This allows you to take a photo of what you see, and then report it directly to the Shire of Northam. You will then be issued with a tracking number and what will happen going forward in order to repair or fix what you have seen. If you want to check on the progress, you can use your tracking number as a reference. Any photo you take will have a GPS reference, so the location point is clearly identified.

Enjoy the return to longer and warmer days, and remind yourself that within the Shire of Northam, MONDAY 30 we live and work in an incredible place

POOL INSPECTION ADVICE

Drownings in backyard swimming pools occur every year and all too often the child finds their way into the pool because of an inadequate pool fence or gate. It is the law in every Australian state and territory that swimming pools must be correctly fenced and inspected every four years to ensure compliance. Local Government (Shire of Northam) is responsible for the periodic inspection and of pool barriers in WA.

A barrier design that meets the standard:

- Has no gaps or clearances that are wide enough **NEWSLETTER UPDATE**
- gate hinges spaced 900mm or more apart.)
- ground clearance
- Strong enough that a child can't force a gap in council facilities. the bars or mesh and withstand a heavy knock.

Are you on track to meet your Firebreak/Fuel load requirements? If not doing the work yourself, book in with your gardener/contractor or view our contractor list on our website (see link below) to ensure you don't risk a \$250 infringement for missing the deadline. Fuel Loads in town? Are you aware that you must reduce your fuel load? Depending on the size of your property, you may be required to reduce all grass to less than or equal to 10cm.
