June in each year, a licensee shall pay to the local government the annual licence fee determined by the local government from time to time.



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PART 4—TRANSFER, CANCELLATION AND RENEWAL OF LICENCE

4.1 Transfer Of Licence

- (1) An application for the transfer of a licence shall—
 - (a) be made in writing;
 - (b) be signed by the licensee and the proposed transferee of the licence;
 - (c) be accompanied by the current licence;
 - (d) be accompanied by the consent in writing to the transfer from the owner of the excavation site:
 - (e) include any information that the local government may reasonably require; and
 - (f) be forwarded to the CEO together with the fee determined by the local government from time to time.
- (2) Upon receipt of any application for the transfer of a licence, the local government may—
 - (a) refuse the application; or
 - (b) approve the application on such terms and conditions, if any, as it sees fit.
- (3) Where the local government approves an application for the transfer of a licence, the local government shall transfer the licence by an endorsement on the licence in the form determined by the local government from time to time, signed by the Chief Executive Officer.
- (4) Where the local government approves the transfer of a licence it shall not be required to refund any part of the fees paid by the former licensee in respect of the transferred licence.

4.2 Cancellation Of Licence

- (1) The local government may cancel a licence where the licensee has-
 - (a) been convicted of an offence against-
 - (i) this local law: or
 - (ii) any other law relating to carrying on an extractive industry; or
 - (b) transferred or assigned or attempted to transfer or assign the licence without the consent of the local government;
 - (c) permitted another person to carry on an extractive industry otherwise than in accordance with the terms and conditions of the licence and of the provisions of this local law;
 - (d) failed to pay the annual licence fee under clause 3.2; or
 - (e) failed to have a current public liability insurance policy under subclause 7.1(1) or failed to provide a copy of the policy or evidence of its renewal as the case may be, under subclause 7.1(2).
- (2) Where the local government cancels a licence under this clause—
 - (a) the local government shall advise the licensee in writing of the cancellation;
 - (b) the cancellation takes effect on and from the day on which the licensee is served with the cancellation advice; and
 - (c) the local government shall not be required to refund any part of the fees paid by the licensee in respect of the cancelled licence.

4.3 Renewal Of Licence

- (1) A licensee who wishes to renew a licence must apply in writing to the local government at least 45 days before the date of expiry of the licence and shall submit with the application for renewal—
 - (a) the fee determined by the local government from time to time;
 - (b) a copy of the current licence;
 - (c) a plan showing the contours of the excavation carried out to the date of that application;
 - (d) details of the works, excavation and rehabilitation stages reached and of any changes or proposed changes with respect to any of the things referred to in subclauses 2.3(1) (b) and (c); and
 - (e) any other things referred to in clauses 2.3 and 3.1.
- (2) The local government may waive any of the requirements specified in subclause 4.3 (1) (d) or (e).

(3) If—

- (a) an application to renew a licence is in relation to land in respect of which the current licence was issued less than 12 months prior to the date from which the new licence if granted would apply; and
- (b) the methods to be employed in the proposed land excavation are identical to those being employed at the date of the application,

then the applicant shall not be obliged, unless otherwise required by the local government to submit details of any of the things referred to in clauses 2.3 and 3.1.

- (4) Upon receipt of an application for the renewal of a licence, the local government may;
 - (a) refuse the application; or
 - (b) approve the application on such terms and conditions, if any, as it sees fit.



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PART 5—SECURED SUM AND APPLICATION THEREOF

5.1 Security For Restoration And Reinstatement

- (1) For the purpose of ensuring that an excavation site is properly restored or reinstated, the local government may require that—
 - (a) as a condition of a licence; or
 - (b) before the issue of a licence.

the licensee shall give to the local government a bond, bank guarantee or other security, of a kind and in a form acceptable to the local government, in or for a sum determined by the local government from time to time.

(2) A bond required under subclause (1) is to be paid into a fund established by the local government for the purposes of this clause.

