President's Message

There is a great deal of investment currently taking place across our Shire that will have significant effect on public safety and quality of life over the next 12-18 months.

Work on the new shopping complex at the 'Old Hospital site' is progressing strongly with demolition underway on the old hospital. The new shopping precinct will be a significant boost to the town's retail offer with Aldi and Coles as anchor tenants.

Council recently received the building application from DOME café to develop the 'OLD Shamrock Hotel site'. The preliminary plans suggest that the completed facility will be an asset to the town for residents and visitors alike. Council expects the application to have been processed by the end of the financial year.

Council has also recently provided detailed comment to Main Roads WA on their proposed improvements to the Great Eastern Highway at Bakers Hill. While commending any improvement, Council continues to lobby strongly through the Minister for Transport to extend the Hwy to two lanes from the 'Lakes Area' through to Wundowie.

Additional to our regular maintenance programs, the Shire is also currently engaged in a number of larger development projects in public spaces. Improvements to the Swan enclosure will complete drainage works on Minson Avenue while also enhancing the aesthetic value of the site.

Beautification works enhancing the garden beds on Fitzgerald St between Peel Terrace and Gairdner Streets have experienced delays due to the original works being of insufficient quality, requiring further remediation work. Once complete, works will commence on the Avon Mall with new shade structures and other improvements. Council is also taking a renewed approach to tree pruning that should improve the look of our street trees.

There are many other proposed developments and confirmed developments which are very positive for Northam. I will look to focus on some of these in coming updates.

The Avon River Festival

The Shire of Northam has been undertaking extensive works around the Minson Avenue area in relation to drainage. The 'Swan Enclosure' works are the final stage of these works.

Shire of Northam Chief Executive Officer said the works being undertaken will add value to the park and CBD area generally.

Works include viewing platforms, rock pitching and plantings. The current fencing will be removed and replaced with more appealing and less intrusive fencing.

The works will require a significant portion of Bernard Park directly adjacent to the Swan Enclosure to be closed. The Shire of Northam is asking visitors and residents for their patience and understanding during the closure period.

Wundowie Community Plan Update

Planning for the commencement of the Wundowie Community Plan is underway. Expressions of interest have been received for consultants to assist with elements of the community consultation process with consultations scheduled to commence in July.

Shire Wins CCTV Grant

The Shire of Northam has secured funding through the State CCTV Strategy Infrastructure Fund to install new CCTV equipment and infrastructure throughout Northam.

The CCTV infrastructure upgrade is a key strategy of the Shire of Northam Community Safety and Crime Prevention Plan 2016-2020, which was recently developed by the Shire in partnership with the Northam Community Safety Committee.

Chief Executive Officer, Jason Whiteaker said "The Shire of Northam is committed to implementing crime prevention initiatives to improve safety and security for all community members and visitors to the area".

Additional cameras will be installed in known hotspots throughout Northam which is expected to reduce criminal activity and anti-social activity.

The State CCTV Strategy Infrastructure Fund is an initiative of the Government of Western Australia.

Changes to Greyhound Legislation

Have you ever thought about adopting a greyhound but been put off by the idea of having to muzzle the dog in public?

The Dog Act 1976 has recently been amended to enable appropriately retired racing greyhounds to return to the community as pets without having to wear a muzzle.

An amendment to the Dog Act 1976 introduces the provisions for greyhounds to undertake a specific training course to exempt them from wearing a muzzle in public. Exempted greyhounds will be granted a "green collar status" and be issued with one on completion of training.
