Keeping Kids in School

The Keeping Kids in School program is a coordinated approach to increase participation in school and reduce truancy involving the entire community working together to address the issue.

Students are required to provide a leave pass to show that they have permission to be away from school during school hours. Shop owners may request to view a leave pass if faced with school-aged customers during school hours. Our community is working together in a bid to encourage students to gain a better start in life by attending school every day. Information packages, including posters to display in shop windows are available for download from the Shire of Northam website.

Parents are encouraged to talk with their children and ensure they understand that the local shops are not a place that students can spend their day if they decide they won't be attending school without a valid reason. This program is a community effort with commitment from the Shire of Northam, the Department of Education, WA Police and local businesses.


Adopt-a-Spot

If the sender has sent you a link to track your parcel, be sure to use it.