5.2 Use By The Local Government Of Secured Sum

- (1) If a licensee fails to carry out or complete the restoration and reinstatement works within the time specified in those conditions either—
 - (a) within the time specified in those conditions; or
 - (b) where no such time has been specified, within 60 days of the completion of the excavation or portion of the excavation specified in the licence conditions, then; subject to the local government giving the licensee 14 days notice of its intention to do so—
 - (c) the local government may carry out or cause to be carried out the required restoration and reinstatement work or so much of that work as remains undone; and
 - (d) the licensee shall pay to the local government on demand all costs incurred by the local government or which the local government may be required to pay under this clause.
- (2) The local government may apply the proceeds of any bond, bank guarantee or other security provided by the licensee under clause 5.1 towards its costs under this clause.
- (3) The liability of a licensee to pay the local government's costs under this clause is not limited to the amount, if any, secured under clause 5.1.

PART 6—LIMITATIONS, OBLIGATIONS OF THE LICENSEE AND PROHIBITIONS

6.1 Limits On Excavation Near Boundary

Subject to any licence conditions imposed by the local government, a person shall not, without the written approval of the local government, excavate within—

- (a) twenty metres of the boundary of any land on which the excavation site is located;
- (b) twenty metres of any land affected by a registered grant of easement;
- (c) forty metres of any thoroughfare; or
- (d) forty metres of any watercourse.

Penalty \$2,000

6.2 Obligations Of The Licensee

A licensee shall—

- (a) where the local government so requires, securely fence the excavation to a standard determined by the local government and keep the gateways locked when not actually in use in order to prevent unauthorised entry;
- (b) erect and maintain warning signs along each of the boundaries of the area excavated under the licence so that each sign—
 - (i) is not more than 200 metres apart;
 - (ii) is not less than 1.8 metres high and not less than 1 metre wide; and
 - (iii) bears the words "DANGER EXCAVATIONS KEEP OUT";
- (c) except where the local government approves otherwise, drain and keep drained to the local government's satisfaction any excavation to which the licence applies so as to prevent the accumulation of water;
- (d) restore and reinstate the excavation site in accordance with the terms and conditions of the licence, the site plans and the works and excavation programme approved by the local government:
- (e) take all reasonable steps to prevent the emission of dust, noise, vibration and other forms of nuisance from the excavation site; and
- (f) otherwise comply with the conditions imposed by the local government in accordance with clause 3.1.

Penalty \$5,000 for each offence, and if an offence is of a continuing nature, to a daily penalty not exceeding a fine of \$500.00 in respect of each day or part of a day during which the offence has continued.

6.3 Prohibitions

A licensee shall not-

(a) remove any trees or shrubs within 40 metres (or such lesser distance as may be allowed, in writing, by the local government) of the boundary of any thoroughfare on land in respect of



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which a licence has been granted, except for the purpose of constructing access thoroughfares, erecting buildings or installing plant for use in connection with the excavation and then only with the express approval of the local government and subject to any conditions which the local government may impose in accordance with clause 3.1;

- (b) store, or permit to be stored, any explosives or explosive devices on the site to which the licence applies other than with the approval of the local government and the Department of Industry and Resources; or
- (c) fill or excavate, other than in accordance with the terms and conditions of the licence, the site plans and the works and excavation programme approved by the local government.

Penalty \$5,000 for each offence, and if an offence is of a continuing nature, to a daily penalty not exceeding a fine of \$500.00 in respect of each day or part of a day during which the offence has continued.

6.4 Blasting

- (1) A person shall not carry out or permit to be carried out any blasting in the course of excavating unless—
 - (a) the local government has otherwise given approval in respect of blasting generally or in the case of each blast;
 - (b) subject to subclause (2), the blasting takes place only between the hours of 8.00am and 5.00pm, or as determined by the local government, on Mondays to Fridays inclusive;
 - (c) the blasting is carried out in strict accordance with the AS2187 SAA Explosives Code, the Mines Safety and Inspection Act 1994, the Environmental Protection Act 1986, and all relevant local laws of the local government; and
 - (d) in compliance with any other conditions imposed by the local government concerning—
 - (i) the time and duration of blasting;
 - (ii) the purposes for which the blasting may be used; and
 - (iii) such other matters as the local government may reasonably require in the interests of the safety and protection of members of the public and of property within the district.

Penalty \$5,000.00 for each offence, and if the offence is of a continuing nature, to a daily penalty not exceeding a fine of \$500.00 in respect of each day or part of a day during which the offence has continued.

