Rangers Information Dogs

As of the 1st November 2015 ALL dogs need to be micro chipped. At three months of age all dogs

- Concession card/pensioners are half above stated price
- Working dogs are 1/4 above stated prices
- To keep more than two dogs at one property a written application must be submitted
- All dogs are required to wear a registration tag and a disc or tag with their name and a contact telephone number attached to their collar. Dogs can be surrendered to the Shire for a fee of \$25.00
- If a dog is impounded it will cost \$110.00 to have it released
- All impounded dogs are able to be viewed on the Shire of Northam website

Cats

All newly registered cats are required to be micro chipped and sterilised. At six months of age all cats are to be registered

> Sterilised 1 year \$20.00 3 years \$42.50 Lifetime \$100.00 Breeding \$100.00 (1yr)

Concession card/pensioners are half above stated price, the Shire of Northam offers discounted vouchers for sterilisation and micro chipping to concession card holders and pensioners. An application for these discount vouchers are also available on request in hardship cases.

- To keep more than two cats at one property a written application must be submitted
- All cats are required to wear a registration tag and a disc or tag with their name and a contact telephone number attached to their collar
- Cats can be surrendered to the Shire for a fee of \$25.00
- If a cat is impounded it will cost \$112.00 to have it released / all impounded cats are able to be viewed on the Shire of Northam website

The Radiological Council of the WA Government have announced a ban as from January 1, 2016 of commercial sun tan beds offered for fee or reward.
