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THE WHEATBELT REGION

The Wheatbelt Education Regional Office (WERO) is located in Northam. The WERO provides support to schools to deliver quality educational opportunities and outcomes for students in diverse school and Wheatbelt community settings. The Wheatbelt Education Region comprises 71 public schools providing kindergarten to Year 12 and includes an Education Support Centre, with schoolbased education programs for over 10,000 students in the Wheatbelt area of Western Australia.


The 71 schools of the Wheatbelt Education Region are incorporated into six networks of schools. The majority of essential support services to schools now operate through schools and networks. Networks also maximise each School's opportunity to share ideas, resources and professional support.

NORTHAM

Northam was one of the first towns to be founded in WA and is the regional service centre of the Avon Valley and Central Wheatbelt, being one of the largest inland towns in the state. The Shire of Northam Council is committed to developing the Shire and encouraging growth through new investment and tourism, whilst maintaining a warm country feel and friendly community.

STATISTICS

The estimated resident population of the Wheatbelt was 75,000 in 2013. The Shire of Northam is the largest resident base in the region with more than 11,700 people, compared to the majority of community sizes which fall between 500-1000 residents.

KINDERGARTEN

Kindergarten is recognised as the first year of schooling and is the beginning of a child's journey through school where they learn important early numeracy, literacy and social skills.

Kindergarten is not compulsory however, is highly recommended with a number of great options for starting your child's journey of schooling in the Shire of Northam. Kindergarten is available through all seven of the Shire of Northam's primary schools providing you with a variety of options.

There are seven primary schools in the Shire of Northam which all provide kindergarten, with St Joseph's School also offering pre-kindergarten. Avonvale Primary School also offers a 3 year old Kindergarten Program.

PRIMARY Education

Primary school education continues from Pre-Primary through to Years 6 where children receive a strong foundation in eight core subject areas.

The environment is structured and more formal than kindergarten and teachers will plan for a balance of activities based on the learning needs of your children and other children in their class. In some instances specialist teachers teach the class, for example in art, music and physical education. ST JOSEPH'S SCHOOL NORTHAM


St Joseph's School Primary campus operates as a stream and a half offering a Catholic education for students from pre-kindergarten to Year Six. As a Catholic school. there is an emphasis on the faith development of students and participation in the Sacramental Program organised in conjunction with the St Joseph's Parish. At St Joseph's School all primary teachers program from the WA Curriculum and are implementing a whole school Explicit Instruction program across Literacy and Numeracy. MultiLit is an early intervention program offered to support students during Literacy Dedicated Time. A strong Physical and Health Education program is conducted across the Primary campus and Bahasa Indonesian is taught from Year 1 to 6.

NORTHAM SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL (NSHS)

Northam Senior High School is a school where students matter and teachers work in partnership with students and their parents to cater for each individual's needs.

This program is made up of a suite of courses to prepare students for further study at university or TAFE, training and apprenticeships or employment. The choice of pathways includes - ATAR, General and Vocational Education and Training (VET).


ATAR students graduating from this school have been successful in gaining places in many courses at university including medicine, law, education and science.

The VET program has links with the state of the art Trade Training Centre on the school site, which delivers Certificate courses in Hospitality and Kitchen Operations.

Further community links with Central Regional TAFE and Muresk College, allows students to pursue training in industries local to the area and beyond.

Engagement programs including School Based Alternative Education and Bushranger Cadets, together with partnerships incorporating the Clontarf Foundation Northam Academy, Wirrpanda Foundation Girls Program, Follow the Dream and Northam Residential College, are all providing opportunities for success.

Northam Senior High School is steeped in history, being established in 1921, and continues to provide a comprehensive education for the future.









SECONDARY EDUCATION

ST JOSEPH'S SCHOOL NORTHAM

Our School offers a rich secondary educational program within the context of a Christian environment which is based on respect for the self, others and the environment while nurturing each individual's personal relationship with God.

An education at St Joseph's School will equip your child to be a life-long learner, able to meet future challenges with increased confidence. Through a strong pastoral care program, we endeavour to provide a learning environment in which the spiritual, intellectual, physical, social and emotional needs of each child are met.

In Years 7-10 we offer a range of learning experiences aimed at providing a strong foundation for future years. Students are enrolled in Religious Education, English, Mathematics, Humanities and Social Studies, Science and Physical Education and Health. Opportunities exist for study in a variety of courses such as Outdoor Education, Food, Wood, Construction and Italian. In the Senior school (Years 11 to 12) students have access to a number of pathways involving ATAR, General and VET courses. These include university, a vocational educational pathway (CRTAFE), Workplace Learning Program and ViSN – eLearning experience.

We encourage our students to value the many opportunities that are offered to them at St Joseph's School, not only in their academic studies but the vast range of co-curricular activities. The da Vinci Program and Drama pursuits, in addition to our MaJEC (Christian service learning) program, sporting and cultural programs, enable our students to experience success with all of their talents.

AVONVALE EDUCATION SUPPORT CENTRE (Northam) Kindergarten to Year 12

Avonvale Education Support Centre caters for students from Kindergarten to Year 12 and is an educational facility for students with intellectual and adaptive disabilities. We are the only specialist school in the Wheatbelt that caters for students with special needs.

The primary school site has a purpose built centre with three well-equipped classrooms able to facilitate a wide range of activities. We have 2 sites located on the Avonvale Primary School grounds that caters for Primary and a shared site with Northam Senior High school. Sharing sites with these schools allows for integration and transition opportunities for our students. Students have the opportunity to participate in additional joint activities between the 2 schools.

Students are provided with individual education plans that cater to their strengths and needs. We provide a targeted, differentiated curriculum based on the Western Australian Curriculum and Abilities Based Learning Education, Western Australia, combined with a rich social environment designed to meet the individual learning needs of each child. Staff are trained to incorporate research based teaching strategies into their teaching. Social and play skills programs are implemented with communication as the focus. Our teaching practice also incorporates Protective Behaviour programs.

Students with sensory needs are provided a number of sensory options and experiences throughout the school day. This includes accessing our state of the art sensory rooms located at both sites. Through a wide number of programs we work together to ensure our students are supported to participate meaningfully and successfully within their family, school and local community.

We believe that we offer the best of both worlds for our students, a more intensive learning environment as well as a close connection with their peers in the primary school and secondary school. Early intervention is the most effective for students with any disability however students' with special needs may enrol at any year level.





NORTHAM Residential college

The residential college provides a home-awayfrom-home for regional secondary students (Years 7 to 12) attending Northam Senior High School and St Joseph's School.

Students enjoy living with other country students in a supportive and caring environment while studying in Northam.

Located opposite Northam Senior High School and a short bus ride to St Joseph's School, the residential college gives country children in regional areas the opportunity to access high quality secondary education in a regional centre. For many, they are close enough to their families to visit at weekends and on special occasions, and their families are welcome at the residential college at any time. Families are considered an integral part of students' boarding experiences.

At the College, students are supported and encouraged to do well in their education. Dedicated and experienced staff work with the schools to ensure students are progressing in their studies and are accessing any resources or support they require. They also provide structured study times for students to complete their homework and assignments, and help arrange any tutoring students may need.

Personal development is also a priority at the residential college. Staff provide a nurturing environment that promotes healthy living and supports their emotional, social and physical wellbeing. Students eat healthy meals, are encouraged to be physically active.

At Northam Residential College, students enjoy country living while they study, form lifelong friendships, and become independent and active members of their community.