(2) A person shall not carry out or permit to be carried out any blasting on a Saturday, Sunday or Public Holiday except with the prior approval of the local government.

Penalty \$2,000

PART 7-MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

7.1 Public Liability

- (1) A licensee shall have at all times a current public liability insurance policy taken out in the joint names of the licensee and the local government indemnifying the licensee and the local government for a sum of not less than \$10,000,000 in respect of any one claim relating to any of the excavation operations.
- (2) The licensee shall provide to the local government a copy of the policy taken out under subclause (1), within 14 days after the issue of that policy and shall provide to the local government evidence of renewal within 14 days of each renewal date.

7.2 Mines Safety and Inspection Act and Environmental Protection Act

- (1) In any case where the Mines Safety and Inspection Act 1994 or the Environmental Protection Act 1986 applies to any excavation carried on or proposed to be carried on at a site, the licensee in respect of that site shall—
 - (a) comply with all applicable provisions of that Act or those Acts; and
 - (b) provide to the local government within 14 days full particulars of any inspection or report made under that Act or those Acts.
- (2) In this clause, the Mines Safety and Inspection Act 1994 and the Environmental Protection Act 1986 include all subsidiary legislation made under those Acts.

7.3 Notice Of Cessation Of Operations

- (1) Where a licensee intends to cease carrying on an extractive industry—
 - (a) temporarily for a period in excess of 12 months; or
 - (b) permanently

the licensee shall, as well as complying with clause 7.4, give the local government written notice of the cessation not later than 1 week after those operations have ceased.

- (2) Where a licensee has given written notice to the local government of the intention to permanently cease carrying on an extractive industry on the site to which the licence applies the licence is deemed to have expired on the date such cessation is so notified.
- (3) The temporary or permanent cessation of the carrying on of an extractive industry on a site or the deemed expiration or cancellation of a licence does not entitle the licensee to any refund of any licence fee.

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7.4 Works To Be Carried Out On Cessation Of Operations

Where the carrying on of an extractive industry on the site permanently ceases or on the expiration or cancellation of the licence applicable to the site, whichever first occurs, the licensee shall, as well as complying with the provisions of clause 7.3—

- (a) restore and reinstate the excavated site in accordance with the proposals approved by the local government or in such other manner as the local government may subsequently agree in writing with the licensee;
- (b) ensure that any face permitted to remain upon the excavation site is left safe with all loose materials removed and where the excavation site is—
 - (i) sand, the sides are sloped to a batter of not more than 1:3 (vertical:horizontal); and
 - (ii) limestone or material other than sand, the sides are sloped to a batter which, in the opinion of the local government, would enable the site to be left in a stable condition;
- (c) ensure that the agreed floor level of the excavation is graded to an even surface or is otherwise in accordance with the rehabilitation and decommissioning programme approved by the local government;
- (d) ensure that all stockpiles or dumps of stone, sand or other materials are left so that no portion of that material can escape onto land not owned or occupied by the licensee nor into any stream, watercourse or drain that is not wholly situated within the land owned or occupied by the licensee;
- (e) erect retaining walls where necessary to prevent subsidence of land in the vicinity of any excavation:
- (f) remove from the site all buildings, plant and equipment erected, installed or used for or in relation to the carrying on of an extractive industry on the site and fill all holes remaining after such removal to the level of the surrounding ground and compact such filled holes sufficiently to prevent settling; and
- (g) break up, scarify, cover with topsoil and plant with grass, trees and shrubs all parts of the site where buildings, plant and equipment were erected or installed and all areas which were used for stockpiling unless otherwise specified under this local law.

Penalty \$5,000 for each offence, and if the offence is of a continuing nature, to a daily penalty not exceeding a fine of \$500.00 in respect of each day or part of a day during which the offence has continued.

PART 8—OBJECTIONS AND APPEALS

8.1 Objections and Appeals

When the local government makes a decision as to whether it will—

- (a) grant a person a licence under this local law; or
- (b) renew, vary, or cancel a licence that a person has under this local law,

the provisions of Division 1 of Part 9 of the Act and regulation 33 of the Local Government (Functions and General) Regulations 1996 shall apply to that decision.

PART 9-MODIFIED PENALTIES

9.1 Prescribed Offence

An offence against a clause specified in the Schedule is a prescribed offence for the purposes of section 9.16(1) of the Act.

9.2 Modified Penalty

The amount of the modified penalty for a prescribed offence is that specified adjacent to the clause in the Schedule.

9.3 Forms

For the purposes of this local law-

- (a) the form of the infringement notice given under section 9.16 of the Act is that of Form 2 in Schedule 1 of the Local Government (Functions and General) Regulations 1996; and
- (b) the form of the notice sent under section 9.20 of the Act withdrawing an infringement notice is that of Form 3 in Schedule 1 of the Local Government (Functions and General) Regulations 1996.

BRIEF

For Council to consider offering a season fee representing a 50% discount on the community rate to the Northam Swim Club for lane hire for the conduct of their training for the 2017/18 season.

BACKGROUND / DETAILS

The Northam Swimming Club is a community based club providing coached training and development sessions for children wanting to learn to swim for fun or for competition. Their membership base is approximately 60. Like many other sporting clubs in Northam, they operate out of Shire owned facilities that are subject to the Council approved fees and charges. The Club also lease the land for its clubrooms from the Shire for a fee of \$1.00 per annum.

Unlike other recreation facilities, when hiring aquatic facilities the hire fee is for exclusive use of that space and a fee for facility entrance is still payable (i.e. if six people hire a lane, they will pay the entrance fee for the six people plus the lane hire fee; whereas if six people hire a sports court or football field, they will only pay for the court / ground hire). The exception is when the entire facility is hired such as in the case of a swim carnival.

The Northam Swimming Club have not been charged for lane hire fees since at least 2009. At the Ordinary Council meeting held on 21st December 2016, Council resolved to:

1. Provide a fee waiver for the 2016/17 season, and



2. Apply a seasonal fee to the Northam and Wundowie Swimming Clubs based on the minimum lap lane requirements to meet their training needs, out-of-hours' time trials and carnivals.

Discussions with the Northam Swimming Club show their minimum requirements for the 2017/18 season are:

- 240 lap lane hours for training (two lanes for two hours on three nights for 20 weeks);
- Six hours of exclusive use of the whole pool for their carnival
- 80 lap lane hours for time trials (eight lanes for two hours once per month for five months)

Applying the current schedule of fees and charges, this would equate to \$2,400.00 for training, \$780.00 for the carnival and \$800.00 for the time trials, giving a total of \$3,980.00.

The Swim Club are seeking a 50% discount referencing just their training requirement.

CONSIDERATIONS

Financial / Resource Implications

The value of the facility hire the Northam Swimming Club are asking to waive is \$1,200.00.

The Northam Swim Club has approximately 60 members with \$200.00 season fees meaning their income from memberships is \$12,000. The requested lane hire fees for training represent 10% of their annual fees.

Legislative Compliance

Local Government Act 1995, Part 6, Division 4, Section 6.12

- 6.12. Power to defer, grant discounts, waive or write off debts
- (1) Subject to subsection (2) and any other written law, a local government may—
 - (a) when adopting the annual budget, grant* a discount or other incentive for the early payment of any amount of money; or



- (b) waive or grant concessions in relation to any amount of money; or
- (c) write off any amount of money, which is owed to the local government.
- *Absolute majority required.
- (2) Subsection (1) (a) and (b) do not apply to an amount of money owing in respect of rates and service charges.
- (3) The grant of a concession under subsection (1) (b) may be subject to any conditions determined by the local government.

Policy Implications Nil.

Stakeholder Engagement / Consultation

In line with the report that was presented to Council in December 2016, the Northam Swimming Club are continually being engaged and consulted on an operational level with the view to build a positive relationship between the club and the Shire.

Risk Implications

The risk associated with not waiving the lane hire fees is that an increased cost will be imposed on the Swim Club which will then be passed onto their members. The true impact this will have on their membership numbers are unknown.

The use of the pool by the Northam Swimming Club for their time trials represents unstaffed usage. This unsupervised usage is in a similar manner to which the football clubs utilise the Northam Recreation Centre, hire groups utilise the Town Hall, etc. It is legal from a Health Department perspective as the pool becomes a Group 3 facility (access restricted to a defined population for a structured activity) as opposed to a Group 1 facility (unrestricted access for unstructured purposes). Any risk is mitigated through the training of nominated Swim Club personnel in water quality and emergency evacuation procedures, with all Swimming Coaches required to hold a first aid certificate as part of their registration.

OFFICER'S COMMENT

A season fee for sporting clubs is seen as desirable as it allows sporting clubs to set their own fees and develop their budgets with more certainty. This principle has been applied to most of the Shire's regular oval users, including hockey and cricket (Bert Hawke) and football and little athletics (Henry Street). The use of these facilities, charged under seasonal fees, is controlled through a memorandum of understanding. In line with the Council resolution, the



proposed fee is the Club's minimum lap lanes requirements. Any additional bookings will be charged at regular community rate.

The swim club have requested a 50% discount on the fees they are going to be charged, however have only considered their training requirements when making the request. As a point of comparison to other junior sport paying a season fee sees a greater discount being applied to cricket, little athletics and football (note that hockey has one fee seasonal fee for juniors and seniors). The table below outlines what the usage cost for the various sports would be (ie. \$350.00 per day, \$200.00 for a half day, \$25.00 per hour) should no seasonal fee be applicable.

Junior Sport	Actual usage cost	Seasonal fee	Discount
Cricket	\$7,700	\$2,100	73%
Football	\$8,800	\$2,500	72%
Little Athletics	\$6,600	\$2,000	70%

Coincidentally, offering a 70% discount for the Swim Club on the \$3,980.00 total use, would see \$1,200.00 being charged (\$3,980.00 minus 70% is \$1,194.00 which would be rounded to \$1,200.00).

Council therefore have a number of options:

- 1. Determine no discount is applicable;
- 2. Agree to the 50% discount on total usage resulting in a seasonal fee of \$2,000.00 (\$3,980.00 minus 50% is \$1,990.00 rounded to \$2,000.00); or
- 3. Apply a similar discount to other junior sports in the Shire of 70% and see the fees be in line with their monetary fee request of \$1,200.

Should the Council choose to offer a discount to the Northam Swimming Club, for consistency the same discount should also apply to the Wundowie Swimming Club.

BY PRESIDENT'S CASTING VOTE



It was queried, should this motion be passed Council would be waiving a fee of approximately of \$12,000. This was confirmed as correct.

Further clarification was sought in relation to whether the room would be booked and raise this revenue during this period. The Executive Manager Community Services and Chief Executive Officer outlined that this information is not known or available at hand without researching past bookings.

Clarification was sought in relation to whether the PCYC is funded by the state government. It was confirmed that (grant) funding is provided in part.

Clarification was sought in relation to whether the PCYC are aware of the total booking charges. The Executive Manager Community Services advised that people are made aware of the booking fees when making a booking.

The Chief Executive Officer clarified that nothing formal has been received from the PCYC and Officers have no clear understanding of the group's requirements, needs and expectations relating to a waiver, as this motion has been submitted by an Elected Member.

Once there were no further clarifications from Elected Members the motion was put to a vote, the Shire President used his casting vote against the motion.

BACKGROUND

Cr Tinetti believes that PCYC provide a valuable service for the youth of the town and requests that Council support the group while their permanent premises is under construction.

OFFICER COMMENT

PCYC Originally booked the Lesser Hall to run their programmes (Gymnastics, martial arts etc.) for approximately four hours per day for the duration of the fourth term. The total cost of that hire is \$1,150. PCYC have also been looking for premises to run their administration, and their classroom activities from. Due to a lack of other facilities, they have now booked Meeting Room 3 at the Northam Recreation Centre for this purpose. They are also now hoping to gain exclusive use of the Lesser Hall for fourth Term. They are currently finalising all booking details with Recreation Services.

PCYC have a small budget for hire fees, (believed to be approximately \$3,000), however this won't cover the cost of the fees and charges. As per the fees & charges schedule, the daily cost of hire for the Lesser Hall for a community organisation is \$70, and the daily cost of Meeting Room 3 at the Recreation Centre for a community organization is \$210.

Council has 3 options:

1. Not grant any waiver of fees;



- 2. Grant a full waiver of fees for both the Lesser Hall and Northam Recreation Centre; or
- 3. Set a one off fee for hire of both facilities.
